Looking Ahead: Choosing Our Next Bishop

Following Bishop Steven's announcement that he will be retiring, the Diocese will begin listening to people's views from **7 January** as we start the journey towards appointing a new Bishop.

To help with this, the Diocese is putting together a *Statement of Needs*. This will describe life across the Diocese — our joys and challenges — and what really matters to people as we look for our next Bishop.

The main way to share your thoughts is through a short, anonymous online survey. It has just four questions and should take less than ten minutes to complete.

Sundays at All Saints...

In our next sermon series, we'll be spending time with some memorable moments from the Bible where individuals come face to face with Jesus. From a chance conversation with a woman at a well, to a thoughtful nighttime meeting with Nicodemus, to Jesus standing at the tomb of his friend Lazarus, these are deeply human encounters—full of questions, hope, confusion, courage, and longing. Each episode gives us a glimpse of who Jesus is and how he meets people exactly where they are, whatever their background, doubts, or expectations.

Whether you've been part of church life for years, are exploring faith for the first time, or are simply curious, these stories invite us to pause and look again at the character and nature of Jesus: his compassion, honesty, authority, and love.

You are warmly invited to join us for this series, to listen, reflect, and be part of the conversation. As we "come and see" these encounters afresh, what might they reveal about who Jesus is—and what he might be saying to you today?

On this occasion, I was joined by Emma Brookman, the Head of Bisham Primary School, which made the visit especially meaningful as we shared worship, prayers, and the Christmas story together.

✨ A Joyful December at All Saints Bisham

December was a wonderful month at All Saints Bisham, full of music, celebration, and the joy of community as we marked the Christmas season with a variety of services for all ages.

On 10th December, we started the celebrations with our first **Daytime Carols Service** 🎵 which offered a shorter, traditional service specifically for those who prefer not to go out in the dark, but don't want to miss out on singing Carols and marking the festive season! About 25 people gathered together, and the service had a cosy, welcoming atmosphere with refreshments served beforehand, and featured classic carols and readings that helped set the scene for the festive season.



On 14th December, around 60 people joined us for the **Traditional 9 Lessons and Carols** 🕯️, which followed the familiar pattern of readings and carols telling the story of Christmas from prophecy to the nativity. We were joined by a wonderful team of singers who swelled the ranks of the choir and helped lead us in singing the much-loved traditional Carols. Festive refreshments before and after the service added to the warm and joyful atmosphere.

The **Community Carols** 🌞 on 21st December were a highlight, drawing around 260 people from across the parish and beyond. Led by Jo Carter and the JAM choir, the service included a couple of children taking the roles of Mary and Gabriel. Full of festive energy, singing, and celebration, it was a wonderful way for the whole community to come together, even if we did almost run out of mulled wine and mince pies!



On 24th December, our **Traditional Crib Service** 🧑🏻 brought the nativity story to life for children and families. Rev John Smith, returning from retirement, led the service, with Mark Garrad, our churchwarden, narrating the bible story, as children brought forward various nativity figures—including two baby Jesuses and around five kings! It was a joyful and memorable start to Christmas Eve.

It was a month full of joyful worship, shared celebration, and community spirit, and we are so grateful to everyone who joined in, and grateful too


for all those who served, either with refreshments, setting up, clearing away, welcoming, singing, playing and reading lessons for us, we could not have done it without you, and your help was a real blessing to all who came along.

These services are a reminder that All Saints is a place where everyone can come together to celebrate, reflect, and experience the heart of Christmas.
