

Thought for the Month

'The justice system is failing.' 'Inside Britain's broken justice system.' These are just a couple of today's headlines as I write this.

We all long for justice. If something bad happens, we want to know who is to blame. We want that to be made clear, through inquests and investigations – even if the people responsible have died in the meantime. As the saying goes, justice must be done, and justice must be seen to be done.

I wonder what 'Advent' means to you? Perhaps you associate it with 'Advent Calendar'? And that means ... chocolate! 'Advent' means 'arrival' or 'coming'. During the season of Advent, Christians prepare for the arrival of Jesus. There are two aspects to this. First, we prepare for Christmas, as we celebrate the arrival of Jesus as a baby in Bethlehem. But we also prepare for another arrival of Jesus, as we look forward to his future arrival.

Christians believe that one day Jesus will return, and will bring in God's eternal kingdom. Part of that is about justice. We speak of Jesus coming as our 'Judge'. If there will be a final judgment, that means our longing for justice will be satisfied. And that must surely be a good thing.

What does it mean to prepare for the arrival of Jesus? We live between Jesus' first arrival and his second arrival. The shepherds were told that a 'Saviour' had been born in Bethlehem. Jesus came to save us: to die and rise again so that our sins can be forgiven. As we wait for Jesus' second arrival, God is giving us time to receive Jesus as our Saviour, so that we will be ready to meet him as our Judge.

Enjoy your chocolate, and may God bless you all during this season of preparation!

CHRISTMAS UNWRAPPED

All of us have received unwanted gifts at Christmas. For Joseph the gift of a child, as recorded in Matthew chapter 1, was not something he really wanted. Although he was engaged to Mary, her pregnancy would be grounds for divorce. Not surprisingly, with the associated social disgrace, Joseph wanted to divorce Mary quietly (Matthew 1:19). However, God intervened in a dream: 'The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call Him Immanuel, which means, God with us.' (1:23). In a scary and uncertain world, what does the message of **Immanuel** say to us today?

God is present with us

God assured Joseph that He was working in all that Joseph was going through. The eternal and creator God entered time and space as a baby. This baby is both uniquely divine but also fully human. This means that we can know God personally, not just know about Him. The Holy Spirit is committed to making Jesus' life and character real in us, and bringing meaning to our circumstances, just as He worked in Mary's life.

God is on our side

Christmas touches some raw nerves in our lives, including stress, family rows, loneliness and financial pressures. However, God does not remain aloof from our experiences. In Jesus He enters our world of hopes and fears, joys and disappointments. He understands what we are going through, as He is alongside us. By the cross and resurrection, He gave His life that we might know His love, joy, peace and forgiveness.

For Joseph, as well as us, the Christmas message is one of hope in an uncertain world. It is a time to re-consider the claims of *Immanuel* ('*God with us*') as we entrust ourselves to Him for the coming year.

And there were shepherds...

In his gospel, Luke tells how the shepherds in the fields were keeping watch over their flocks when they were terrified by the sudden arrival of heavenly angels, surrounded by the glory of the Lord. And the message of the angel that night has rung down the centuries:

"I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." (Luke 2:10,11)

And so, the first people to greet the Saviour were not rich VIPS, but humble shepherds. And in turn, it was the shepherds who became the first evangelists: for they would have gone home to their families and neighbours that night with the amazing news of what they had seen.

Meanwhile, for Mary there followed a time of reflection. She gathered up in her mind all her impressions, and all that the shepherds had shared about the angelic visit. She knew it was treasure, and not to be squandered. Then she quietly pondered in her heart the meaning and significance of all that had happened, so that she would never forget.

Exuberant witness and quiet contemplation are not opposites. They are, in fact, good companions in the spiritual life!

So, this Christmas, let's be filled with the joy that the Saviour has also been born 'to us'. May our lives reflect the glory of His coming, even in a small way. May our interactions with friends, colleagues and families during this Advent season reflect the great joy that the angels brought that night, so long ago.

Hurworth Parish Council

Members of the crew of HMS Hurworth attended the excellent Remembrance concert held at the Grange on Remembrance Day, and also attended the service in All Saints Church on Remembrance Sunday. They presented the village with a plaque, which will be displayed in the Grange bar.

The Council held their monthly meeting on 6th November, and a number of topics were considered and decisions made including the following.

- A donation was awarded to Hurworth Village Hall, of £400, to fund the lighting of the Christmas tree lights on 30th November.
- A donation of £300 was awarded to a resident, who for the last three years
 has been decorating the open grass area at the corner of Strait Lane, which
 is greatly appreciated by the community.
- A donation of £150 was awarded to Friends of the Community, to fund the Wassail community event in early January.
- The Council has agreed to continue to support the Tees River Trust, who are planning to supplement their team.
- The council has been offered free trees, if we are prepared to create a small orchard style tree compound. The Council agreed to express interest and gain further information.
- The consultation for the proposed new Solar farm in Hurworth Parish is underway. The land upon which is close to the A66, and as the height of the units are low, the Council sees no reason to oppose this scheme. It is understood that the piece of land to be used, is not suitable for other purposes.
- The Tees River measuring equipment at Hurworth Place is to be replaced by a new radar system, which can be accessed remotely, and the height and speed of the flow can be more accurately measured. The Environment Agency is working closely with the Hurworth Place Flood Committee, led by Sue Dell, and with Cllr Howard, to ensure a smooth transition.
- The Hurworth Allotment AGM will be held at Hurworth Grange, in the Bagshaw Gallery on 11th December, starting at 6.30pm. All allotment holders and those on the Waiting List are invited to attend. The Allotment rules have been recently reviewed and there will be a motion for their acceptance will be tabled at this meeting.





