

Starting 2026 with Prayer

Happy New Year everyone! Yes it really is 2026. And with it comes a whole bunch of expectations around starting as we mean to go on. Don't worry. I'm not going to add to them. But I do think the start of a new year deserves a faithful review, even if it doesn't include resolutions.

So, what is important to you, when it comes to your faith?

Taking walks around our home in Mid Devon has offered a very welcomed new perspective. It is stunning around here, and as such we have been wonderfully blessed with what I would call 'Christian Calendar' moments and the opportunity to pray more.

For those that struggle to pray sometimes, and I include myself in that category, it is often to do with either not having the words or not hearing anything back. Firstly, God doesn't need to hear your words spoken allowed. Prayer is something that is done from the heart and the gut, not the vocal chords. Holding a time of silence with a lit candle, or taking a walk around Mid Devon, are both legitimate ways to pray. But then so is screaming at the top of your voice in lament. The point here is that God doesn't set conditions.

Secondly, prayer is a two-way thing. That's why it's so frustrating when you feel your prayers are falling on deaf ears. Listening is crucial to a healthy prayer life. Yes, you can give over all your concerns, petitions and intercessions but like any correspondence unless you get a reply it feels incomplete. So how do we listen for God's reply? Maybe this will help...

A lady was walking down a busy street in London. It was filled with people, cars were beeping their horns, the double-deckers were screeching as they stopped to pick up passengers, and sirens were wailing as ambulances drove by. Suddenly, the lady stops and says, 'I hear a cricket.'

'No, I'm sure of it,' the wise lady said.

She paused and listened carefully for a moment, and then walked across the road to where some shrubs were growing. She looked into the bushes and sure enough, there was the cricket. Her friend was utterly amazed. But the wise lady said 'My ears are no different from yours.'

'I could never hear a cricket in this noise,' said her friend.

'Yes, you could,' came the reply. 'Here, let me show you.'

She reached into her pocket, pulled out a few coins, and dropped them on the pavement. And then, with the noise of the crowded street still blaring in their ears, they noticed every head within 5 metres turn and look to see if the money that tinkled on the pavement was theirs.

'See what I mean?' asked the wise lady. 'It all depends on what's important to you, on what you're listening for.'

So, what is important to you? If God isn't, then you're probably not going to hear what God is saying to you. If he is, then listening for him in the busyness of our lives is the most important thing we can do.





Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.



GROW COURSES offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

In financial terms, a fairly accurate estimate at this stage of the sum raised net of costs is in the region of £5,000. Thanks in considerable part are due to the Christmas Cracker Café team whose superb efforts were enjoyed and praised by visitors. Funds raised at the Christmas Tree Festival are vital in the maintenance of our beautiful church building. In addition, the concerts on Thursday and Saturday raised funds for Hospiscare, the Town Band and our choir. Many thanks to all the volunteers for all their hard work.

The two weeks following the Christmas Tree Festival have been focused on the local schools as we hosted a number of school Carol services at both Holy Cross and St Lawrence Chapel. On Friday 19

CHURCH TOWER ILLUMINATION: "LIGHTS ON @ ST MATTHEW'S"


During the Winter season, our church tower is floodlit by public subscription. It is a beacon of welcome and warmth, visible for miles around. We hope that you all enjoy the spectacle.

You can choose to sponsor in memory of a loved one or of a

special occasion, such as a Birthday, Wedding Anniversary or any other occasion significant in your life.

So many tell us how welcoming it is to turn a corner on the road home and spot the tower, beautifully lit-up on the horizon. It tells you that you are safely returned to home, hearth, family and church.

The sponsorship, at just £10 per week, is designed simply to cover the direct cost of the lighting. In the unlikely event of any surplus money, it will be used to support the planned upgrades to church heating and lighting and the renovation of the bell tower through the medium of the Church Fabric Fund, or at the discretion of the sponsor.


