Reflection: Sunday 1st February

4th Sunday of Epiphany

Presentation of Christ in the Temple

Our celebrations at Christmas told us that a baby has been born – in case we hadn't noticed! But Candlemas 40 days later forces us to see that this baby is real and one of us. We can sympathise with his parents who have a lot to cope with, as they bring their child the five miles to the Temple in Jerusalem, and make the special offering which the Law requires. That baby is no longer just a picture on a Christmas card. As the writer to the Hebrews says, 'we share his flesh and blood'; he is 'like us his brothers and sisters in every respect', yet with his own special needs and special calling.

That special calling, Simeon says, is to be "a light shining before all the peoples of the world". Note that Simeon does not hold him up as someone to 'make Israel great again', but as someone to bring the light of truth to all humanity as well as to his own people. Simeon is wise enough to be honest, however, and to say that this will cost the child dear. He will upset the established order and people will reject him, and his mother in particular will bear great pain.

But that is all in the future when Jesus is confronted with the activities of the bully-boys of history in the shape of the various rulers called Herod and the brutal might of Rome. The light of truth which that baby will make to

shine in the world will be trashed and almost extinguished in a process similar to much that we are seeing in the power politics of our own day. But we today are called with Simeon and Anna to praise God for that light of truth shining from a special baby, someone who is one of us.

Malachi 3.1-5

3 See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts.

2 But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap;

3 he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness.

4 Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

5 Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts.

Hebrews 2.14-end

14 Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil,

15 and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death.

16 For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham.

17 Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people.

18 Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

Luke 2.22-40

22 When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord

23 (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'),

24 and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him.

26 It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah.

27 Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law,

28 Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

29 'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace,

according to your word;

30 for my eyes have seen your salvation,

31 which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles

and for glory to your people Israel.'

33 And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him.

34 Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed

35 so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

36 There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage,

37 then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day.

38 At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

39 When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth.

40 The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

The Foodbank has **MOST URGENT NEED of:** Tinned Rice Pudding, Strong clean 'bags for life', Custard, Tinned fruit, Dried Packet Rice, Baked Beans

Other suggested donations: Porridge Oats, UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Teabags, Sugar (500g), Deodorant, Jam, Corned Beef, Tinned Baked beans with sausages, Cereal, Crackers, Tinned sweetcorn, Tinned Carrots, Dried potatoes (Smash), Tinned red meat, Tinned meatballs, chicken in sauce, Biscuits, Sweets, Snacks and Crisps, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned chickpeas, mixed chilli beans, lentils, Tinned rice pudding, Sachet meals (pan or microwave), 'No Cook' meals for the homeless, Cordial, Marmalade, Jam, Tinned potatoes, Coffee (small jars), Fray Bentos pies, Pasta sauce, Tinned ham, Crackers, Tinned soup, Cup of soup, Sugar (500g), Tinned peas, Tinned vegetarian meals, such as veggie chilli, Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Snacks and cereal bars, Fruit squash/ juice, Microwave puddings, Pasta sauce, Peanut butter, Tinned pasta, Sandwich paste, Teabags, Tuna, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge), Mayonnaise, Angel Delight, Small sachets of herbs, Shampoo, Toothpaste, Toothbrushes, Sunscreen (for homeless people in the summer), Shower gel, soap, Feminine products – sanitary towels, tampons

Each episode will draw listeners into deep, energising conversations that bring wisdom, wit, and wonder to the craft of preaching.

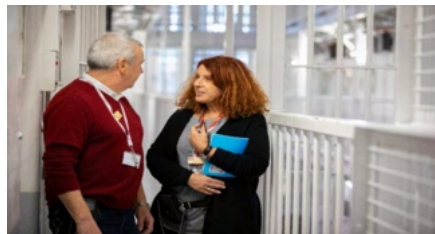

Make a Difference Behind the Prison Walls



Have you ever wondered what life is really like inside a prison? Do you care about justice, dignity, and the humane treatment of others?

For many Christians, this compassion to stand alongside those who the world often forgets is a sign of God's invitation to serve: to bring light, listening, and hope into places where they are deeply needed.

If you recognise that stirring within you, volunteering with the Independent Monitoring Boards (IMB) could be a meaningful way to respond to that calling.

The IMB are looking for volunteers from all walks of life to monitor prisons and see how prisoners are being treated. Every prison in England and Wales has an IMB – a group of ordinary citizens appointed by ministers to act as the public's eyes and ears.

They are currently looking for volunteers at **HMP Leicester**, **HMP Fosse Way**, **HMP Gartree** and **HMP Stocken**.
