The Third Sunday of Easter

White

Collect

Almighty Father,
who in your great mercy gladdened the disciples
with the sight of the risen Lord:
give us such knowledge of his presence with us,
that we may be strengthened and sustained by his
risen life
and serve you continually in righteousness and
truth;
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,
who is alive and reigns with you,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
one God, now and for ever.

First Reading - Acts 2.42-47

Second Reading - 1 Peter 1.17b-21

Gospel - Luke 24.13-35

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Luke.
That same day, the first day of the week,
two of the disciples
were walking to a village called Emmaus,
about seven miles from Jerusalem,
talking with each other
about everything that had happened.
While they were talking, and discussing these
things,
Jesus himself came near, and walked with
them,
but their eyes were kept from recognising him.
Jesus asked them what they were discussing
as they were walking along.
They stood still, looking downcast.
One of them said, 'You must be the only person,

in all Jerusalem, who does not know
the things that have happened there, in recent
days.'
Jesus asked them, 'What things?'
They said, 'About Jesus of Nazareth,
a prophet, mighty in word and deed,
in the sight of God, and all the people.
And how our chief priests and elders
handed him over
to be condemned to death,
and crucified.
We had hoped
that he was the one to save Israel.
It is now the third day since these things took
place,
and some women from our group
astounded us.
They were at the tomb early this morning.
They did not find his body,
but came back and told us
that they had seen
a vision of angels, who said that he was alive.
Some of those who were with us
went to the tomb,
and found it just as the women had said.'
Jesus said to them, 'How foolish you are,
and how slow to believe
all that the prophets have declared!
For it was necessary that the Messiah
should suffer these things, and only then
enter into his glory.'
And beginning with Moses, and the prophets,
Jesus explained to them
all the scriptures concerning himself.
As they came near to the village, Jesus
walked on ahead, as if he intended to go on.
But they persuaded him to stay with them,
as it was already late, and becoming dark.
When they came to eat, Jesus took bread,
blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them.
Then their eyes were opened,

and they recognised him.
And he disappeared
from their sight.
And now, they each
told the other
how their hearts
had burned within them
as he had talked with them, on the road,
and opened the scriptures to them.
That same hour, they returned to Jerusalem,
and found the eleven, and those with them,
gathered together.
They were saying, 'The Lord has risen,
and has appeared to Peter!'
And the two disciples told them
what had happened on the road,
and how the Lord
had been
made known to them
in the breaking of bread.
This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Post Communion

Living God,
your Son made himself known to his disciples
in the breaking of bread:
open the eyes of our faith,
that we may see him in all his redeeming work;
who is alive and reigns, now and for ever.
