Growing!



For 3 days in January the majority of the clergy of Winchester Diocese, myself included, attended a Diocesan conference in Hertfordshire. The theme of the conference was becoming more Christ centred as a church. The Bishop of Winchester said these words in his final sermon,

Over the years I've been so helped by Lesslie Newbigin's oft-repeated words that the Church of God is to be 'a sign, instrument and foretaste of the Kingdom of God'. The high calling of the Church is to point to the Kingdom that is to come; to work for the coming of that Kingdom; and in the here and now to give a flavour and a savour of just what that coming Kingdom is.

This really must be who we are as a church, otherwise we're at best a social club and sometimes not even a very good one of those.

The conference was a great chance to grow together and hear a range of excellent speakers and I even danced the night away at a silent disco, 'dance as if no-one is watching'.

The afternoon before we went I attended online the annual Hopeweavers renewal of promises. Hopeweavers is a scattered recognised Anglican community which I belong to. Our aim is to create sanctuary space for people to grow into and meet God. Every member has a rule of life that leads you toward simplicity and creativity and engages with other members of the community in a variety of ways.

This year we focussed on the concept of 'Refugia' which is about the phenomenon of growth in barren places and we were all sent 10 wildflower seed-balls which you simply drop onto a patch of earth which, when they are naturally watered, root and sprout. I haven't decided yet where to do my bit of guerilla gardening but I'm looking for the right spot.

It's great for the church to bring good news and there is plenty of evidence both nationally and locally of a quiet revival of people coming unexpectedly to church particularly those in their 20's and 30's and especially young men, perhaps our own little bit of refugia.

During the past couple of years, we have supported a small charity - The East Sheen Chengannur Trust – who have helped to improve the lives of people in the Chengannur region of India. Sadly, the current CEO, Russell Mattin, finds himself without a succession plan and so the charity will wind up at the end of 2026. Russell dearly wants us to continue to send our stamps to them during the current year however, and so I will continue to send whatever you donate.

From 2027 we will re-establish our previous links with RNIB, having found a new address to send them, and having spoken to one of their fundraisers who tells me that used stamps are raising about £33,000 for them annually or £20 for every kilogram. So Please keep your used stamps coming – there is a collection point in each church.

Draw Near: Life-giving habits for Lent

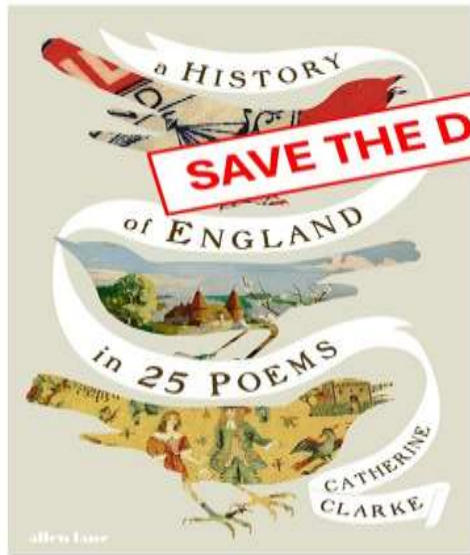
