### **Musings**

On Saturday the town celebrated St George whose day is on 23<sup>rd</sup> April. St George was an early Christian martyr. He was a Roman soldier who became a member of the Praetorian Guard protecting the Emperor Diocletian. When Diocletian banned Christianity and began his persecution of Christians, George refused to deny his faith and was decapitated. When he was killed the Empress Alexandra, who was present, openly declared her faith and was herself martyred.

And the dragon? The first accounts of St George and the Dragon are from the 11<sup>th</sup> century. According to this account, when George arrived in Silene in Libya he found the town threatened by a dragon. For a while the inhabitants kept the dragon at bay by feeding it 2 sheep every day. Soon this was not enough and the dragon demanded human prey. The people of the town would choose who among them would be sacrificed. One day the king's daughter was selected. George saved her by slaying the dragon. The grateful king offered George a great treasure but George refused it saying it should instead be given to the poor. The people of the town were so amazed by this that they all became Christians.

St George is often portrayed as a Crusader knight riding a white horse and although this story of the dragon makes a good drama, the real story of St George is equally impressive. It is hard to believe that even today in the 21<sup>st</sup> century many Christians are still persecuted for their faith. We remember them in our prayers and pray that they will soon be able to worship freely.

What would we do if we were unable to worship freely? What risks would we take to still worship God? How willing are we to tell others about our faith when the worst that could happen is a bit of embarrassment?
