Musings

It is not often that we celebrate saints who are family members. We know of some brothers, such as St Chad and St Cedd, St Peter and St Andrew and some who are brother and sister, such as St Benedict and St Scholastica, but this week we remember a mother and son. On 28th August we remember St Augustine and the previous day, the 27th, we remember his mother St Monica. They lived in the 4th century and St Augustine became one of the foremost Christian theologians. He had studied pagan religions and Greek philosophers as he developed his theological thinking and he influences Christian thought to this day. It was not always like this, however, as a young man, Augustine was wayward, taking his pleasures wherever he pleased and rejecting the teachings of Jesus. But his mother never gave up on him. She prayed for him constantly and followed him from place trying to persuade him to change his ways. Eventually she succeeded. Augustine listened to God. He was baptised and later ordained as a priest in 391. The rest, as they say, is history.

I expect some of us, like Monica, pray for family members or friends who do not yet know Jesus. At times it can feel as if our prayers fall on deaf ears. The years pass and nothing seems to change. It must have sometimes felt that way to St Monica, as she despaired over her wayward son, but she persevered and her faithfulness was rewarded. With God nothing is impossible and he always listens to our prayers, but his ways are sometimes hard for us to fathom. But Jesus tells us to keep knocking on the door. Our prayers will be answered, we don't know how or when.
