This year The Church of England's theme for Lent is Draw Near: Life-giving habits for Lent. Draw Near focuses on helping us develop habits and practices that bring us closer to God. And as we do, we discover that God draws closer to us. Developing these habits and practices helps us grow as disciples of Christ every day as we head towards Easter and celebrating the great mystery of God's saving love. Our calling as disciples involves: Worshipping together, Praying, Exploring the Bible, Sharing Communion, Offering service to one another and Sharing the good news with others.

Lent begins on Wednesday 17th February – Ash Wednesday. On this day there will be 2 Communion Services. 12noon and 7.30pm.

Draw Near booklets will be available in Church as we approach the beginning of Lent.

Finding a New Vicar – the story continued

Andrew and Francis (Churchwardens) are the St Helen's parish representatives playing a crucial role in the process of finding a new vicar. That isn't to say that they will decide what we want. This is a decision that will involve the entire church as much as possible. Therefore, they want your views. What do you want from a vicar? Which direction do you want the vicar to take St Helens? What style of worship do you want? How involved do you want the congregation to be in the service?

They will aim to take any and all views into account and appoint the right person for St Helen's.

The Parish Profile has been submitted to the Archdeacon and revisions have been made following on from comments received.

Likely timeline for the recruitment process:

- The parish representatives along with the Archdeacon will agree a formal timeline for the process, including the closing dates for applications, interview dates and timeline for appointment.
- The parish representatives will undergo "Safer Recruitment" training.
- Applications will be received by the diocese and time will be spent reviewing and, hopefully, making a shortlist of likely candidates.
- The interview date will probably be just after Easter, purely down to timelines and how busy vicars get during Lent.
- Once a decision has been made, an offer will be submitted to the successful candidates.
- If accepted the successful candidate would need to give 3 months' notice to their current church.
- Ideally a new incumbent will arrive sometime in August ready for a September start.

The timeline may move a little and the post will only be offered to the right candidate. The parish representatives will keep us all as informed as they can during the process and if you have any questions or suggestions please speak to Andrew or Francis.

Organ Update

A great deal of work has been done by Philip Cartwright and his team on the organ. However, there is no definitive end date in sight and the organ will not be ready for Easter services. We remain hopeful and continue to maintain close communication with Philip regarding progress.

Update From The PCC

Finances

The accounts for 2025 are now complete and will in due course be submitted to the church's annual meeting. It is, however, timely to share how 2025 compared to the previous year.

In 2025, our total income increased by a small amount - 2%, compared to 2024. More importantly, our giving in all forms increased slightly more, by 4%.

On the other hand, our expenditure decreased by 6% (not including major projects) compared to 2024. Our overall balance between income and expenditure was a small surplus of £3180.

It is good news that we are holding our own financially but obviously there is a challenge if we are to build reserves for the future.

Electoral Roll

In the Church of England, the Electoral Roll is the list of names of lay persons who wish to be regarded formally as members of the church. This means that they are eligible to vote in church meetings and to be elected to the PCC and/or deanery synod. Every year the roll is revised so that new members can join and those who have died or left the church are removed. This year's revision of the role will begin later this month and will be well advertised. Please consider if you would like to join the roll.
