MAY 2026 NEWSLETTER

Welcome to our monthly newsletter, which we hope will keep you informed of what's happening in our parish life, the community and also more widely.

We enjoyed a wonderful Easter Sunday (5th April) together as we celebrated the resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. That was not a one-off celebration, for as an 'Easter People', we continue to celebrate daily all that Jesus accomplished on the cross for each one of us. As a church we are still in the season of Easter (Eastertide) for 40 days after Easter till we reach Ascension Day on Thursday 14th May, at which time a special season in the life of the church begins. While our main Christian festivals, Christmas and Easter, have often been overtaken commercially, the nine days between Ascension Day and Pentecost belong solely to Christians.

The Novena (derived from the Latin novem or nine) is an ancient Christian tradition of devotional prayer consisting of private or public prayer for nine consecutive days. This practice mimics the nine days of prayer by the Apostles and Mary between Ascension and Pentecost. 'Thy Kingdom Come' (TKC) is once again taking place for these nine days. On TKC website we read:

Thy Kingdom Come is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. What started in 2016 as an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York to the Church of England has grown into an international and ecumenical call to prayer.

The theme for 2026 is 'God with us' and you can download the Novena booklet for this year which has daily readings and reflections. It has been compiled by our new Archbishop of Canterbury, Sarah Mullaly. I do encourage us all to pray specifically during this time for Christ's church around the world and of course particularly here in our own community and parish.

As we continue through the season of Eastertide we look forward to that glorious Feast of Pentecost, as we celebrate and recall the Holy Spirit poured out on those very first disciples of Christ. We herald it as the 'birth' of the Christian Church and for me personally it's my favourite church festival. It's the fulfilment of all the prophecies and Jesus' promise to his disciples:

16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever— 17 the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you.

(John 14.16-18)



TKC invites us to pray for others to come to know Christ and during this time frame I would like to ask for your prayers too, as we launch our all-age informal service 'Sunday@10' every 3rd Sunday of the month beginning on 17th May. This is a service where we hope to invite people of all ages; children, families, couples, singles, to come and explore faith together, whether they are seeking to know more about faith or have been Christians for a while. Who would you like to invite to join in?

On 10th May we also have our community May Fayre. Our church has always been involved as we are very much part of our Burghfield community. Please do offer help in whichever way you are able to- as a volunteer; providing baked goodies; helping out with our church tent children's activities; and other ways you can play your part- see other pages for more information.

May will be another busy month, but I hope a month where we will discover God in many places.

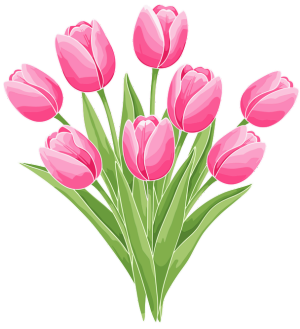

A massive Thank You goes out to our team of very handy men & women who worked together & removed the old drainage channel & installed a new concrete one in our car park.

