## Brixham Mission Community News


Throughout 2025 the parishes of Brixham, Lower Brixham, Churston and Kingswear have been working to establish better ways of moving forward together as a united Mission Community. Each parish has its own individual character and its own plans for maintaining and developing our four churches and Galmpton's Chapel of the Good Shepherd, so we are emphasising unity rather than uniformity.

At the beginning of December 2025 the Bishops' Council ratified our plans to establish a Partial Transfer Joint Council which had been voted for by the parochial church councils (PCCs) and parishioners. The new council will be known as Brixham Mission Community Council and will come into effect once members have been elected from each parish during January.

This is a positive initiative for the Mission Community. It will enable us to build stronger connections with the wider community and will help reduce the workload on PCCs.

Many thanks to everyone who has supported this plan and helped to make it happen.

1<sup>st</sup> January is the traditional day to make New Year Resolutions. I don't usually bother as I know that they won't last a week, let

There is some background to my resolution: for months I have been getting furiously angry when the activities of Trump and Putin (and other leaders) are discussed; there is so little that I can do to change things it is infuriating.

My youngest son, who lives in the USA, tries to avoid listening to **any news** as he finds it so traumatising. As if they were 'Teflon' coated, any criticism slides away like water off a duck's back. Trump is aggrieved that he wasn't given the Nobel Peace Prize!! So, following a recent radio discussion, I decided to award the "**Lakey Prize for causing Anger**'. This year the winner is Mr Trump, and the Runner-Up prize goes to Mr Putin.

But I was puzzled about what the prize might be, and how I could be calmer? Then I remembered that, if I want to sort out my feelings about another person or situation, it takes prayer for it to be effective. So, in an effort to stop getting so angry about how powerful

leaders behave, and in the hope that it might improve things in some way (prayer is never wasted by God), I decided that the prize would be prayer each day for a year (and probably longer).

I have pledged myself to pray specifically for Trump and Putin (and others as needed), that they will work for the good of **all people** rather than, as it seems, for their personal advancement. I will also pray that I don't get so angry and aggressive myself.

My apologies that this is so self-centred, but I thought that the history might be helpful to someone. I must report that I am already much calmer and, so far, have not got angry. So if you don't know what sort of New Year resolution to make I would recommend that a prayer resolution might be good, and if you would like to contribute to my prize by joining me in prayer we might achieve something good together. Wishing you all a very happy year, with loads of love and prayers.
