Jesus' baptism is the first time we meet him as an adult. No longer a child under the care of his parents. Yet Jesus would not have made it to adulthood, much less his baptism, without individuals, i) attuned to listening to God and ii) committed to protecting the vulnerable. Up to 50% of children in the First century CE didn't reach 10 years old. In addition to disease, poverty, infanticide, war & malnutrition, Jesus faced targeted imperial threats. Thankfully, the child Jesus was anchored by three key people : Ancestors; Jospheh; Magi.

Remember the genealogy in Matthew ch.1? THAT



genealogy! Abraham, David, Ruth, Tamar, Achim... stories & experiences that shape a culture, a faith, a people, a Messiah. *"Loving Father, we thank you for your servant Moses, who led your people through the waters of the Red Sea to freedom in the Promised Land."*

JOSEPH

Following the instructions of an angel of the Lord not once but THREE times. Marrying. Fleeing. Settling. Today, aunties, grandparents, elders help us live into the fullness of our call; to grow into the beauty of our life. *"Parents and godparents... Will you pray for them, draw them by your example into the community of faith and walk with them in the way of Christ?"*

MAGI

Unknown to Mary & Joseph, yet these strangers celebrate & protect their child. Ignoring Herod's request, returning home by another route, they make themselves vulnerable to Roman retribution. Broader society, who recognise the dangers of empire. *"In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome this child and uphold them in their new life in Christ?"*

It takes a village to raise a child. It takes a church to develop a disciple. Young people today testify to the divided world we live in. The fellowship of the Holy Spirit has something to offer them. The nurture, support and protection of a faith community who care for everyone within it. A **spiritual** practice AND a **political** one.

Call it Minster Community or not, as you wish, followers of Jesus are called to tell the story of God's love, writ through the bible story & church liturgy. You are **Beloved**. You **Belong**. You are **Delightful!**
