Musings

On 13th January the Church remembers George Fox, the founder of the Society of Friends (Quakers). George Fox was born in Leicestershire in 1624 and grew up in a time of upheaval, both religious and political, culminating in the English Civil War. Always a serious young man, in his early 20's George set off travelling, finding in solitude opportunities to clarify his thoughts on his strong Christian faith. Often he would spend days sitting under a tree, reading his Bible and praying, and spend nights walking and thinking. He believed that religion does not depend on external show because God is freely acceptable without a mediator. So he was led to believe that merely external displays of discipleship and ritual were false, ordained clergy were unnecessary as also were church buildings. He travelled around England (and later even further afield) preaching outdoors often to more than 1000 people and performing healings. This would lead him into conflict with authorities. On several occasions he met with Oliver Cromwell and although the two men had points on which they disagreed they had great respect for one another. George and his followers were often prosecuted, especially because they refused to swear oaths, quoting the words of Jesus, 'Do not swear an oath' 'All you need to say is simply, "Yes" or "No"'. (Matthew 5 verses 34a and 37a). On one occasion when George appeared in court in Derby he exhorted the judge to 'tremble at the word of the Lord'. The judge called him and his followers 'Quakers'. After a full and eventful life, George died in London in 1691 at the age of 66.

The Society of Friends which he founded still plays a major role in the world to this day. They believe that there is God in everyone and so all people are valuable and should be treated with love and respect. They are therefore often to be found where there is need, working for peace, prison reform, equality, asylum seekers and many more. George Fox's search to know God has resulted in much good work in the world.
