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Baptism and Faith

The testimony of Jonathan Cass

who was baptised in the river in Low Bradfield on 12th July.

Background

I was born and brought up in Cardiff, my parents and I were regular church goers to our local Methodist church. Whilst I was never baptised and for a long time I did not go to church I have always felt there is a mystery and sense of purpose in my life. It was when I married Rachel at St Nicholas' 13 years ago I felt a sense of the numinous in this place, its beauty and being part of God's plan.

To me faith has never been easy or straightforward, but what has struck a chord for me is the speech of Sir Thomas More in "Man for all Seasons":

"God made the angels to show Him splendour, as He made animals for innocence and plants for their simplicity. But man He made to serve Him wittily in the tangle of his mind."

River baptism

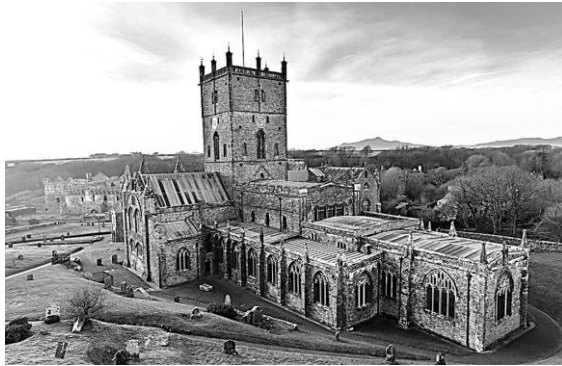
Being from Wales with its ancient churches and standing stones I was struck with living in a place where the Christian message and mission first took root and flourished in the British Isles. The first of the Christian martyrs, Julian and Aaron had their shrine just down the road from Cardiff at Caerleon and outside our school gates was the green mound from which the early saints, Isan and Edeyrn preached, and next too it was the pool of fresh water where they baptised.

It is in honour of that tradition and step of faith and mission that we are to use the flowing waters and seek God's blessing

Service and love

It is also from that same tradition and time that I feel the calling of faith through the sayings of St David: "Be Joyful, keep the faith and do the small things you have heard and seen me do".

To me the message is clear, to serve and be joyful in service, and that no act of service is too small to show love of God and your fellow man.

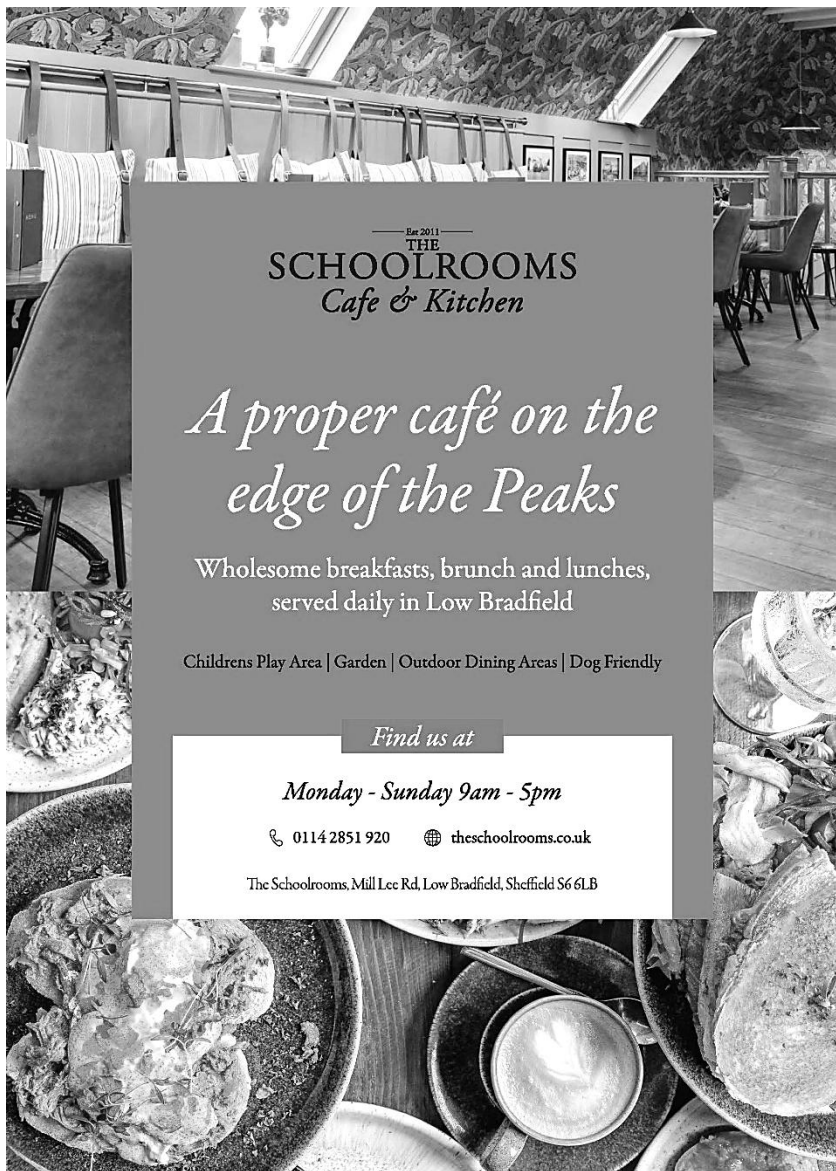

We shared lunch together, kindly organised by Josie which was a great social opportunity.

