Dear Friends,

Friendship: it's a great blessing! I don't mean the 'Facebook friends' sort of relationship (though I'm sure that can be close); I mean a special connection with people who know what makes us tick (and still love us!), and who know we know what makes them tick (if you get the drift). Not in every detail, of course - but in essence - in what matters; at that level, our closest friends *know* us and we *know* them.

It makes me think about communication. It's been part of my job, communicating with patients, with relatives, teaching more junior staff, and I came to realise a long time ago that meaningful communication often starts with a little small talk, yes, and then a carefully considered question. Recently I've been reading a book about mentoring/coaching; the subtitle is 'Say less, ask more and change the way you lead forever.' - interesting! And it suggests simple questions to ask, like 'What's on your mind?' - followed up with 'and what else?' - and perhaps 'how can I help?'

Jesus did that. He asked lots of questions. On one occasion, when two of John the Baptist's disciples followed him, he turned round and asked, 'What do you want?' It's translated by some as 'What are you looking for?' It was a welcoming question but not a superficial one; indeed, if asked by a spiritual teacher, it often referred to spiritual quest. So essentially, he's saying, 'Why are you following me?' Curiosity? Thirst for political revolution? Or something deeper; something eternal? And, long story short, they keep following Jesus; they become his disciples. He has that effect on people.

So, in our lives, what are we really looking for? Jesus now, as then, has astonishing truth to teach us, and offers us (as he puts it) 'life in all its fullness'. As from the 18th February, we shift into the season of Lent: perhaps that's a good time to address that question afresh? We'll gladly help as we are able.
