Thoughts from the Vicarage

At the time of writing, I, like many of you, have been watching the news over recent days and the reports on the wildfires occurring across Europe and closer to home in the UK. I can hardly imagine how frightening and dangerous it must be for those affected, being forced to leave homes and possessions behind, sometimes with very little warning, or for the firefighters risking their lives to bring the fires under control. It is a significant reminder of the challenges posed by our changing climate and its impact on so many lives.



Each year, from 1 September to 4 October, Christians around the world mark the Season of Creation: a time of prayer and action, supported ecumenically by church and charitable organisations. During this time, we celebrate God as Creator and recognise Creation as God's continuing work. We are called to share in that work by loving and caring for all that has been made. Our well-being is deeply connected with the well-being of the Earth.

This year's theme, "Living Water", explores the Old Testament verses from Ezekiel 47:9 and 12 as a powerful biblical vision of hope and ecological healing. Set amid exile and loss, the image of living water flowing from God's sanctuary reveals healing that renews land, water, biodiversity and human responsibility towards the whole of creation.

To celebrate this season, Kelsall Churches will hold a weekend Festival of Creation from 25 to 27 September. It will be a time of thanksgiving for our Harvest and an opportunity to focus on the created world and how we care for it.

Highlights include:

- *events and activities for all the family in our church buildings and across the community, including two special films on the climate and nature crises in our communities;*
- *a Harvest Thanksgiving service and lunch at St Philip's on Sunday 27 September at 10.30am, with guest preacher Revd Jill Elston, Chester Diocese Environment Adviser;*

- *Harvest contributions to the West Cheshire Foodbank will be welcomed at both churches during this time.*
- *on the final Sunday of the Season of Creation, 4 October, there will also be a service at Kelsall Methodist Church at 10.30am, with a special focus on climate change and the changes we can make to help care for our planet.*

Please do come along. Further details, including times of events and venues, are on page 10-12. There will also be posters around the village and on social media from the end of August.

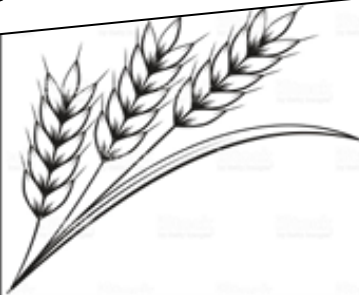

FLICKS IN THE STICKS

On Friday evening, 25th September Flicks in the Sticks will be showing the film entitled **The People's Emergency Briefing** – billed as 'an eye-opening 50 -minute film, presented by Chris Packham, bringing together nine leading UK scientists and experts with the latest evidence on what is happening with the climate and nature, and why it matters for things like extreme weather, food security, health and the cost of living.' Starting at 7.30, in the Methodist Hall, there will be a short break after the film for drinks and biscuits, followed by a general discussion session about the film. We hope to have a number of guests to help facilitate this discussion, especially from the local area, including Charlotte Harris, the CEO of Cheshire Wildlife Trust.

This should be an interesting, disturbing, and thought-provoking session. We expect it to be popular and, as space is limited, please reserve a place in advance, either on 01829-752931 or email admin@thecorletts.uk. There will be no charge to watch this film, but there will be an opportunity to make a donation to Cheshire Wildlife Trust.

On Saturday evening, 26th September, Flicks in the Sticks will show the acclaimed 2025 documentary film **Ocean, with David Attenborough**. This film explores the Earth's underwater habitats, the greatest age of marine discovery, and the opportunities for unprecedented ocean recovery. Directed by Toby Nowlan, Keith Scholey, and Colin Butfield.

The 95-minute film serves as both a beautiful celebration of the world's most spectacular underwater ecosystems and a brutal wake-up call regarding the destructive impacts of commercial fishing and environmental damage. Despite the challenges, Attenborough's ultimate message is one of optimism, highlighting that marine life can bounce back to thrive if given the chance.

Walking Group News

The St. Philips Walking Group had one of the flattest walks ever in June! We explored the "Marches Mosses", which are a fascinating area of lowland raised peatbog that straddle the border between Shropshire and Wales. The Mosses were almost destroyed through commercial peat extraction, but are now a National Nature Reserve and are an outstanding example of nature recovery in action. The work done to regenerate healthy peat on the Mosses has led to a dramatic recovery in the ecosystem and helps in the fight against climate change.

Unfortunately, the July walk was cancelled because of the heat!!

