Dear Friends,

There has been quite a bit of talk in the media in the past year about what has been called ‘The Quiet Revival’. This dates back to a report of that name produced by the Bible Society early last year. The report challenged the current assumption of Christian decline with stories (and statistics) suggesting that what is called Gen Z (pronounced the American way) – roughly, those in their teens and twenties – are much more open to faith than previous generations, and have been demonstrating this by turning up at church (and this is particularly so amongst young men).

There has been a pushback against this – one survey swallow doesn’t make a spiritual summer – and I must say that I started off being a bit sceptical myself. But over the past year I have been asking around and seeing whether clergy friends and colleagues around the country have seen any signs of the Quiet Revival. And I have been receiving lots of anecdotal evidence that suggests there might be something in it.

Indeed, you don’t have to go very far to see some evidence. In my work as Rural Dean of North Cambridge I see quite a lot of what is going on in the churches of our city. I happened to pop into two of them on a Sunday morning in the past few months and they were both full – including plenty of younger men. They haven’t always been so well attended. They both offer a distinctive ‘brand’ of Christianity – traditional in worship and using the Book of Common Prayer – but with incumbents who would regard themselves as mainstream Church of England. Other city centre (Anglican) churches have a distinctive evangelical and/or charismatic flavour, with much less formal worship. They too are growing, indeed overflowing.

Do we see any of this out in our three villages? The evidence is thinner, I have to say. We have had one or two younger people join us on Sunday mornings but it’s too soon and not enough data to say it’s a trend. But we did notice that most of our Christmas services this year were fuller than they have been for some time. Our carol service in Fen Ditton was packed and we were putting out seats as people arrived.

But our population is not as young as central Cambridge and so perhaps it's not surprising if it takes a while for the waves of the Quiet Revival to reach us. Are we ready for it? Perhaps what we can learn from the city is that the young value somewhere where they meet people in the flesh and form face-to-face relationships (as opposed to the online variety) in a spiritual context where there is a rich depth of belief and spiritual practice. They are not averse to undiluted worship, serious engagement with the Bible, a rich diet of prayer and deeply committed but open communities of faith.

Are we ready if the tide really is turning?

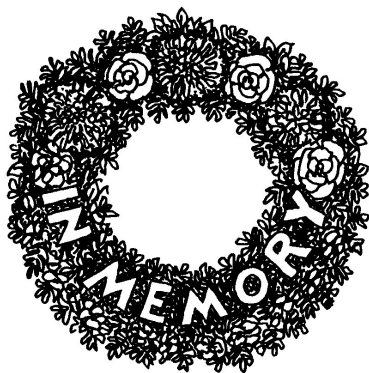
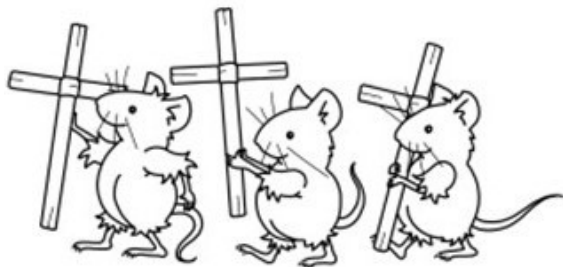

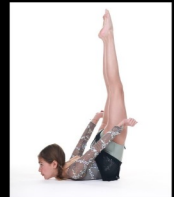

We're sad to say that Kerry is stepping down as editor of *New Life* in the summer. We are so grateful to her for her excellent stewardship of our magazine over a good number of years now – including during Covid. But this means we are, of course, on the hunt for a replacement. Is this something you might consider? Kerry says that it takes her about 3–4 hours a month (mainly focused on the day(s) she is putting it all together). You would be well supported – not least in that the advertising, physical distribution and finances are all overseen by an experienced team. And all the material is provided one way or another so there's no writing involved (unless you would like to, of course). If you might be interested I'd be glad to have a no-commitment conversation, and Kerry would also be delighted to chat to anyone thinking about it.

St Peter's Horningsea: From beneath the floor to the top of the tower

This year we will start the project to make the access to the tower safe by replacing the ladder and adding balustrades and hand holds in the tower. We will also replace the whole of the floor in the north side of the church – where the floorboards and tiles have been damaged by the damp. This is a major project involving removing all the pews in the north side of the church so that the floor can be lifted, specialist damp proofing material can be laid and a new wooden floor can be put down. The Victorian tiles and pampments will be replaced, if they are broken or damaged beyond repair, or re-laid. The pillars which have been affected by the damp will be renovated. In the west end of the aisle there are two 10th C tomb lids which are surrounded by the Victorian tiles. It may be necessary to instruct archaeologists to look at what, if anything, is underneath these tomb lids. The whole project will cost about £130,000. The church has some funds, from events that have been organised in the last few years. The Friends of Horningsea Church will be able to make a contribution. We hope that the Diocesan Bell Ringers will make a contribution to replacing the ladder and enhancing the tower access. However, the largest sum of money will have to come from grants or loans from various grant giving bodies. We have an application for a Heritage Lottery grant for £100,000. Once we know the outcome of that application we will have to look at applying to other bodies. Meanwhile we will continue to fundraise and ask for donations. If you are willing or able to make a donation we would be so very grateful. Donations can be made directly to Horningsea PCC, Sort Code 30-91-74, Account Number 00755327. You can also make a donation via the Parish Giving Scheme PGS ref: 42837 – ask the treasurer if you need more information about the way the scheme works.

Thank you for reading this and for supporting St Peter's Church. The church will remain open and usable for the three months that the work is expected to take.

And then the fun aspects of the project!

Once the work is complete there will be various events celebrating the Saxon and Viking history of the church – with a Viking re-enactment society coming to lead a fun re-enactment day during the summer. There will be a talk about the Saxon minster, an exhibition celebrating the 260th anniversary of the embroidered linen altar cloth (which is 10 years older than the United States of America, having been embroidered in 1766!), there may be a Teddy Bears' parachute jump ... there will be bell ringing open days ...

Keep your eyes open for all the planned events as the year moves on.

The subject was attracting Bees and Butterflies into your Garden and our speaker, Peter Jackson, provided clear guidance and presented a selection of plants you can add to your garden to help attract these beautiful insects. These included Winter Honeysuckle, Dwarf Daphne (potted) and dead Nettles. 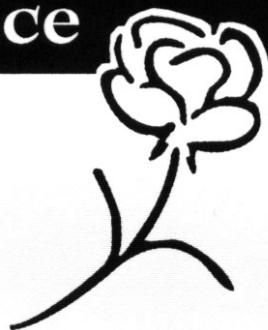

50 years ago, on 11th Feb 1976 that John Curry won Britain's first-ever Olympic gold medal in figure skating.

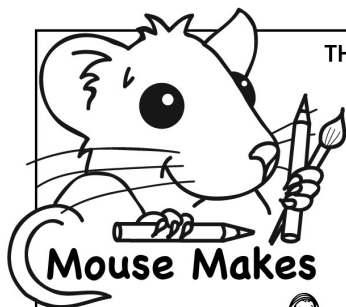
Also 50 years ago, on 23rd Feb 1976 that artist the L S Lowry died.