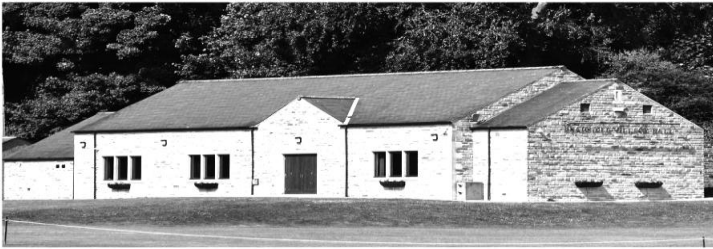
For those who were unable to attend, we will be organising another session in the autumn, so look out for details.

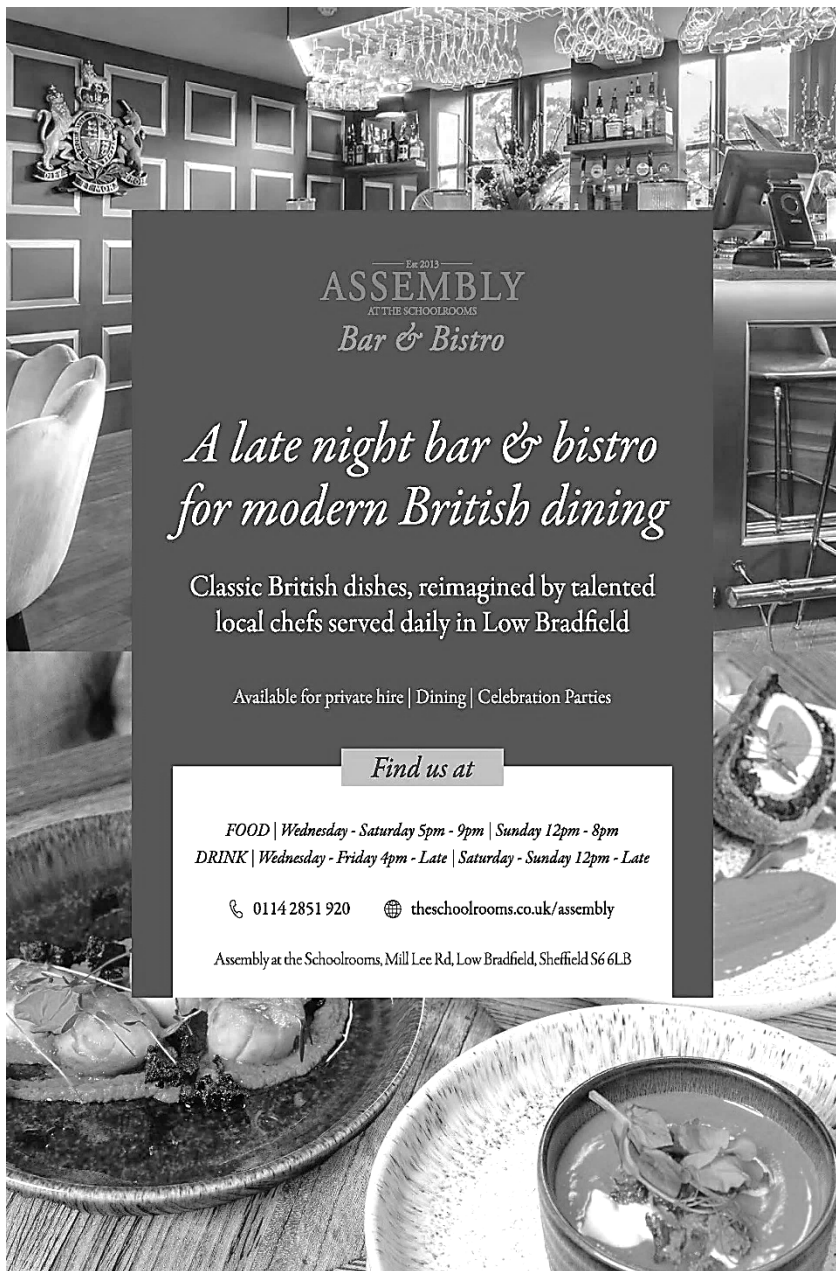

MOTHERS UNION 100 years Celebration

Bradfield in 1926 was a quiet, rural community defined by rolling moorland, farms and three dams. The General Strike

caused poverty and living conditions were harsh. St Nicholas Church was the historic focal point of the village, and it was where the significant happening was the founding of the branch of the Mothers' Union.

A hundred years later we continue to have a flourishing branch, meeting on the same day of the week as it was 100 years ago. How amazing is that?

This was certainly something worth celebrating so we began by praying for guidance which we certainly needed for such a big event. We decided to incorporate our Celebration with Ecclesfield Deanery Festival and Mothers' Union 150th Anniversary. We felt that advertising our special event was important, so banners were ordered and duly posted on the Church gate and on the Old Horns wall. We also had tote bags printed with our MU logo and our branch details to be handed out to all who attended. Our wish was to include all facets of Bradfield, so invitations were either hand delivered or emailed to residents and local organisations. Churches in Chapeltown, Ecclesfield, Grenoside, High Green, Oughtibridge, Stannington & Wadsley were invited. When replies came in we were able to organise the catering, including paper plates, cups, glasses and prosecco for 80 people.

Rev Will organised the service of Holy Communion with our help, our Diocesan Chaplain Father Richard Parker preached followed by Jo-Anne Van Levesley our Diocesan President who read out a personal letter to our branch from Kathleen Snow

our Worldwide President. Reading and Prayers were done by MU members.

It was such a special occasion with Ethel and the help of her flower ladies decorating the Church so beautifully and making a special arrangement for members no longer with us. There was also a display of old photographs which aroused much interest.

Our sincere thanks we give to the feoffees who generously gave us a considerable donation towards our significant celebration. What a help that was.

It was certainly a service of Thanksgiving and Hope for the future of Mothers Union here in the coming years.
