Welcome Fr Andrew!

After two years interregnum following the passing of Fr Anthony Ingham, we are very pleased to announce that **Revd Andrew Graham Wallis** is to be formally Licensed as the new permanent priest at St Michael's.

Fr Andrew is currently the Vicar of Christ Church, Coromandel Town on the Coromandel Peninsula in the North Island of Aotearoa, New Zealand. He is British and has many years of service in the Anglican Church in various positions. Fr Andrew also has a medical background as a specialist nurse. He is arriving with his partner John. We are very much looking forward to his arrival and his leadership of our congregation and our wider community. Pending the approval of Fr Andrew's visa, the formal Licensing ceremony, led by Archdeacon Peter Hooper, will take place at St Michael's on Pentecost Sunday, 24 May.

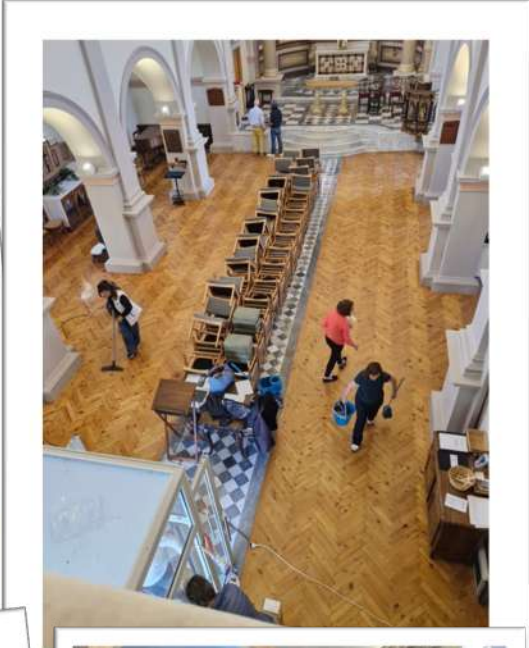
Easter Week 2026

Easter, celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, is also a time to reflect on the meaning of life and the power of love and forgiveness. Through the symbolism of Easter, we are reminded that no matter how dark things may seem, there is always hope in the power of resurrection and new beginnings.

Eastertide Services at St Michael's included a Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service with the reading of the Passion of Christ. Nearly 80 worshippers attended the Easter Day service on Sunday 5 April, a full house with even the reserve chairs off to the sidelines being used by some people. The Eucharist was celebrated by our locum, Fr David Houghton, including the lighting of the Paschal Candle. Everyone turned toward the baptismal font at the back of the church as Fr David walked back toward the sanctuary, sprinkling holy water from the font on the congregation with a well-soaked branch of rosemary. Refreshments were served in the garden afterwards. Many thanks to all who attended and especially to all those volunteers who gave their time and talents to make Easter Day 2026 at St Michael's a joyous celebration for all.
