MINISTERIAL LETTER FROM COLTON

Dear friends,

November is a time for remembering. Beginning with All Saints and All Souls, and continuing through the events of Remembrance Sunday, this season gives time and space in which we both remember with gratitude and reflect on loss and sacrifice.

One of my favourite books is 'Sleeping with Bread' by Dennis, Shelia and Matthew Linn. It describes the Christian practice of the examen which, though part of Ignatian spirituality, can be practiced by people of all faiths and none. It is a way of remembering that enables us to embrace what brings us life with gratitude, whilst at the same time recognising those parts of life which are challenging.

An examen is simple. We pause to ask two simple questions of the day. For what event or moment in my day am I most grateful? For what event or moment in my day am I least grateful? We might then like to think about what was said or done in those moments that made them so special or difficult. We can do this on our own, in our families or in groups. Some people like to write the answers down to keep a record. Over time it is often possible to see a pattern in our memories of those things which always bring us joy and those things which we routinely find difficult. Emerging patterns can help us adjust our lives. Those who believe in God can then take both the good and the difficult to God in prayer.

There is a benefit to practicing this way of remembering on a daily basis but it can also be done at specific times of the year. In this season, when we recollect so much, we might look back on the sacrifices of war and ask ourselves what we are most grateful for as well as the more difficult question about what challenges us. Personally, we recall individual losses. These could be loved ones who have died, but might be other types of loss: income, employment, failing health for ourselves or others, or the clubs and societies that enrich our lives. An examen of this sort celebrates the good alongside a recognition of the pain of loss.

Thanksgiving for all that is good encourages us to remember that even in difficult times we can find joy. St. Paul writing from his final imprisonment was able to exhort others to, 'Rejoice in the Lord always and again I will

say rejoice!' (Philippians 4:4). Grieving is also normal and acknowledging is important. One third of the psalms in the Bible are laments which direct grief, anger and pain to God. As someone recently said such lament is a 'deeply faithful act' because it trusts that God has hold of us even in the most difficult of times.

As we pause to remember this year, perhaps we can hold in balance our blessings and losses, acknowledging both. May we celebrate the one and lament the other whilst trusting God for them all.

THOUGHTS FROM THE CHURCHYARD

War-graves in a vast cemetery may fill the visitor with a sense of despair for humanity. The scale of the loss is so great that grief for the individual unless you have a personal link - seems out of the question, and then you notice the inscription of some date or battle or regiment and the lost serviceman or woman becomes more real to your mind.

A single war-grave in a country churchyard can awaken sympathy for the dead and for those whom that person left behind. At Abbots Bromley, with its war-grave of Private C.T. Preedy, one of three of the family recorded on the War Memorial, you can imagine the magnitude of their loss and hear from their relatives how the poor man came to die in hospital and so be buried here, in his home place.

Long ago, we found a British war-grave in a tiny corner of the Famine Graveyard that lies south of the road between Waterford and Cork. The place is a terrible reminder of national and political failures, a resting-place for thousands whose names are not recorded. The war-grave is the resting-place of a serviceman whose body was recovered from the Atlantic. All were at last given due honour when Pope John Paul II held a great Mass there during his visit to Ireland.

In the overgrown churchyard at Cantley, I had no expectation of finding a memorial to anyone I had known. Then, I caught sight of a war-grave and at once became interested. The name was:

Captain ERNEST ROBERT BROWNE, RNR, DSC Skipper, HMS CROMONA, died 7th April 1919

He seems to have been in his mid-thirties and now he was back in his home place which, as the crow flies, is about ten miles from Yarmouth Roads. Was he a victim of Spanish 'flu, or had fighting continued in some benighted spot after the Armistice? His family details are easy to find. His war-service would be better interpreted if Tom Wheeldon were writing this, for his decoration was awarded for "Service in Action with Enemy Submarines" off the Belgian coast (Gazetted 18th June 1918.) He was the Skipper of a Drifter and he seems to have attacked an enemy submarine and lived to tell the tale.

If you have read thus far you will, like me, be able to add new names on Remembrance Day to those already in your thoughts.

We will remember Them.
