1 February: The Presentation of Christ in the Temple

Almighty and ever-living God, clothed in majesty, whose beloved Son was this day presented in the Temple, in substance of our flesh: grant that we may be presented to you with pure and clean hearts, by your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. We're used to hearing the Prologue to John's Gospel at



Christmas, when we turn our steps to Bethlehem and marvel at the new-born Child in the manger. It is our Gospel again today. Epiphany was full of news of Jesus being recognized as Christ: first by the Magi, representing all the nations of the world, then by his own at his baptism and at the wedding feast. This week, at Candlemas, with Simeon and Anna we witness Almighty God coming to the Temple in Jerusalem, in the person of Jesus. This is the climax of all the wonders and miracles of the season of Epiphany: the child in his mother's arms. The Incarnation is the miracle of miracles; the greatest mystery, the most profound wisdom. And it's available to all. God's incarnational intention is that we, his people embody His love, wisdom, and justice in the world; in the lives we have, as the people we are.
