An act of **Spiritual Communion** is offered, for anyone unable to attend the Eucharist and receive Holy Communion.

A page is included before each service to add the names of those people or situations you wish to bring to God - a list at each means we can pray for the same, and different situations each time we worship without forgetting anyone or anything - and don't worry, if we forget, God doesn't!

As our prayer deepens, all of us find our own rhythm of prayer and praise - there is no right or wrong way! We are invited to speak quietly and prayerfully, and if in company, to ensure our voice blends with and does not overpower others. It is customary to pause in the psalms and canticles at the • for a breath, as we allow scripture to envelop us.

You may find it helpful to safely light a candle, sit in front of a cross, icon or helpful picture, or play some suitable music, or to sit in a particular chair - experiment with what works for you!

Morning Prayer each Tuesday at 9am at St John's follows the service as set out in this booklet - you may like to pray at this time, knowing ourselves joined in prayer.

Psalmody

You may wish to say one of the psalms below, or chose another psalm. In the Lord have I taken refuge; ♦ how then can you say to me, 'Flee like a bird to the hills,

'For see how the wicked bend the bow and fit their arrows to the string, ♦ to shoot from the shadows at the true of heart.

The Lord is in his holy temple; ♦ the Lord's throne is in heaven.

His eyes behold, ♦ his eyelids try every mortal being.

The Lord tries the righteous as well as the wicked, ♦ but those who delight in violence his soul abhors.

Upon the wicked he shall rain coals of fire and burning sulphur; ◆ scorching wind shall be their portion to drink.

For the Lord is righteous; he loves righteous deeds, ♦ and those who are upright shall behold his face.

Monday

'Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling-places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I am going.' Thomas said to him, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?' Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

Thursday

You are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God.

Friday

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer.

Romans 19.9-12

Saturday

He said to his disciples, 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat, or about your body, what you will wear. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? If then you are not able to do so small a thing as that, why do you worry about the rest? Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you—

you of little faith! And do not keep striving for what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and do not keep worrying. For it is the nations of the world that strive after all these things, and your Father knows that you need them. Instead, strive for his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well.

Psalmody

You may wish to say the psalm given below, or chose another psalm. Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High ♦ and abides under the shadow of the Almighty,

Shall say to the Lord, 'My refuge and my stronghold, ♦ my God, in whom I put my trust.'

For he shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler ◆ and from the deadly pestilence.

He shall cover you with his wings and you shall be safe under his feathers; ♦ his faithfulness shall be your shield and buckler.

You shall not be afraid of any terror by night, ♦ nor of the arrow that flies by day;

Of the pestilence that stalks in darkness, ♦ nor of the sickness that destroys at noonday.

Though a thousand fall at your side and ten thousand at your right hand, ♦ yet it shall not come near you.

Your eyes have only to behold ♦ to see the reward of the wicked.

Because you have made the Lord your refuge ♦ and the Most High your stronghold,

There shall no evil happen to you, ♦ neither shall any plague come near your tent.

For he shall give his angels charge over you, ♦ to keep you in all your ways.

They shall bear you in their hands, ♦ lest you dash your foot against a stone.

You shall tread upon the lion and adder; ♦ the young lion and the serpent you shall trample underfoot.

O Holy Spirit, giver of light and life, impart to us thoughts better than our own thoughts, and prayers better than our own prayers, and powers better than our own powers, that we may spend and be spent in the ways of love and goodness, after the perfect image of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

O God, our sovereign and our shepherd, who brought again your Son Jesus Christ from the valley of death, comfort us with your protecting presence and your angels of goodness and love, that we also may come home and dwell with him in your house for ever. **Amen.**

O Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, set your passion, cross and death between your judgement and our souls, now and in the hour of our death. Grant mercy and grace to the living, rest to the departed, to your Church peace and concord and to us sinners forgiveness, and everlasting life and glory; for, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, you are alive and reign, God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Almighty God, you see that we have no power of ourselves to help ourselves: keep us both outwardly in our bodies, and inwardly in our souls; that we may be defended from all adversities which may happen to the body, and from all evil thoughts which may assault and hurt the soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Loving Lord, we thank you for your love so freely given to us all. We pray for families around the world. Bless the work of the *Mothers' Union* as we seek to share your love through the encouragement, strengthening and support of marriage and family life. Empowered by your Spirit, may we be united in prayer and worship, and in love and service reach out as your hands across the world. In Jesus' name. **Amen.**

Remember, Lord, what you have wrought in us and not what we deserve, and as you have called us to your service make us worthy of our calling through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Sovereign God, the defence of those who trust in you and the strength of those who suffer: look with mercy on our affliction and deliver us through our mighty Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Lord God, whose Son, Jesus Christ, understood people's fear and pain before they spoke of them, we pray for those in hospital or sick at home; surround the frightened with your tenderness; give strength to those in pain; hold the weak in your arms of love, and give hope and patience to those who are recovering; we ask this through the same Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen.**

O Lord our God, grant us grace to desire you with our whole heart; that so desiring, we may seek and find you; and so finding, may love you; and so loving, may hate those sins from which you have delivered us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

God be in my head, and in my understanding; God be in my eyes, and in my looking; God be in my mouth, and in my speaking; God be in my heart, and in my thinking; God be at mine end, and at my departing. **Amen.**

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the silent hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world, may rest upon your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Abide with us, Lord, for it is evening, and day is drawing to a close. Abide with us and with your whole Church, in the evening of the day, in the evening of life, in the evening of the world; abide with us and with all your faithful ones, O Lord, in time and in eternity. **Amen.**

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who at this evening hour lay in the tomb and so hallowed the grave to be a bed of hope for all who put their trust in you: give us such sorrow for our sins, which were the cause of your passion, that when our bodies lie in the dust, our souls may live with you forever. **Amen.**
