The Joy of Christmas

The joy of Christmas is the Church of England's theme for this Christmas. One of the resources it has produced is a delightful little book called 'The Grumpy Owl and the Joy of Christmas.'



The story opens by telling us that there once was an owl who lived in an empty, cold, damp and lonely old barn which was just the way he liked it because he was a grumpy owl. One night a man, a woman and a donkey burst through the door. 'What are you doing in my barn?' hoots the owl to the donkey. When the donkey explains that the guest room is full and the lady is about to have a baby, the owl declares that he doesn't give a hoot and flies off to find somewhere he can be alone. You will have to read the book if you want to find out if the owl misses out on the joy of Christmas or whether the story ends with him hooting for joy.

Joy is a key theme in the Christmas story. When the angel Gabriel tells Mary that God has chosen her to be the mother of the long-awaited Saviour she sings a song of joy – the Magnificat. Following the birth of Jesus, the angels' message to the shepherds is 'Behold I bring you good news of great joy.' We read that when the wise men saw the star that would lead them to the Christ child they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy.

For many people Christmas is a joyful season. A time for decking the halls with holly; a time for going to a Christmas panto; a time for feasting and making merry; a time for family to gather once more. Sadly, Christmas isn't joyful for all. It's not if you are worrying about how you will pay for it all; it's not if a Christmas party means he'll come home drunk once more; it's not if there's an empty chair at the Christmas table where there was a loved one the year before. For many of us Christmas can be a mixture with both highs and lows — a time when joy comes and goes.

May I wish everyone who is looking forward to the joys of Christmas every blessing. May I encourage us all to be alert and sensitive to those for whom Christmas isn't a time of joy. May I invite us all to remember that in the birth of Jesus – Emmanuel – God comes down to be with us and he doesn't come and go. Jesus is with us when we are on the mountain top and full of joy. Jesus is with us when we are down in the valley and full of sorrow. Jesus is with us at every twist and turn, nook and cranny along the way.
