Reverend Richard writes....

A New Year, an Open Door

As January 2026 begins, I would like to wish you a very happy and blessed New Year. The turning of the calendar is always a moment filled with mixed emotions. There is hope and anticipation for what lies ahead, but often also a quiet awareness of what has been difficult in the year just gone. New Year's resolutions come and go, yet the deeper questions remain: What really matters? What do I want this year to be about?

For many people, a new year brings a longing for change. We think about becoming healthier, kinder, more patient, or more at peace. January can feel like an invitation to start again. In the Christian faith, that invitation is at the very heart of the message of Jesus. Again and again in the Gospels, Jesus invites people not to have their lives perfectly in order first, but simply to come to him.

Jesus' words are wonderfully simple and reassuring: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." There are no conditions attached. He does not say, "Come when you have everything sorted out," or "Come when your faith is strong enough." He says, "Come as you are." Tired, doubtful, joyful, hopeful, or unsure — all are welcome.

Perhaps 2026 could be the year you take a small step closer to Jesus. That step does not need to be dramatic. It might be lighting a candle and saying a quiet prayer. It might be opening a Bible for the first time in a while. It might be coming along to a service, not because you feel you should, but because you are curious, or because you are looking for peace, or simply because you want to sit somewhere that reminds you that you are not alone.

At St Mary's Wigton, our doors — and hearts — are open. Whether you have been part of church life for many years, or whether you feel unsure, rusty, or even sceptical, you are welcome.

As this new year unfolds, may you know that you are loved, valued, and invited — just as you are — to walk with Jesus into whatever 2026 may hold.
