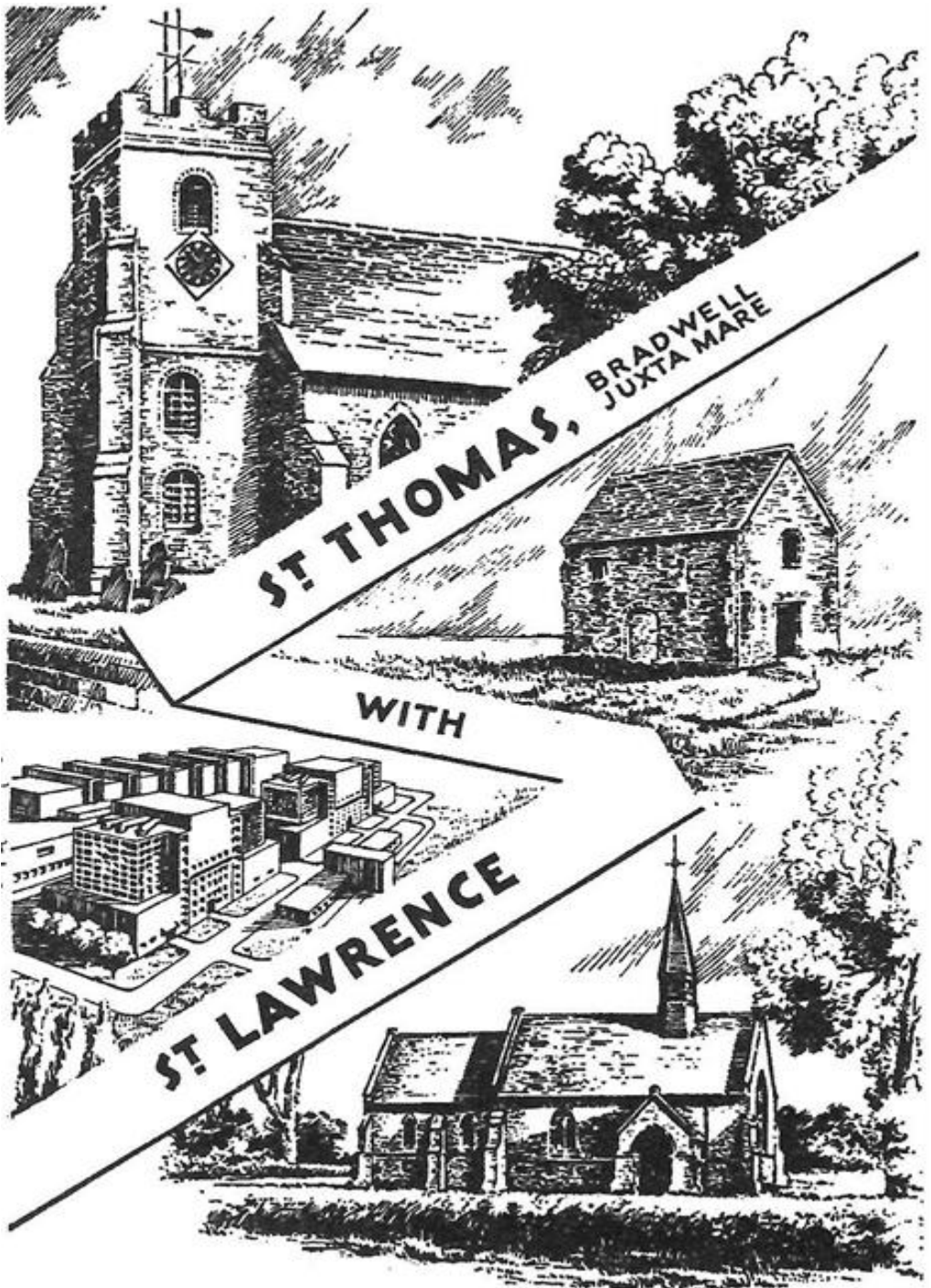

We are taking a holiday in the first two weeks in September, so we will not be around at this time.

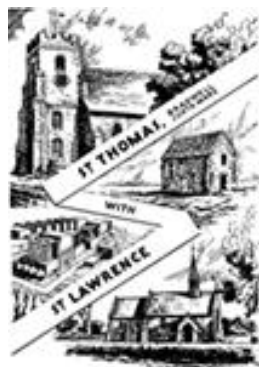

News from RAF Bradwell Bay

Help us to be part of the community of Bradwell on Sea

Continuing our look at the memorial. The memorial has had various myths built up, which detracts from the designer's original intention. The most prominent myth being that it is a crashed Mosquito. It is in fact a generic aeroplane representing all aircraft of all nationalities the flew in WW2. This gives an equality in death to all aircrew. The aircraft did not fall off its plinth. It is designed to represent a cross with its tailplane against the sky. It is a unique monument that Bradwell on Sea should be proud of.

Research into the names on the memorial is raising so many stories, this is ongoing. The first flight from RAF Bradwell Bay took place on 16th April 1942 at 21.54. This was an intruder raid to Gilze-Rijen in the Netherlands. The Crew were P/O Stabb, Sgt Riches and Sgt Taylor. The mission was successful in that the aircraft returned to base safely.

