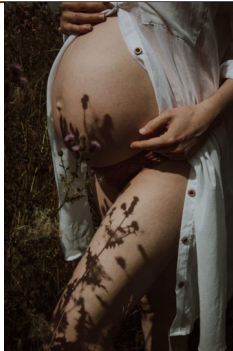

A pregnant pause for thought...

Please forgive the question but, are you pregnant?

Advent is the time when we prepare for Christmas. Mary is pregnant, with child, with Jesus our Saviour and travels, with Joseph, to Bethlehem where she gives birth.



The angel said to Mary, "Do not be afraid; you have found favour with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God." "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Joseph went to Bethlehem with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. (Paraphrase Luke 1:30-38 and Luke 2: 5-7)

Pregnant also means significant, full of meaning. I would suggest that there are three pregnancies in our lives. We are the pregnancy awaiting new life.

Each of us is born into this world. We have the time, like Jesus, cosseted in our mother's womb. The mother, as well as others, await the birth of the baby. They are preparing physically: getting provisions, preparing room, the mother's body changing for birth, and mentally/emotionally; wondering how life will change, excitement and, perhaps, some anxiety. Is there a spiritual change, a soul created by God? I would argue that there must be:



For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. (Psalm 139:13-14)

This pregnancy is usually about nine months. There is some understanding of what will be. We are here and have been

through this pregnancy to arrive where we are today.

The second pregnancy is the significant, meaningful time of us becoming a Christian. Just as with the birth of a baby, someone has planted a seed of faith and people can help the seed mature to fruition. As the new Christian arrives there is excitement and adjustment to new life. There is definitely physical, emotional/mental and spiritual change. This pregnancy varies in length. With some people it may be a sudden revelation and a life is transformed by Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. For others it may be a gradual process of realising that there is more to life, that something is missing. It may be that we have grown up in a Christian home and the new birth has been gently stirring within us until we say "Yes, Lord". However and whenever we come to believe, giving ourselves, body, mind and spirit, to Jesus, it is a new birth:

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! (2 Corinthians 5:17)

The final pregnancy, again varies in length and can often be very long, in my Dad's case at least 80 years. This is the earthly preparation for eternal life. Are we living significant, meaningful lives as Christians? We are promised that in having faith we will have eternal life:

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16

"Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. Very truly I tell you, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. For a time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out—those who have done what is good will rise to life". (John 5:24-25, 28-29)

For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him. And so we will be with the Lord forever. (1 Thessalonians 4:14, 17)

At a funeral for a lady we visited with Home Communion someone said to me, "I wish I had the certainty that she had." I replied that she could. "O no, it's not for me." Sadly, she moved away and the conversation couldn't be continued. God chooses everyone. It is whether we choose God.

It may be that you are in the second pregnancy and have not accepted Jesus as your Saviour; that your belief has not yet sprung to new life. If so, please speak with one of the clergy or a trusted Christian friend. Ask Jesus in prayer, using whatever words come to mind, to give you new life, e.g.

"Lord Jesus, I am sorry I have done wrong. Please forgive me. I believe you are the Son of God, that you died for me, and I ask you to be my Saviour. Fill me with your Holy Spirit. I give my life to you. Amen".

Are you pregnant? Are we ready for that day, however challenging, when we die to this life on earth and are born to eternal life? Are we ready to go home, to that room prepared for us by Jesus?

"I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." John 14:3

Can we say like Paul that:

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing." (2 Timothy 4:7-8)

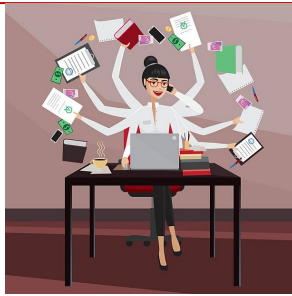
Almighty God,

We have been able to put together two full hampers of items as requested and as you can see there were lots of spare items to help restock the Foodbank's larder for the coming weeks.



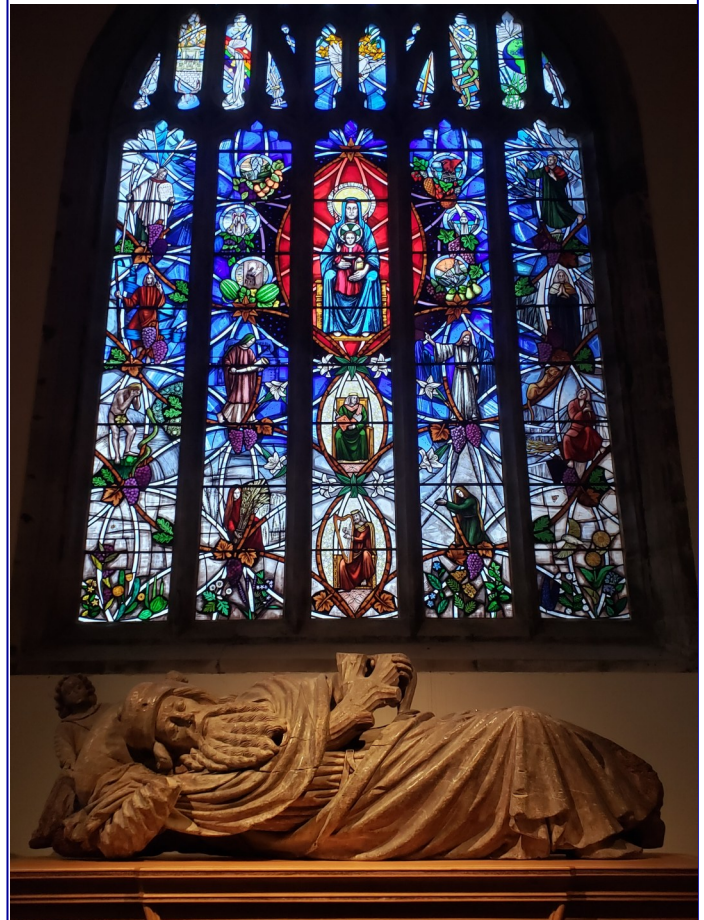
Mary's Song of Praise

"A shoot will arise from the stump of Jesse;
from his roots a branch will bear fruit"

Isaiah 11:1



Here is Jesse.

He lies, larger than life size, in the priory church of St. Mary in Abergavenny. He was carved in the 15th century from a single piece of oak and originally from his side sprouted a Jesse tree, a depiction of his descendants from King David culminating at the top with the Virgin Mary and the Christ child. It was huge; probably between twenty and thirty feet tall and highly coloured (traces of the paint still remain). The shoot from which the tree sprang can be seen in Jesse's side but sadly the tree itself was destroyed, along with so much other great English medieval art, by Cromwell's troops in 1646 during the Civil War.

Jesse trees in stained glass or stone are not uncommon but this wooden Jesse is unique in the UK and possibly in the world.

In a happy stroke of imagination ten years or so ago Jesse's tree was re-created in stained glass and he now lies at the foot of a new window in the north aisle, reunited with his family.

If you are in Abergavenny, do visit Jesse.

And the Tithe Barn cafe next door is good too.
