

Pastoral Letter

Susan writes



December
2025

Dear friends,

It seems like a long time since I wrote the letter for the magazine... we like to share it out across the team. As you read this, we are in December or January. The festive season comes and goes in these two months. It's packed tight with events, carols, parties, children's nativities, family get togethers. We celebrate the birth of Jesus, our Saviour, then we ring out the old year, or bring in the new, depending on your perspective! My grandmother always thought of it as Old Year's Night, not New Year's Eve.

I like the idea of Old Year's Night. A time to reflect on the year that is coming to an end. To remember the good and the bad times alike. It is a healthy thing to spend a little time calling to mind the events and people that have had an impact on us. It is particularly hard when we have lost loved ones. Saying goodbye well is an important part of the grieving process. We might grieve other changes in our lives, like separation, divorce, illness, job loss. We also need to acknowledge and celebrate the good – new babies, jobs, house moves, weddings... and so on.

Sometimes, we get carried away with moving into the New Year, or indeed anything "new", without just pausing, taking a breath, seeing what we have learned, and saying a prayer if that's your thing.

There is a helpful spiritual practice called Examen. It is typically done at the end of the day.

How to Pray the Examen

1. Place yourself in God's presence. Give thanks for God's great love for you.
2. Pray for the grace to understand how God is acting in your life.
3. Review your day — recall specific moments and your feelings at the time.
4. Reflect on what you did, said, or thought in those instances. Were you drawing closer to God, or further away?
5. Look toward tomorrow — think of how you might collaborate more effectively with God's plan. Be specific, then conclude with the Lord's Prayer.

I think this would work well on Old Year's Night as well. Review your year. Recall those moments and those feelings. Give yourself time to reflect, in this busy season.

My prayer is that you will enjoy your celebrations and take time to get ready for whatever comes next. I will try to do the same and I hope to see you singing carols somewhere!



Clips, cribs, and community: Advent at Sodbury Vale

This year, Sodbury Vale Benefice is spreading seasonal cheer online with their digital Advent calendar – inviting everyone to share in the hopes, memories, and joy of Christmas as seen through the eyes of their community.

Running from 1 to 26 December, the calendar features 26 virtual ‘doors’, each one revealing a 45-second to one-minute short video clip of a different person or group from the benefice’s four churches.

Every clip gives a glimpse into how people in Sodbury Vale celebrate Christmas, from favourite memories to reflections on what the season means to them.

“We’ve made a joyful digital countdown to Christmas for all to enjoy,” said the Revd Christine Butler, Rector of Sodbury Vale Benefice. “We wanted to make more of Advent in the lead up to Christmas, and to make something that’s a bit of fun too. It’s a daily moment of festive cheer and connection; a space to reflect on the wonder of Christmas and the hope Advent brings. We thought it would be sad to stop on Christmas Day, so we added Boxing Day as well. People will have to wait for the exact date each day to watch the video clips.”

Each calendar door is also illustrated with images from CribFest 2024, the benefice’s much-loved annual nativity display that showcases nativity cribs from around the world – from simple handmade cribs to stunning semi-precious displays.

“A lot of people tell us that CribFest starts off their Christmas, and that in the years we didn’t have it, they felt bereft. People come from quite a long way to attend, because some of the cribs are just amazing and from all over the world,” Christine said.

Excitement is already building for CribFest 2025, running from 3

to 7 December at St John's Church, Chipping Sodbury. This year's theme, 'Good News', aims to point visitors towards the story of Jesus. On the final day, the town is hosting its annual 'Chipping Sodbury Christmas Sunday', complete with two donkeys in the lay-by next to the church.

"We invite everyone to experience the joy of Advent – through our online calendar, at CribFest, or both," said Christine.

Grace Network launches ethical Christmas hamper

The Grace Network, based in The Old Department Store in Cirencester, is offering a thoughtful way to give back this Christmas with a hamper that supports communities both locally and internationally.

Created in collaboration with Different Kind, also based in The Old Department Store, each hamper purchase helps fund social enterprises, fair trade producers, and community initiatives – from pay-it-forward meals at The Long Table, to fair-wage work for women in Bangladesh. All proceeds go to Different Kind, which supports the makers behind each product.

The hamper includes products like Dalit candles, handmade by the Dalit people of India which helps fund education for children in underrepresented communities, and Wiggly Kitchen's Social Sauce, made with mulberries picked from Bishop Rachel's garden, which helps marginalised groups learn to cook, garden and connect.

Annie Campbell, Communications and Community Lead for The Grace Network, said: "Each item in the hamper has its own story. Everything has been thoughtfully chosen because it gives back in some way, celebrating community, generosity, faith, and the joy of Christmas."

There are two options available, one priced at £75 and another at £115.

Sat is stoked by prayer. What spiritual discipline will you take on today to grow in hope?

Advent 2: Peace...

Sun is an inner reality as well as an outer one. How will you settle your spirit today?

Mon depends on repentance. What change toward someone else will you make today?

Tues is for everyone, or for no one. How will you advocate for peace for someone else today?

Wed is prophetic. How will you take a risk today?

Thurs is constructive. What will you create today that will contribute to peace?

Fri is sown and reaped communally. With whom will you partner to bring peace today?

Sat must be waged. What instrument of peace will you take up today?

Advent 3: Joy...

Sun is persistent. How will you experience joy as a result of not giving up today?

Mon is contagious. How will you share joy with someone else today?

Tues defies evil How will you overcome malice by laying claim to joy today?

Wed requires openness. What new person or experience will you seek out today?

Thurs is sometimes quiet, sometimes not. What will you revel in today?

Fri can sneak up on us. How will you open yourself to be surprised by joy today?

Sat takes nothing for granted. What small grace are you grateful for today?

Advent 4: Love...

Sun sees and values people as they are. Whom will you see and appreciate today?

Mon is creative. In what innovative way will you show love today?

Tues forgives. What old hurt will you let go of today?

Wed moves us closer to God. How will you thank God for the love in your life today?

SHURDINGTON & BADGEWORTH GARDENING SOCIETY


