From The Rectory...

ASHFIELD NOTES

ST. MARY'S ORGAN FUND

The organ in St. Mary's Church is now due for some extensive updates and repairs totalling **£14,000**, a significant amount of money by any standards. However, an organ has become available at a church in Billericay, Essex, which is in good working order, but an organ which the church has no longer any use of.

After a site visit, it has been offered to St. Mary's, Ashfield, as a gift, which is incredibly generous and, after tests and inspection, would sit perfectly in your church, and is in good working order.

The organ will need to be dismantled, transported, and rebuilt, but at a cost of **£1,500**, a significant difference to the £14,000 needed to repair the existing organ.

But, as you will recognise, £1,500 is still a lot of money for a small church like St. Mary's to raise, so we are starting a fundraising campaign, raising money for the new organ to be installed here in Ashfield.

The 'St. Mary's Organ Fund' has been started, and so, if you are willing and able, any donations would be gratefully received towards the new organ, with payment being accepted in cash, cheque, direct transfer, or through the existing Church QR Code, all with a reference of 'Organ Fund' so that your contribution can be allocated specifically for its intention.

PARISH COUNCIL, HEDGE CUTTING

Now that the bird nesting season is over a reminder of the need to cut back your roadside hedges. All hedges that border a public highway should be no closer than 50cm [20"] to the road so as to provide pedestrian refuge and enable adequate visibility for access/egress and particularly on bends/corners forward visibility for approaching vehicles. Where this cannot be achieved especially in the vicinity of entrances the height of the hedge should be limited to 105cm [42"] so you can see over the hedge. At the present time there are several hedges locally that are overgrown causing road safety issues. In extreme circumstances Suffolk County Council can undertake remedial works and invoice the landowner, something best avoided. Your cooperation to maintain highway safety will be much appreciated. Thank you.

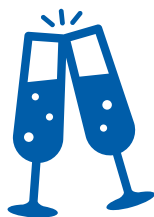

NEWS FROM CHARSFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL



We've had a busy term at Charfields and are all ready for a well-deserved summer holiday! Here is a snippet of what we've been up to during the summer term.

KS 2 pupils visited West Stow Anglo Saxon village to enhance their learning about the Anglo-Saxon invasion of Britain. This was an incredible opportunity for the children as they were able to handle artifacts, explore the buildings and museum, asking questions along the way. We then invited parents to join us for a share morning where the children were able to showcase what they had learned on the visit.

Pupils in Reception and KS 1 had an exciting time exploring not one but two local castles: Framlingham and Orford. This was part of their Castles topic learning all about the different features of a castle and what they were like to live in. The children had a fantastic time and even had time for an ice-cream in the sunshine!

Our sports day was a triumph! Pupils competed in team activities in the morning such as hockey dribble, ball bounce and basketball shooting. The pupils cheered their team-mates on and worked together to encourage each other to do their best. In the afternoon we invited parents and families to join us for traditional races such as running races, egg and spoon and obstacle race. We were delighted to have so many parents cheering the children on. It was lovely atmosphere and the pupils shone!



Pupils in KS 2 have been growing potatoes this term, which involved the responsibility of watering and caring for them to ensure we had a bumper crop! The pupils then made flavoured potato wedges and did a taste test of everyone's culinary efforts. The smells coming from the kitchen were amazing and the pupils enjoyed tasting them!

Pupils in Year 5 and 6 were given the opportunity to attend Hilltop in Norfolk on a residential visit with other schools from our Trust. Pupils took part in different activities such as Air Jump, Tree Top Trail, and caving. They had a wonderful time and enjoyed getting to know pupils from other schools – great for making friendships for our Year 6 pupils going to high school!

This year we have been working with the Suffolk Wildlife Trust in Wilder Schools sessions. Over the year we have made bug hotels, bird boxes, bird feeders and most recently hedgehog domes. It is our hope that our school grounds become a haven for wildlife that the children can explore and enjoy during their time with us. We love learning outside and are very lucky to have such wonderful grounds. In addition to this we are lucky to be able to offer every child throughout the school an opportunity to take part in Forest school sessions on our school grounds. We will be working with the Wildlife Trust next year and look forward to developing the outside areas further.