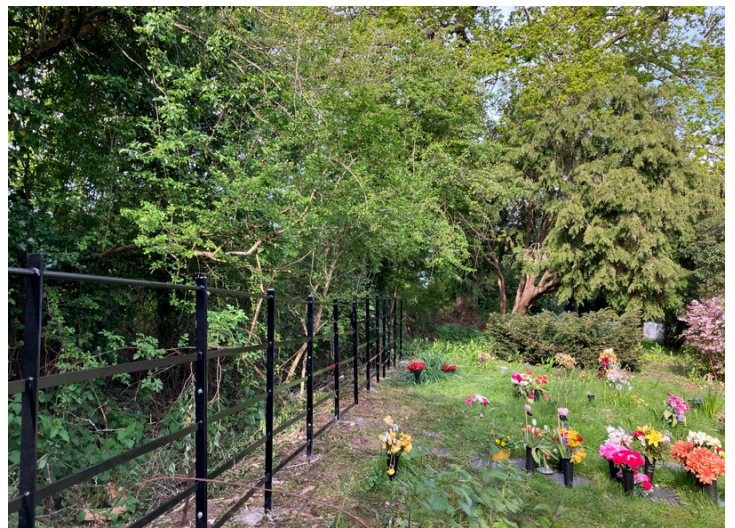
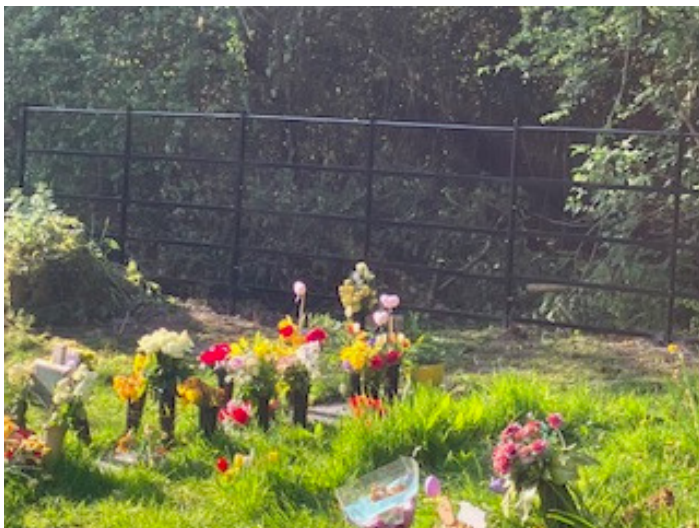


The team consisted of Colin, Iain, Don, Gill, Brian, Clive & Mike with Anne keeping us plied with much needed refreshments.

At our APCM I gave my usual vision for the future and thought it would be good to include that in our newsletter so everyone is aware of what I said, Please see below

Revd Glynn

- The Diocese of Oxford's visionis to become a more Christ-like church for the sake of God's world, characterized as contemplative, compassionate, and courageous. The strategy focuses on growing new congregations, fostering a "mixed ecology" of church, and prioritizing engagement with children, young people, and school
- This is certainly an area of mission and outreach we have been working on for the last several years, through our Bumps, Babies and Toddler group, Youth Club, Sunday@6, Crafty Church, and Film nights.
- Now as we are already 1/3 of the way through 2026, we have another exciting initiative as we join the 'Lighthouse' holiday club family, and look forward to offering Lighthouse Burghfield, a week long Christian holiday club in the summer. It has provided a wonderful opportunity to work ecumenically with our Christian brothers and sisters locally and also with other churches in Burghfield, Sulhamstead and Mortimer. Much has already been done and still more needs to be put in place. Please can I encourage you to pray for all involved in planning this outreach. For volunteers who will resource it; both adults and secondary age students; for children who will attend; for grant funding; and for everything to fall into place smoothly, that we may all be blessed as we serve Christ together and enable others to know of his love.
- We are also about to launch a monthly all age Sunday morning service, suitable for all ages from the youngest to the oldest. This will take place on the 3rd Sunday of the month and the first service takes place on 17th May at 10am and will be known as Sunday@10. There will be an earlier said communion service on the same Sunday each month.

· The life of a parish is not just about growth in faith, mission and outreach, as it includes pastoral care and maintenance as well. Our fund raising team have been doing an amazing job as they have raised so much money over the last several years. Our Fabric Team have faithfully been working in the background on the upkeep of our buildings and grounds as well as ensuring we are becoming more eco conscious. However, we do have a lot of rather expensive work to do, notwithstanding the diocese's challenge for a target of NetZero in the near future. This is a task not just for the few but for everyone to get involved in, as we identify projects, (several have already been identified through the Quinquennial Inspection) pray persistently for the processes, apply for grants, raise funds, and carry out the projects.

