SCHEDULE

(Description of Works or Proposals)

The north external door to the church building is a large ancient solid oak door, likely medieval in origin; it is mounted on metal pintels (hinges) set directly into the surrounding stone archway.

The door is becoming increasingly difficult to use due to misalignment consequent from the addition of pine boarding, likely during a Victorian refurbishment.

A report on the door has been undertaken by Dolmen Joinery with recommendations, which the PCC wish to implement. A method statement for the proposed works will be submitted to the Diocesan Advisory Committee for consideration and approval, once the door has been removed to the Conservators workshop for investigation and a scope of works established.

Condition

Once the door has been removed to the Conservators workshop for investigation and a scope of works established, a method statement for the proposed works shall be submitted to the DAC for consideration and approval prior to those works being carried out.