Walks are usually between 5 and 8 miles, over a variety of terrain. The next walk will be on August 15th around the Lymm Dam and the Bridgewater Canal, and September 19th from Marbury, near Whitchurch. We normally meet at Kelsall Community Centre at 09:30. OUR INVOLVEMENT WITH IOC, INITIATIVES OF CHANGE: FIRST PART— *by Alan Sensicle*

A brief history

The lofC convictions emerged at the beginning of the 20th century in the thoughts of Dr Frank Buchman, an American Lutheran minister firstly via what was known as the ‘Oxford Group’. He had a spiritual experience in Keswick to release himself from bitterness in relationships against folks who had previously hurt him, giving him a new sense of freedom. This convinced him that personal change is a way to remake the world with global change by changing human motives, and character. lofC grew out of this Oxford Group starting in Universities and became for them a way of life, building on natural goodness in everyone.

lofC considers the need to achieve this change through a search for inner wisdom in your heart, these insights many understand as God given guidance or for non-believers your conscience. The challenge of lofC is to seek God’s will above all else, starting with yourself. Buchman emphasised the importance of faith, believing that God has a purpose for people’s lives and mankind as a whole. lofC feel that a daily time of silence and reflection can help access renewal, inspiration, and personal action. The four pillars of the movement became absolute honesty, absolute purity, absolute unselfishness and love, with thoughts measured against these principles. In practical terms, the place to start this renewal is with ourselves ,with God’s help.

People who follow this philosophy can come from different faiths, as equal partners in a vision. This does not prejudice one’s own roots, in fact strengthens them, but tries to build a unity of action through common goals. As such it has become a worldwide movement drawing from diverse cultures and backgrounds, who are committed by changing themselves to transform society. One could say the lofC’s goal was to create a just , peaceful and sustainable world through mutual actions stemming from personal change.

As European nations re-arm for war in 1938 Dr Buchman called for a moral and spiritual re-armament too. Therefore, following World War 2 a programme of spiritual reconstruction began to foster change. Through the generosity and hard work of many Swiss citizens the group purchased a then run down hotel in Caux, Switzerland to turn it into a quality international conference centre. At a time that many resented Germans, he invited some German influencers to Caux, and this grew year on year to foster German/French post war reconciliation. Similarly, followed reconciliation of Japan with its South East Asia neighbours and independence without bloodshed in Africa.

Locally, Tirley Garth near Utkinton, became an IofC centre from 1940. The house was built in 1907 into ownership of Brunner Mond, and leased to Richard Prestwich. After his death, his daughter Irene, a member of IofC, invited IofC to move there to shelter from the war. When the war came to an end, Irene bought the

house from ICI and presented it to IofC in perpetuity under the Tirley Garth Trust, as a British home and conference and seminar centre. It supported a lot of local industrial meetings with unions to resolve relationships and find new understandings and co-operation, and community meetings following the growing cultural and race diversity. After the fall of the Berlin wall, it hosted training courses to help young people from east and west Europe. This is really how we became involved in the 1990s as several of the unpaid volunteer staff became part of the congregation at St Philips. We were invited to some community gatherings and Christmas events and became interested in their background and philosophy. Lin helped with their magazine send outs, and took her Counselling trainees there for a

few weekends. I helped at regular open days. They showed a lot of kindness and openness to us. They kindly offered the grounds for a few Kelsall Millennium fund raising celebrations and held the regular Utkinton fetes.

It came with some sadness to us, and I think others, when the Trustees decided in 2002 that Tirley was surplus to lofC needs and the grade 2 listed house and its 39 acres was sold to Mersey Television as a training, planning and conference centre. Its beneficial work continued through the sale proceeds to Tirley Garth Trust for which in 2007 I volunteered as its Treasurer, to support its objectives through National and International actions.

As a consequence, we attended the annual Caux Conference some 5 times between 2006 and 2012 to share the wider aspects of lofC (such as its projects) which the Tirley Garth Trust had opened up, and I will say more of this, the inner voice concept, and the involvement with the centres in India and Australia in 2016 next time

Mission Partnership News

As I write this the world's attention is on the World Cup in the USA, Canada and Mexico and, as it happens, Open Doors have shared news of a community leader and pastor named



Juan Manuel*that they support in an area of Mexico called the Circle of Silence. This area is dominated by violent cartels that seek to recruit vulnerable young children and teenagers into their gangs leading to lives damaged by criminality, drugs and violence. Here it is almost impossible to speak about Jesus as the gangs see church activities as a threat to their influence.

Juan Manuel coaches the kids at football and uses the connections that brings to talk to them about Jesus and the Gospel and in doing so has led many to trust and hope in God which has resulted in changes in behaviour and helped them turn away from the gangs.

