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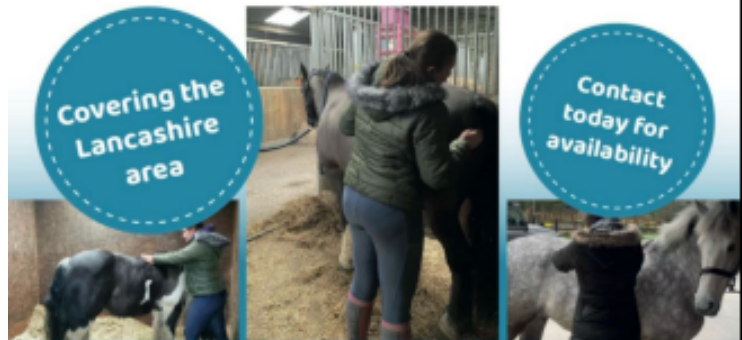
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APPLES OF GOLD

Dear Friends,

Over the course of the summer I managed to get some reading done.

I ended up reading a recent novel by an Italian author. It made for an interesting read, though I wouldn't necessarily recommend it!

The main characters, a young couple called Anna and Tom, hail from a southern European city but have made their home in the grimy, hipster-cool, in-vogue, artisan and wonderfully creative city of Berlin.

They are, on one level, living the dream. Cool city, great apartment with wonderful interior design, flexible jobs, great social lives.

They've got their aesthetic, their style and so much of their lives is curated to perfection. And yet... could it be that paradise isn't quite all it was expected to be?

And off the novel goes.

Where the novel goes isn't what I'm particularly interested in so much as its premise. What struck me was the way it explores ambition, dreams, possibilities, risk and reality and the nagging sense that even when we get the life we think we want, it may not deliver quite what we expected.

It got me thinking about how, wherever we live, whatever we fill our homes and diaries with, wherever and whatever we eat, ultimately none of it is guaranteed to give us greater meaning. And, perhaps more frustratingly, all of it will in some way inevitably bring with it disappointment.

Unsurprisingly, this led me to think about where purpose and meaning might actually be found. Even more unsurprisingly, these questions led me to contemplate Jesus.

And that is one of the questions faith invites us to ask: where might we encounter meaning and purpose for our lives?

Perhaps for you, that might be living in an arty part of Berlin. Perhaps it might be something entirely different.

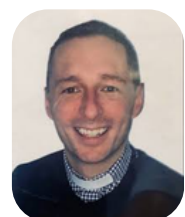
So, whatever your dreams and ambitions might be, keep asking questions and most importantly, keep asking where Jesus might fit into the picture.

And actually, that's what church is meant to be about: making space to ask questions, explore what matters and discover what faith might have to say to our lives. This month, as part of our Diocese's Centenary celebrations, we'll be marking the occasion with a Mission Weekend, including our Fun Day on Saturday 12th September, 12-3pm, and Songs of Praise on Sunday 13th September at 10.30am (see p.8 for details). We'd love you to come along and join us.

I'd also encourage you to have a look at our Prayer Group, which meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 7.00pm, and our Study Group, which meets on the third Thursday at 7.00pm. Both offer relaxed spaces to explore faith, ask questions and discover more about following Jesus. If you've ever wondered about faith, Jesus, or what any of this might mean for your own life, you'd be very welcome.

