Downton Parish Council News

What a beautiful autumn, golden leaves everywhere, apples and blackberries galore! There has been lots of free fruit around, even quinces which make lovely jelly and can be used wherever apples are used. The trees around the Parish which form part of the Kings Coronation grant are thriving (apart from a couple which will be replaced) despite the dry summer

- Our Parish Steward Steve is busy shovelling, unblocking, weeding and doing all sorts of jobs around the Parish, his next visit this year will be December 9 so please let me know if anything needs doing
- DPC is making sure our Parish is winter ready and resilient, Flood Wardens will be getting together, and Wiltshire will continue to keep an eye and clear our gullies
- Not only has DPC secured funding for the Wooden Spoon crossing improvements but now have approval and funding from Wiltshire Council Local Highways Footpath Improvement Grant for road safety improvements to the Tannery pinch point. There will be 11 points around the village that have been selected for traffic surveys, forming accurate evidence-based data on vehicle numbers, size and speed
- Some sad news: A local eagle-eyed tree surveyor who walks his child to school spotted a tree fungus on one of the beautiful Beeches in the Memorial Gardens. This will have to be felled. The good news is that DPC have applied for an Oak at 80, celebrating 80 years since VE Day and our grant application has been approved. This Oak will take pride of place in the Memorial Gardens.
- You may be wondering where our Speed Indicator Device (SID) is – DPC now have a dedicated SID which will work off solar power, plus the SID shared with Redlynch will also work off solar power which means the volunteers will not have to change heavy batteries so often
- If Downton Parish residents are experiencing anti-social behaviour or any crime or disturbance, it is VITAL to report this to our local Police. The Police do NOT respond to crimes reported on Facebook.
In an emergency always dial 999 if: there is an immediate danger to life, someone is using violence or is threatening to be violent, a crime is happening right now, like a house burglary or a theft, the suspect is still at the scene
- If the problem is a non-emergency, then dial 101: if you are experiencing anti-social behaviour, door knocking etc.

Our local PC is Marc Evans, and our local police can be reached through dialling 101, or his mobile 07876 817927 which is active when PC Marc is on duty

The Parish Council meetings are held on the **second Monday of the month in the Bonvalot Room in the Downton Memorial Centre. Meetings start at 7pm.**

There is always a public question time at the beginning of the meeting, so do come along and have your say. **It is YOUR Parish after all!**

Redlynch and District Local History Society

Our October talk was "The History of Communications" by ex-Royal Corps of Signals. Our November talk was given by Graham Bathe focusing on the early use of bricks in Wiltshire. Despite the use of bricks in the Middle East as long as 12,000 years ago, bricks did not become established in Britain until the mid 16thC. Early use of bricks was limited to ovens and chimneys, for example on the Mary Rose, to protect the flammable surroundings. Another early use was for water courses. Tiles were recognised for flooring and used in Clarendon Palace for example. The problem with bricks was that they were very expensive compared to other building materials. Bricks require suitable clay, a binding agent such as sand, water and large amounts of fuel; in areas without these factors one would have to import heavy brick loads further increasing the cost. A further problem was the lack of skilled labour to make and lay the bricks.

Renaissance Europe adopted bricks and impressive buildings were constructed, these were seen by travelling British gentry and military officers and brick buildings became the "must have" for the ambitious and well to do. The most famous example is Hampton Court which featured functioning water and sewage systems, and another early example is Layer Marney in Essex. Wolf Hall, home to the Seymour family, was greatly enlarged in 1531, bricks were extensively used particularly for the sewerage tunnels below ground which are still there. The birth of Edward 6th, the only male heir to Henry 8th led to great wealth via the Lord Protector (uncle) Edward Seymour, the Duke of Somerset. Seymour instructed his "servant" John Thymme to build three brick houses: Somerset House in London, Syon Park on the Thames and "The Brailes" to replace Wolf Hall.

The Brailes was south of Great Bedwyn and east of Wolf Hall. Little remains apart from a water ditch which on excavation revealed a fresh water brick channel 15 feet below ground level. Documents have revealed the effort and expense required this including the hiring of European brick makers and layers in 1556. On Edwards death the work ceased and The Brailes was never completed, however by that time the skills required for bricks and brick works were established. The advantage of regular sized building blocks and the speed of construction had also now been recognised.

Our next talk is at 7:30pm at Morgans Vale & Woodfalls Village Hall on Tuesday 2nd December entitled “The Duke of Monmouth – how his head was turned and lost” by Jaqueline and Brian Sutton. Our local history link is Alice Lisle.

A Plea to All in Downton

There are often stories in the media of bus services ending or being cut back. Particularly for people with out cars this can cause problems getting out and about. Although there has been no indications of possible cutbacks in buses serving Downton this must be a concern for the future. While the X3 service between Salisbury Railway Station and Bournemouth generally runs half-hourly in both directions and is convenient for people living in the bottom of the village, it is of relatively little use for those living in High Street, Moot Lane, Barford Lane etc.

Meanwhile, the 44 buses which serve the whole village, and also go via Salisbury Hospital, only run every 90 minutes. At various times of the day they often have very few passengers when they go up or down Lode Hill. It is therefore important that people make use of these buses to ensure they are never withdrawn, as some years ago they used to run every 40 minutes.

Therefore, a plea, please use the 44 as much as possible!! Remember that currently single fares are capped at £3 by the Department of Transport and pensioners get free travel if they have a bus pas which is available from Wiltshire County Council.
