Reflection: Sunday 18th January 2nd Sunday of Epiphany

I love the openings of Paul's letters, each so

personal. He begins this letter to the Corinthians by reminding them who they are *before* addressing what they are doing wrong. This harks back to God's words at the baptism of Jesus, '*This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased*', words spoken before Jesus's ministry had begun.

They remind us that his church is not a gathering of a godly elite, but for ordinary people who have chosen to follow God's grace in Jesus Christ.

Paul emphasises that we are called *together*, to work in and with our communities and, like the Corinthians, we share grace, peace, and a common Lord. Christ belongs to all believers equally.

Paul had heard reports of divisions within the church in Corinth. They are beginning to define themselves by human loyalties rather than by their shared identity in Christ. Therefore their witness was being damaged when rivalry, pride, and 'tribal' loyalties replaced love and humility.

I don't know if you've made, and broken, new year resolutions but January is a good time to reflect on the last year, both individually and as communities. Are our Christian beliefs guiding our decisions or are we letting personalities, traditional viewpoints and personal points of view colour our thoughts and prevent deeper understanding and understanding?

If that is so, how can we change our attitudes and actions so that we contribute to the unity of Christ's church on earth, rather than division? Paul's letter to the Corinthians reminds us that the church is God's work and God's people and its unity is something we are called to protect. We work for it as a common purpose; maybe in different ways but always remembering that line from a favourite hymn of mine: One Church, One Faith, One Lord!

Bible Readings:

Sunday 18th January

2nd Sunday of Epiphany

Isaiah 49.1-7

1. Listen to me, O coastlands,
pay attention, you peoples from far away! The Lord called me before I was born,
while I was in my mother's womb he named me.
2 He made my mouth like a sharp sword,
in the shadow of his hand he hid me; he made me a polished arrow,
in his quiver he hid me away.
3 And he said to me, 'You are my servant,
Israel, in whom I will be glorified.'
4 But I said, 'I have laboured in vain,
I have spent my strength for nothing and vanity; yet surely my cause is with the Lord,
and my reward with my God.'
5 And now the Lord says,
who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him,
and that Israel might be gathered to him, for I am honoured in the sight of the Lord,
and my God has become my strength-
6 he says, 'It is too light a thing that you should be my servant
to raise up the tribes of Jacob
and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations,
that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth.'
7 Thus says the Lord,
the Redeemer of Israel and his Holy One, to one deeply despised, abhorred by the nations,
the slave of rulers, 'Kings shall see and stand up,
princes, and they shall prostrate themselves, because of the Lord, who is faithful,
the Holy One of Israel, who has chosen you.'

1 Corinthians 1.1-9

1 Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthenes,
2 To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:
3 Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

4 I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus,
5 for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind-
6 just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you-
7 so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ.
8 He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.
9 God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

John 1.29-42

29 The next day he saw Jesus coming towards him and declared, 'Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!
30 This is he of whom I said, "After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me."
31 I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel.'
32 And John testified, 'I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him.
33 I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit."
34 And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God.'
35 The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples,
36 and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, 'Look, here is the Lamb of God!'
37 The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.
38 When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi' (which translated means Teacher), 'where are you staying?'
39 He said to them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.
40 One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.
41 He first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which is translated Anointed).
42 He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas' (which is translated Peter).

Psalm 40.1-12

- 1 I waited patiently for the Lord;
he inclined to me and heard my cry.
- 2 He brought me out of the roaring pit,
out of the mire and clay;
he set my feet upon a rock and made my footing sure.
- 3 He has put a new song in my mouth,
a song of praise to our God;
many shall see and fear
and put their trust in the Lord.
- 4 Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord,
who does not turn to the proud that follow a lie.
- 5 Great are the wonders you have done, O Lord my God.
How great your designs for us!
There is none that can be compared with you.
- 6 If I were to proclaim them and tell of them
they would be more than I am able to express.
- 7 Sacrifice and offering you do not desire
but my ears you have opened;
- 8 Burnt offering and sacrifice for sin you have not
required;
then said I: 'Lo, I come.
- 9 'In the scroll of the book it is written of me
that I should do your will, O my God;
I delight to do it: your law is within my heart.'
- 10 I have declared your righteousness in the great
congregation;
behold, I did not restrain my lips,
and that, O Lord, you know.
- 11 Your righteousness I have not hidden in my heart;
I have spoken of your faithfulness and your salvation;
I have not concealed your loving-kindness and truth
from the great congregation.
- 12 Do not withhold your compassion from me, O Lord;
let your love and your faithfulness always preserve
me,

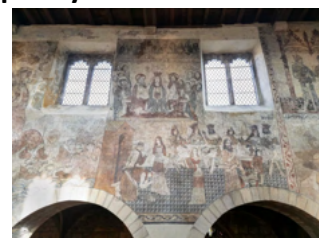

Food Bank Appeal:

Jubilee Foodbank, Market Harborough

You can drop off donations at **Hallaton Church** or to Linda Jones at **25, Eastgate, Hallaton at any time**. Please note that all food collected is non-perishable, long-life or tinned.

The Foodbank has **MOST URGENT NEED of:**

Custard, Chicken in sauce, Tinned Ham, Peanut butter, Packet Rice (500g if possible), Tinned Vegetarian Meals, Teabags, Tinned Fruit, Jam, Corned Beef.

They also need:

Crackers, Fray Bentos pies, Porridge Oats, UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Sugar (500g), Deodorant, Cereal, Pasta sauces, Tinned Sweetcorn, Baked Beans with Sausages, Tinned chicken, Hot Dogs (Tins or jars,) Tinned red meat, Tinned Carrots, Tinned meatballs, Dried potatoes (Smash), Marmalade, Biscuits, Tinned potatoes, Crisps, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned chickpeas, mixed chilli beans, lentils, Tinned rice pudding, Sachet meals (pan or microwave), 'No Cook' meals for the homeless, Cordial, Coffee (small jars), Pasta sauce, Tinned soup, Cup of soup, Tinned peas, Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Snacks and cereal bars, Fruit squash/ juice, Microwave puddings, Tinned Pasta, Sandwich paste, Tuna, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash

concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

Where possible and available, consider giving tins with a ring-pull as these can also be used for homeless people where the food is appropriate (e.g. fish, tinned fruit, etc)

Leicester's Cultural Stories Shared Through Conversations

St Philip's Centre is preserving the memories and experiences that lie behind cohesion and community spirit by recording and documenting 103 stories from those who have made their home in Leicester.

A rich variety of cultures and experiences can be found within Leicester, with roughly one third of participants born overseas, a third from the UK outside of Leicester itself, and a third born within Leicester.

There are nine main chapters, covering the following themes:

- Only in Leicester
- Free to be me
- Where is home?
- Changes, good and bad
- Stories of welcome and exclusion
- Barriers and challenges
- Lived religion and belief
- Celebrating Leicester
- Quirky treasure
