## Reflection: Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> December Third Sunday of Advent

#### Matthew 11:2-11

At first glance this passage seems strange. John the Baptist who had proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah, in prison awaiting his certain execution begins to doubt the very message he had been given by God, so he sends his disciples to ask Jesus if he was truly the Messiah. Jesus rather than being indignant or launching into a theological sermon, simply invites John's disciples to absorb what was happening with their own eyes and report back to John. There is a key message here, we should see the kingdom of God and the work of the church through action and not words, through sacrifice and commitment not just through religious services and church buildings as important as they are. Advent is a time of waiting, a time of preparation for the reenactment of the incarnation of the coming of God into our world, as the baby of Bethlehem yes, but also as the

saviour of the world. In this advent season we are all called to share in the ministry of John the Baptist in declaring to an unbelieving world the imminent arrival of Jesus, by whose death and resurrection death was destroyed and heaven opened for us all.

### Bible Readings: Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> December 2025 Third Sunday of Advent

#### Isaiah 35.1-10

1 The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus 2 it shall blossom abundantly,

and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it,

the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord,

the majesty of our God.

- 3 Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees.
- 4 Say to those who are of a fearful heart, 'Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense.

He will come and save you.'

- 5 Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped;
- 6 then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert;
- 7 the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water; the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp,

the grass shall become reeds and rushes.

8 A highway shall be there, and it shall be called the Holy Way; the unclean shall not travel on it,

but it shall be for God's people; no traveller, not even fools, shall go astray.

9 No lion shall be there,

nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there,

but the redeemed shall walk there.

 $10\ \mbox{And}$  the ransomed of the Lord shall return,

and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads;

they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

#### James 5.7-10

7 Be patient, therefore, beloved, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains.

8 You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near.

9 Beloved, do not grumble against one another, so that you may not be judged. See, the Judge is standing at the doors!

10 As an example of suffering and patience, beloved, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

#### Matthew 11.2-11

2 When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples

3 and said to him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?'

4 Jesus answered them, 'Go and tell John what you hear and see:

5 the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them.

6 And blessed is anyone who takes no offence at me.'

7 As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind?

8 What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces.

9 What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet.

10 This is the one about whom it is written, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way before you."

11 Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

### **Cancellation of Horningold's Carol Service**


#### Planned for on Sunday 14th December

Whilst work on the Chancel Roof is progressing there has been a delay because of the need for new coping stones. The stonemasons are working on these in their yard. (We are fortunate that they have the skills to do this and it doesn't need another contractor). However, it has meant that the interior of the church is certainly not fit for purpose to hold services. We had an emergency PCC meeting this afternoon and have reluctantly (but realistically) made the decision to cancel the Carol Service and to postpone the launch of the Village Trail. We shall be encouraging people in the village to attend the Carol Service in Hallaton, our neighbouring village. We are proposing to Martin Smith (our Heritage Activities Coordinator for our NLHF grant) that we launch the Village Trail on a Saturday in the early spring when (we hope) the weather will be better. This is a big disappointment, but we look forward to a Carol service in 2026 in our restored church.

### Revd Stephen Bishop, Rector of Six Saints Circa Holt

## The following was received from Rt Revd Martyn Snow, Bishop's Lodge on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> December:

With grateful thanks for his ministry and prayers of blessing for the future, we announce that The Revd Stephen Bishop, has been appointed as Chaplain of Uppingham School, in the Diocese of Peterborough.

Stephen's resignation as Rector of the benefice of Six Saints Circa Holt will take effect from Sunday 22nd February 2026, with his final Sunday in the Parish being Sunday 1st February 2026.

## Revd Stephen Bishop released this statement on the same day:

I write to you all to inform you, with a mixture of gratitude and sadness, that I have submitted my resignation as Rector of The Parish of Six Saints circa Holt to take effect from Sunday 22nd February. My final Sunday in the Parish will be Sunday 1st February 2026.

After twenty-five years of ministry in this Parish, this has been an exceptionally difficult decision, impacting my family as well as myself and the Parish. It has been one of the great privileges of my life to serve the people of these villages, to share in their joys and sorrows, and to work alongside so many faithful and generous communities, volunteers, and congregations. I remain profoundly grateful for the trust placed in me and for the support I have received throughout my ministry here.

I have recently been appointed Chaplain of Uppingham School, and after much prayer and discernment I believe this is the right next step in my vocation. I am excited by the call to serve within the school community, while also deeply aware of the affection, stories, and shared ministry that make leaving the parish so poignant. With the agreement of the Bishop of Leicester, I will continue to serve as Acting Chaplain from 3rd January 2026 until half-term, formally beginning my new role after half-term.

Please be assured of my prayers for the Parish and its village communities; for the Deanery; and for the Diocese, as the Parish begins the process of transition and looks ahead to future ministry.

It has been a great privilege to serve in the Diocese of Leicester for over thirty-three years, and to be Rector of Six Saints circa Holt for over twenty-five years. It has been a blessing and an honour.

all food collected is non-perishable, long-life or tinned. The Foodbank has **MOST URGENT NEED of:** Crackers, Fray Bentos pies, Tinned vegetarian meals. **They also need:** 

Cereal, Tinned Ham, Pasta sauces, Tinned Fruit, Tinned Sweetcorn, Baked Beans with Sausages, UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Tinned chicken, Hot Dogs (Tins or jars,) Tinned red meat, Tinned Carrots, Corned Beef, Tinned meatballs, Chicken in sauce, Dried potatoes (Smash), Marmalade, Jam, Biscuits, Tinned potatoes, Crisps, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned chickpeas, mixed chilli beans, lentils, Custard, Tinned rice pudding, Sachet meals (pan or microwave), 'No Cook' meals for the homeless, Cordial, Coffee (small jars), Pasta sauce, Tinned soup, Cup of soup, Sugar (500g), Tinned peas, Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Snacks and cereal bars, Fruit squash/juice, Microwave puddings, Peanut butter, Tinned Pasta, Sandwich paste, Teabags, Tuna, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)


