Dear Friends,

In February this year I returned from an eleven-day trip with 7 other deacons and priests from the Diocese of Ely to the Diocese of Kigali in Rwanda, East Africa.

We were generously hosted by the Anglican Bishop Nathan Amooti Rusengo in the Cathedral guesthouse in the capital city Kigali. Kigali is a beautiful green city that sprawls across numerous hills, ridges and valleys. There are just over 1 million inhabitants in Kigali; it has a young population where great poverty and wealth exist. It is a city seeking to grow its economy and business opportunities. The city centre is developing rapidly, with new shopping malls, office buildings and a new convention centre that hosts international events.

Rwanda is predominantly Christian and the Diocese of Kigali has a church building programme to respond to the growing number of young people and families attending church. The church services are lively, loud and joyful. Every church has one or even three choirs who love to dance along to the worship songs. We tried to join in and have some fantastic photos!

We spent time visiting church schools in the parishes offering learning and aspiration. Many of the children could speak three languages: Kinyarwanda, English, French and they confidently introduced themselves and demonstrated their keenness to learn by asking us questions about ourselves.

As we travelled in the parishes, we learned that all of the churches offer community support. Many were involved in the Mother's Union network with volunteers and mentors providing training for women and girls to learn skills to set up their own businesses in tailoring and hair-dressing. The Diocese has recently created a Father's Union that brings men together, many of them young fathers, to access resources, help families in need and create opportunities for business and learning.

Church is also a place to help the community heal from the impact of the civil war between the Tutsi and Hutu community in 1994 when in just 100 days about 800,000 people were killed in Rwanda including the Diocese of Kigali. On 7th April each year Rwanda holds a Geno-

cide Memorial Day and the government encourages the community to come together on the last Saturday each month for mandatory community service lasting from 8 am to 11 am. All able-bodied people between 18 and 65 are expected to carry out community tasks together such as cleaning streets or building homes for vulnerable people.

Our group from Ely Diocese took the opportunity to repair a road in one of the parishes. We worked together with the local community carrying large stones and sand, filling in large holes much bigger than the potholes we see here. The following week we planted trees in one of the villages to help stop flooding during the rainy season.

The Bishop of Kigali says that “When God brings people together, we learn; we share.” We learned so much about the power of communities working together for good despite the trauma of the past.

Together we learned that communities can work together to reimagine a better future. The overflowing power of God’s love can be harnessed and used to bring healing, hope and transformation. I’m looking forward to returning someday and seeing the fruition of so many hopes and dreams for the amazing people of Rwanda.



Concert by New Cambridge Singers

As many will remember, New Cambridge Singers gave us a wonderful concert of German Romantic choral music in St Peter's church in the summer last year, with Rheinberger's dramatic Mass as the main work. This Lent the choir, together with the London Mozart Players, offers us an opportunity to reflect on the suffering and death of Jesus. In *Seven Last Words from the Cross* James MacMillan, one of our most celebrated contemporary composers, brings us close to Jesus in His final hours. MacMillan's music, which springs from his own deep religious faith, places the listener vividly and painfully at the very foot of the cross. It is music to accompany us through the season of Passiontide.

Alongside the MacMillan, Pulitzer Prize-winning composer Caroline Shaw's *To the Hands* echoes the Passiontide theme and reflects on tolerance and migration in the modern world.

Pablo Casal's *O vos omnes* and Anton Bruckner's *Christus factus est* complete the programme.

Lent course – ‘Meeting God in John’

A reminder that our Lent course will be continuing through March. We are following the course/book ‘Meeting God in John’ (by David Ford). The book will be helpful but the real engagement is with passages from St John’s gospel – so bring a Bible.... Most of the evenings will be at Fen Ditton Rectory (7.30pm) but Wednesday 18 March will be in the church at Horningsea, followed by Compline (Night Prayer).



Pilgrims’ visit to St Peter’s Horningsea on Tuesday 31 March

The pilgrims who set off to walk from London on Palm Sunday will reach Horningsea at about 10.45 on Tuesday 31 March. There will be about 18 pilgrims walking all the way to arrive at Walsingham on Good Friday. They carry a large cross and often sing as they walk. As long as the paths are not waterlogged they will come along the tow path, cross the river at Baits Bite and walk up past Biggin. Do join them as they walk through the village. We will need help with providing refreshments – and it is always lovely to chat to them. Once they have tended to their blisters or dried out, they say a prayer, sing and have a blessing before they set off again across the fields to Lode.



Possibility of putting swift boxes on St Peter’s church tower

A parishioner has suggested putting swift nesting boxes on St Peter’s Church tower while the building work is underway. The PCC is exploring the practicalities of this – getting permission, where to locate the boxes, how many, would we want/need CCTV so the swifts can be observed ... If we can put the nest boxes up, it would be the third nesting site in the village and hopefully increase the number of swifts whose population slumped by about 66% between 1995 and 2022. The gloomy prediction is that the most recent census of 59,000 is likely to have reduced to 40,000 this summer and to 25,000 within 5 years.

FEN DITTON GARDENING CLUB

In January, we hosted an evening with Charlotte Waters, who not only grew up in Fen Ditton, but also works as a gardener at Kings College. It was a fascinating talk, with Charlotte taking members through a year in the life of the gardens at Kings College. She also kindly offered to take members on a tour around the gardens.

On Tuesday 10th February, I was fortunate to be part of a group of six, who Charlotte gave a tour too. We met at the Porters Lodge and it was a lovely still and mild morning. Still being relatively new to Cambridge (having only lived here five years), I haven't been inside Kings College grounds yet, so it was jaw dropping being up so close to the magnificence of the chapel (which we also had a look inside). Charlotte showed us the famous lawns and wildflower meadow of Kings, as well as some of the gardens that you wouldn't get to see on a general tour. These included the Fellows Garden and the Provost Garden. Although the gardens are still in their Winter phase, signs of spring were peeping through with beautiful Snowdrops and Crocuses adding the odd splash of colour. It was a fabulous morning and we hope to revisit the gardens again during the summer when they are in full bloom.

On Tuesday 24th February, we will be holding our first Fen Ditton Gardening Club Mixer at the Marleigh Community Centre. As a club, we have a wealth of gardening knowledge to be shared. FDGC member Cerys Wren will talk us through soil types, the role of mycorrhizal fungi and principles of soil conditioning, followed by a member Q&A on the art of composting facilitated by Jennie Conroy and Trevor Warnock. There will also be the opportunities for attendees to bring a small (jam jar sized) sample of their own soil to be tested for pH level, moisture and soil fertility.

On Tuesday 24th March, we will be back in our usual home at Fen Ditton Village Hall, where we will be hosting Diana Cook, who works for Cambridgeshire Wildlife Trust as the Coordinator of the Cambridgeshire Churchyard Conservation Award. Diana will speak about her programme which encourages churches and burial grounds to manage their land for biodiversity. Diana's message is a positive one and

she will share her plans with us in how to help wildlife, which we can all follow whether in a churchyard or our own back garden.

Doors open 7.15pm. Start at 7.30pm. Guests welcome.



70 years ago, on 23rd March 1956 that Pakistan became the world's first Islamic Republic.


65 years ago, on 6th March 1961 that George Formby, the 'Ukulele King', comedian, singer and actor died.

Also 20 years ago, on 21st March 2006 that Twitter, the online social networking/micro-blogging service, was founded. Its website went live on 15th July that year.