· We recently had a 'Rural Churches Conference day' with Bishop Mary and lay and clergy representatives from Newbury and Bradfield Deanery churches. It was an opportunity to speak honestly and openly about the joys, and concerns of rural ministry. Chief among the concerns, was maintenance of our aging buildings, the constraints of listed status, English heritage and the Victorian society, and the often prohibitive costs associated with these constraints. We felt heard and continue in hope and prayer that some of these concerns may be addressed.

· So I see this year as further consolidation as we continue to build on the various projects already undertaken, witnessing to the love of God as we discern how to meet the needs of those seeking faith in this day and age, and building our relationships with one another into ever stronger family bonds as Christ's family here in Burghfield.

· Two final thoughts. - We have been blessed through the ministry of Connor Heath over these last nearly 3 years, as he has been training for ministry through a mixed mode of academics based at Cuddesdon, Mondays to Wednesdays and working in our parish Thursdays to Sundays. Now he along with his wife Lois is about to embark on the next exciting part of his vocation, as he completes his training and comes to be ordained as a deacon on 4th July.

· This will mean a house move for Connor and Lois as Connor begins his curacy in the parish of Ascot Heath. There will be time to say our goodbyes at a special service at 10am on Sunday 7th June followed by a bring and share lunch, however as this is his last APCM with us, I wanted to acknowledge with grateful thanks, all that Connor has contributed to the life of our parish during his time with us and assure him and Lois of our prayers during this time of transition and for the future.

· Speaking of the future it is good to view and begin planning for a future longer than just a year ahead. The Church of England's retirement age is 68 and I will reach that landmark next April! Wayne and my current plans, are that I will retire at Pentecost in May 2027, which I have always found to be a very meaningful and special service.

· However, this was one of our other concerns from the Rural Churches conference with +Mary. There are more clergy retiring than there are those seeking a vocation to the ordained ministry and the shortage of clergy has been increasing in recent years.

· The implications for St Mary's are both challenging and optimistic. Some parishes are experiencing really long vacancies, for instance friends of ours up in Birkenhead are in a parish which has been in vacancy for 3 years now.

· Wayne and I along with many other clergy and licensed laity in the diocese, attended the annual renewal of vows and blessing of oils (the Chrism Service) on Maundy Thursday. It was +Stephen's last Maundy Thursday service before he retires imminently and his particular charge to us all, was to pray earnestly for vocations, for ordained ministry as well as for lay ministry such as licensed Lay Ministers or those authorised to preach like Alison and Don, and those authorised to lead worship. God's church needs both lay and ordained to continue in this age and I invite you too to pray earnestly for vocations for lay and ordained, for men and women who will be open to hearing God's invitation to follow where he leads.

· Added to this are the changes coming in Bradfield Deanery. Several parishes in the south of our deanery will have clergy retiring within the next couple of years. Wanting to be proactive our Area Dean Grant Fensome, has already begun a series of meetings to assess these parishes, to present options to the Diocese, rather than have changes imposed on the parishes. We are calling this the South Bradfield Deanery Review.

· Changes and the need to adapt are inevitable and it's so much better to be part of the process and involved in the planning. A meeting is soon to be scheduled for further discussion, so that clergy and lay representatives can participate in the process.

· St Mary's is in a strong position, since we are currently a single church benefice and through all your commitment and hard work, have managed to pay parish share and also engage in so much ministry, mission and outreach.

· Facing the reality is going to be really important for the future. Not to incite fear, but to be secure in the knowledge that it is Christ's church and provided we are listening to his guidance, discerning his will for the future will become clearer, as we trust in him and follow his direction. For St Mary's here, continuing to build a church family which shares the load, works, worships and prays together is a positive path to take. In the meantime, we still have just over a year together which I for one intend to live to the fullest and enjoy as much as possible continuing to trust in God as I do so.

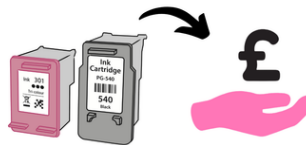