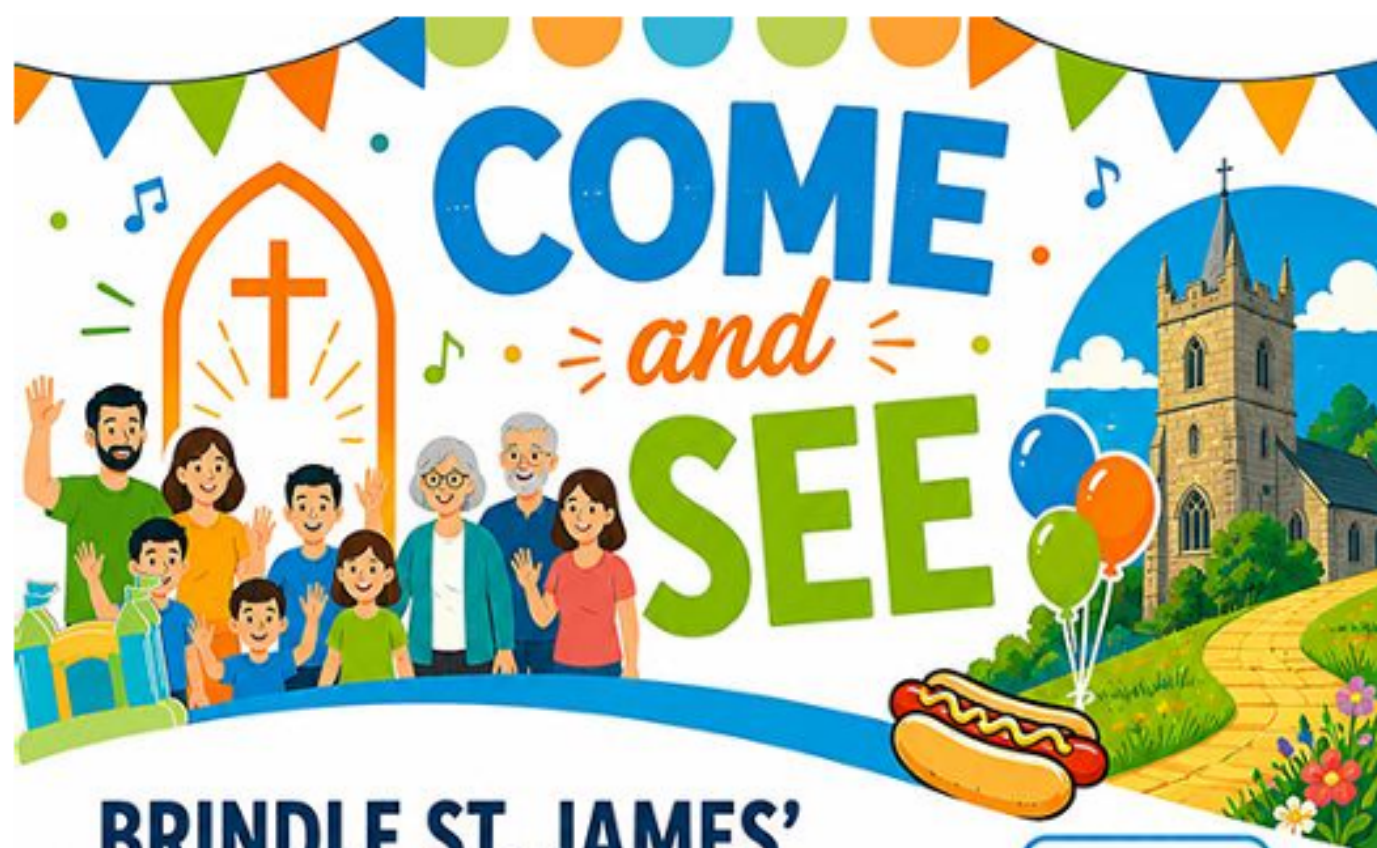

BRINDLE VILLAGE COMMUNITY HALL

At our recent committee meetings it has been brought to our attention about the amount of dog fouling that is happening on the field at the Community Hall .

We have had concerns raised that people are letting their dogs foul on the field and not picking it up . This can result it an unsafe area for people to use especially for children. We do have a bin next to the hall that is for dog waste and it is there for anyone to use. It is a public offence not to pick up dog waste and this can result in a fine issued to the offenders . The hall does have working CCTV on all sides that is monitored and we are using this to keep an eye on the situation.

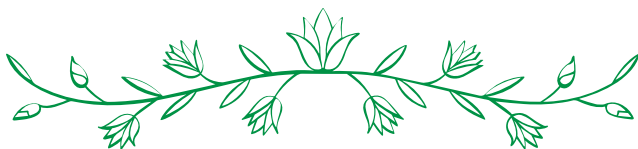