However, as you can imagine, the cartels are not happy with his success and he faces threats of violence, particularly following recent crackdowns by the government, and he and his family had to go into hiding. Nevertheless Juan Manuel is determined to continue to spread the gospel in his community, particularly to young people. He says that, "We have decided that sharing the Word is more important. Despite the risks, we trust God above our fears."

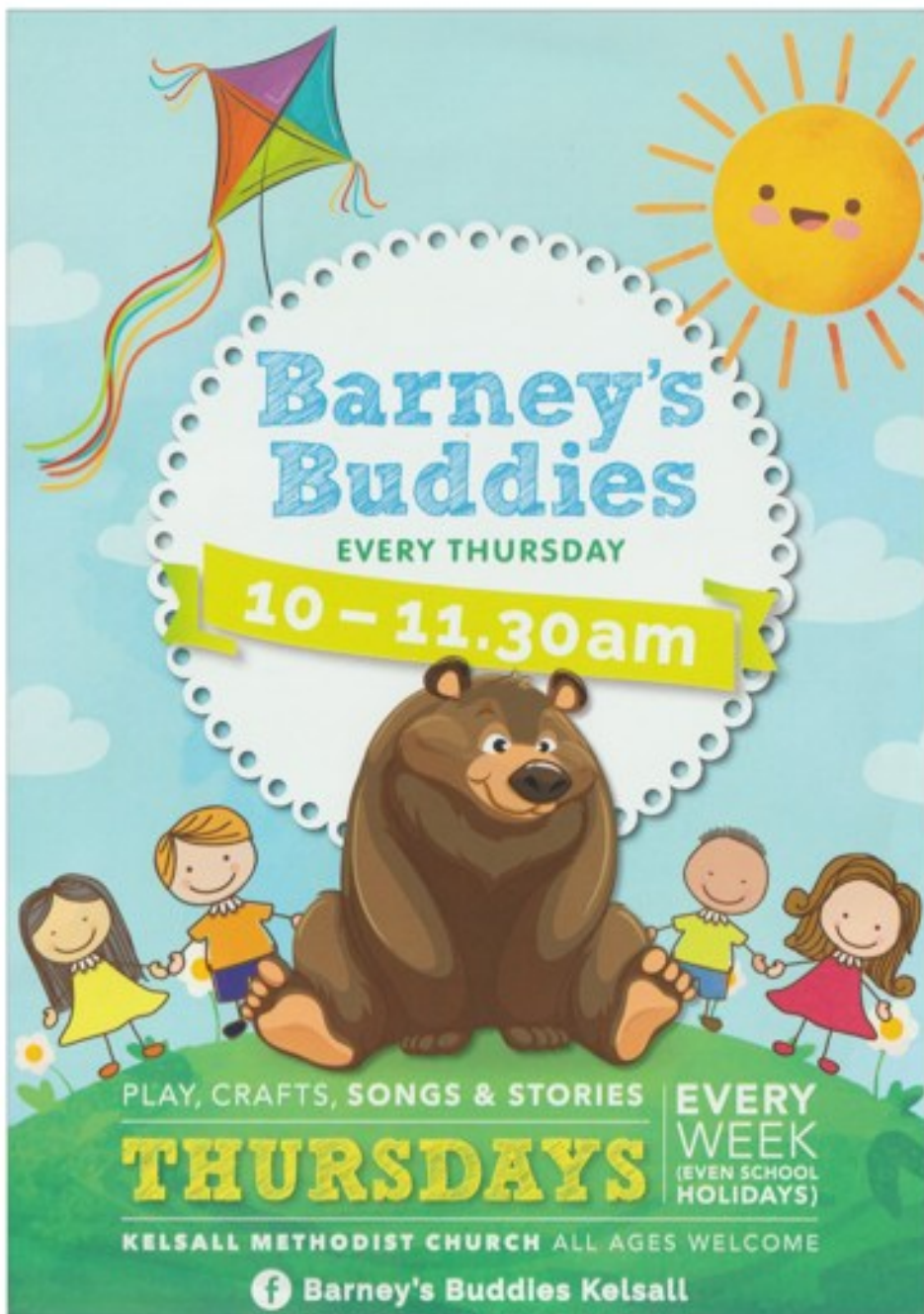

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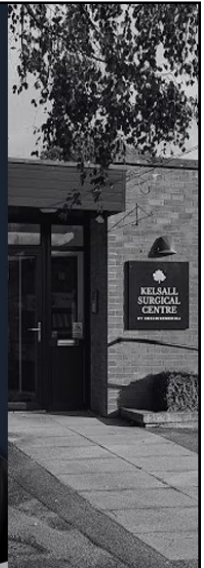
