Reverend Richard writes....

Showing Christ's Love in a Fractured World

February, because of Valentine's Day, often brings thoughts of love - cards, flowers, kind words shared between loved ones. Yet this year, as with so many recent years, that familiar idea of love sits alongside troubling headlines. War, injustice, division, fear, and uncertainty fill our news feeds and conversations. It can feel overwhelming, even paralysing. In times like these, the call to show Christ's love in the world is not just comforting - it is essential.

Jesus never promised an easy world. What He did promise was His presence, His peace, and His example. Christ's love is not passive or sentimental; it is active, sacrificial, and courageous. It reaches out to the hurting, welcomes the outsider, and speaks hope where despair seems louder. When everything feels shaken, love becomes our witness.

Showing Christ's love does not require power, status, or influence. In fact, it often asks us to lay those things aside. Love is found in listening rather than shouting, in serving rather than striving, and in choosing compassion over judgement. Each small act of kindness, each prayer offered, each moment of grace becomes a light in the darkness.

The church exists for moments like this—not as a place of retreat from the world, but as a community sent into it. Here, we gather not because we have all the answers, but because we know the One who does. Together, we learn to love as

Christ loves, supporting one another as we seek to live out faith in real and practical ways.

If you are tired of the noise, the anger, or the endless struggle for control, you are invited to come as you are to him. Join us at church. Come along, share life with us, and take time to get to know Jesus - the source of a love that heals, restores, and never fails.

It is with small steps a marathon starts, and it is the same with the church, the outpouring and spreading of God's love starts with a single person, and that person could be you!

So may we be people who not only choose love, but live love, and show Christ's love to a world that desperately needs it.
