SUPPORTING REFUGEES IN HOYLAKE



When the men arrive in this country the Home Office provide a plain grey (very cheap) tracksuit and a pair of thin cotton slip on shoes. They are not given any other support with clothing from the Home Office even though they are living in a climate which requires warm clothing. If they do not have more than one set of clothes it is incredibly difficult to take them off and wash them. It costs £55 to buy suitable shoes and a coat for each refugee.
