For Christians Lent lasts for 40 days and is a time of reflection and preparation for the celebrations of Easter. The Easter weekend is the first weekend of April, in the middle of the school holidays.

## Lorton & Derwent Fells Local History Society

The next talk arranged by Lorton & Derwent Fells Local History Society will take place on **Thursday 5 March** at 7.30 pm at the Yew Tree Hall, High Lorton, CA13 9UJ.

Dr Gill Hay will talk on '**Cumbria's First Farmers**'.

Around 6,000 years ago the way of life for Neolithic people changed dramatically. Hunting and gathering in the natural landscape gave way to farming which involved altering the landscape including clearing woodland. These changes happened throughout Britain, but recent work in the North-west is providing particularly good evidence for understanding this transition. Was it abrupt, did it involve migration and what happened to native Cumbrians.

Dr Hay is president of Cumberland and Westmorland Antiquarian and Archaeological Society and former CEO of Oxford Archaeology where she worked for over 30 years.

All welcome, but parking is tricky, so please leave plenty of time to find a spot. The charge for visitors is £4.00 to include refreshments. Cash on the door.

The list is endless and there are jobs for anyone who wants one. You can give as little time or as much as much as you want. We can't manage without volunteers.





## Gardening tips for March

In March, UK gardeners should focus on preparing for spring by cleaning, mulching, and weeding beds, pruning shrubs like roses and dogwoods, and starting seeds. It is the ideal time to plant summer-flowering bulbs, sow hardy vegetables like peas and carrots, and take the first lawn cut of the season on a dry day.

### *Key March Gardening Jobs:*

- **Beds & Borders:** Tidy up, remove weeds, and apply a thick layer of mulch (compost or bark) to conserve moisture and suppress weeds.
- **Pruning:** Finish pruning roses, clematis, and autumn-fruiting raspberries. Cut back winter-flowering shrubs like *Cornus* and *Salix*.
- **Planting:** Plant summer-flowering bulbs like lilies and dahlias. Divide overgrown herbaceous perennials.
- **Sowing Veg:** Sow hardy veg directly outside, including parsnips, lettuce, spinach, radish, and early potatoes. Start tomatoes, peppers, and chillies indoors.
- **Lawn Care:** Carry out the first mow of the year on a dry day with the mower set high. Re-seed bare patches.
- **Maintenance:** Clean patios and pathways. Divide snowdrops "in the green". Install water butts and check tools.
- **Wildlife:** Protect new shoots from slugs. Install bird boxes and feed birds as they begin nesting.

*Tip: If the soil is still frozen or waterlogged, delay planting and sowing until it warms up.*

Our cafe review this month is inspired by Eleanor who suggested Distington Walled Garden Cafe. It has been on our radar to visit this Walled Garden and Cafe so off we went on a Tuesday.

It's very easy to find just beside the entrance to Distington Crematorium. There's parking for about 8 (well positioned!) cars so on a busy, warmer, sunnier day you might have to park on the road. The garden itself is small but looks like it could be interesting when it's all planted up.

The cafe is at the top right through the lovely wrought iron gates. At 10.30 am the cafe wasn't full, but a few tables had reservations on for lunch & afternoon teas.

The staff all gave a warm welcome. We took Chewy our big labradoodle with us as they advertised as being very dog friendly and they definitely are. The decor is quirky cottage style with lots of crafts & art to look at & buy.

Kevin had a flat white coffee & I had a cappuccino. Both came quickly & were hot. We both chose cheese scones as they were hot out of the oven & freshly baked. Delicious with plenty butter!

They serve a good variety of breakfast (until 11.30am) & lunch options, as well as an amazing selection of cakes and pastries. There is also a really great children's menu. Afternoon teas served with prior booking.