The first aircraft lost from Bradwell Bay was only 2 weeks later when at 0008 on 28th April 1942, Boston III Havoc Z2240 took off from Bradwell Bay on an intruder mission to patrol GILZE-RIJEN- EINDHOVEN but failed to return. The aircraft had been brought down at Nordsdang, Holland. The crew were:

Pilot F/O John Watts ASKWITH. Age 24

Observer, P/O Norman Wilson MAPES. Age 32

Air Gunner SGT. Gordon James HARDY Age 24

F/O Askwith and Sgt Hardy were both killed. P/O Mapes was severely injured and survived to be taken prisoner. He remained disabled for the rest of his life.

Most of the crew of the first flight from RAF Bradwell Bay did not survive for long.

00.32 P/O Stabb and his crew set off from RAF Bradwell Bay with orders to patrol Soesterberg. Records at TNA indicate that they reached their target but were shot down by anti-aircraft fire. They did not return.

F/O Robert Douglas Taylor, who was part of the first operation from RAF Bradwell Bay survived his time at Bradwell, but was killed 19th June 1944 aged 23, almost 2 weeks after the Normandy invasion.

The Othona Community



It was 1946. The war was over, and RAF Chaplain Norman Motley, as recorded in his book "Othona, Much Ado About Something," was seeking a place for peace, "to allow ourselves to be led into the future in the will of God. We wanted a place available to women as well as men and that must therefore include children. Contemporary expression of community had to include all comers."

"Prods and coincidences" led him to Bradwell, where "we walked to the chapel....By coincidence that very day the area had been de-mined and the approach was safe and open for the first time in several years.At the moment I entered the building. I knew that we were home. There are times when one knows..." Norman then had the challenges of getting permission from the Bishop of Chelmsford to use the chapel for the community's residence, and "finding some place where a mixed group of people could spend residential periods with us." That first summer brought together a "very mixed bag" of men and women of different ages and backgrounds, vitally including those whose nations had just ceased fighting one another: Germans English, French and Russian. The pattern of the day was built around Work, Worship, Study and Play together - and it still is today.

This summer Othona celebrates our 80th anniversary. For a community to have survived for 80 years is a major achievement. It deserves to be remembered, recorded, celebrated, and then for us to look to the future of how it may continue and develop. After the Bradwell Flower Show on 1st August, where people from Othona are bound to follow tradition and put in some entries, the 3rd August sees the start of a fortnight of reflections, celebrations and a look to Othona's future. There are a host of familiar and new faces leading, speaking, making music with us and sharing the wonders of that special peaceful place first identified for our Community by Norman Motley. He would surely be happy to see the care and development of the natural environment surrounding the buildings and camping field where, still, a vibrant and diverse body of people meet not only in the summer, but as a year-round presence "to allow us to be led into the future by the will of God." All are welcome from near and far.

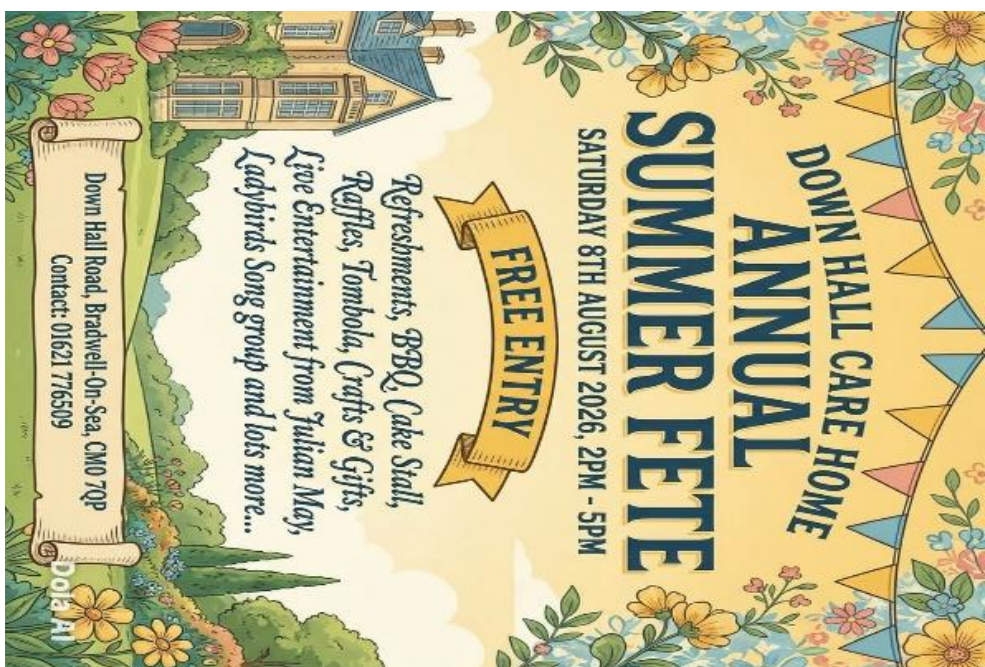