Earlier this term, it was lovely to be able to take all our pupils to Thomas Mills High School for an athletics competition where the children competed against other schools in various activities. The children really enjoyed themselves and we came back with some spectacular results!

Pupils in KS 2 performed Little Red Riding Hood and the Wolf to families and friends. The pupils worked hard to learn their lines and their singing and acting was amazing! The audiences loved the performances, and the pupils really did shine.



One of the advantages of being a smaller school means that our younger pupils get to experience things that they might only experience in Year 6 in a larger school. By the time our pupils get to year 6, they are seasoned performers!

We are excited to be hosting Little City again in the Autumn term: Monday October 5th and Friday 20th November. Our youngest pupils will attend a session in the morning, but we also offer a FREE

session on both days 10:45 – 11:45am to the public. We are happy to show any potential parents around the school following these sessions – please ask the school office.

Our Home, Our Energy, Our Future



We've felt a series of dramatic price shocks to our energy supplies recently. Wars in Ukraine and Iran have disrupted oil and gas supplies, and our electricity bills – even for green electricity – have shot up as well.

The wind and sun didn't get more expensive. It's because electricity prices are legally linked to wholesale gas prices – which seems crazy when we have wind and sun here in Suffolk. So couldn't we make use of them without covering the countryside in massive solar farms?

It turns out that it might well be possible. We could have a village-led project to generate the electricity Charsfield needs, now and into the future – locally, fairly, and on our own terms.

Charsfield Community Energy is a project set up by Charsfield Parish Council to investigate local, community-owned electricity generation for the village.

Why this project exists

Rising energy costs and a changing climate have prompted villages across the UK to ask the same question: could we generate our own power, rather than simply consuming what's supplied to us at prices set by the big energy companies? Charsfield Parish Council established this project to find out whether that's realistic here – and if so, how to do it in a way that fits the village, rather than imposing a one-size-fits-all solution.

Our approach

We're not interested in a single giant solar farm covering agricultural land. Instead, we're exploring a mix of smaller-scale technologies – ground-mounted solar, agri-voltaic systems that allow farming and energy generation on the same land, and wind – to find a viable combination that's right-sized for Charsfield and respectful of how the land is currently used.

Feasibility

We have secured government grant funding to run a feasibility study, which is currently establishing our electricity demands for the foreseeable future so that we can plan accordingly.

Your energy use

Our consultants, Locogen [Consulting] Ltd, are keen to hear about Charsfield's current energy use and have published a short questionnaire that you can complete. Your information will be held securely and will not be released other than as anonymous "big picture" information about the village as a whole.

This information matters: if they can gather data from every household in the village, they'll be able to build a reliable picture of current and future energy demand – which will help inform how much electricity we need to generate to meet our needs today and into the future.

Singing is seriously good for you.....!

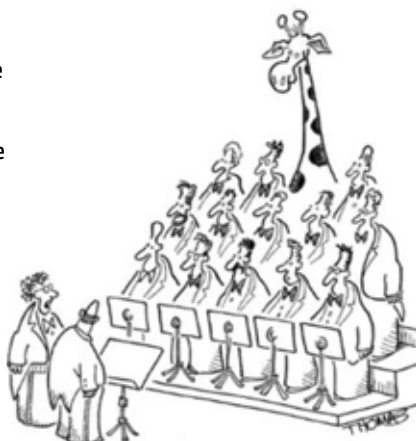
Did you know that singing with others, in a choir for example, can lead to a greater level of psychological wellbeing? And, that singing in a group can produce measurable benefits such as improving heart rate and blood pressure? It has even been found to boost immune function. And it's fun!

The Mid-Loes Choir has been singing at the monthly Benefice services for 2 years now, with an expanding repertoire of traditional church anthems, psalms and chants (Google 'These are they which follow the lamb' by John Goss – one example of what we have sung on a Sunday). We also bolster the congregational singing of hymns, adding a bit of extra volume to the service.

We would love to welcome some new voices (all ages!) to the choir across the full vocal range – base to soprano – so if you used to sing at school (or still do in fact), or just like to sing along to what is on the radio, come and have a go.
