Saint Anslem

c1033—1109

Born in Italy after a complicated testing of his vocation, he adopted the Benedictine Rule and now in France became the Abbot of Bec in Normandy. After the conquest Anslem was brought to England and in 1093 appointed Archbishop of Canterbury. His years at Canterbury saw two periods of exile though he was largely responsible for the Cathedral as we know it.. He was canonised in 1494.
