A Service for Ash Wednesday

Before entering the worship place the ministers light a fire and burn last year's palm crosses saying:

As a sign of our desire to put away our sin, we gather here to burn these palms from last year's celebration of Palm Sunday.

Living God,

in their life these palms drew life from the earth and gave it to the animals they hosted and sheltered; in the worship offered by our communities they helped us offer festive joy:

Grant now, O God, that these palms, reduced to ashes, may be for us a sign of your power to purify our hearts.

May we recognize your love at work in us, replanting our lives in the sure and humble soil of your truth and grace.
Through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, now and forever.

Amen.

On entry a minister says

O God, make speed to save us *All* **O Lord, make haste to help us.**

Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear to my cry *All* **Hold not your peace at my tears.**

The officiant welcomes the people.

Friends, welcome to our service for Ash Wednesday which is lead jointly by colleagues from the Longford 8 and South Dales Benefices. It is good to see the beginnings of new life around us; snowdrops and crocuses in the gardens, and the fields beginning to fill with new-born lambs. There are, also, signs that point towards a new life emerging from the pandemic; although still high, rates of new Covid 19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths are declining. The efficient roll out of vaccines points towards a slow end to the current lockdown. All around are indications of better things to come.

Since early days Christians have celebrated Lent as a time of penitence and fasting. The deep purple tones of the Lenten season, with its themes of repentance, abstinence and humility, might seem to be the last thing we need right now. But, essentially, Lent is about light - lightening our load and re-prioritizing our lives. Lent is about being real. The words we hear as we begin the season of Lent might easily be taken as a signal of the bleak landscape that awaits us: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." But recognizing our humble beginnings, the dust from which we come, we also hold on to the promise of the glory to which we move – which are both part of our human experience and God's plan for our renewal. Friends, I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy and hopeful Lent.

Seek the Lord and live, or he will sweep through the tribes of Joseph like a fire; it will devour them, and Bethel will have no one to quench it. There are those who turn justice into bitterness and cast righteousness to the ground.

He who made the Pleiades and Orion, who turns midnight into dawn and darkens day into night, who calls for the waters of the sea and pours them out over the face of the land—the Lord is his name.

With a blinding flash he destroys the stronghold and brings the fortified city to ruin.

There are those who hate the one who upholds justice in court and detest the one who tells the truth.

You levy a straw tax on the poor and impose a tax on their grain.

Therefore, though you have built stone mansions, you will not live in them; though you have planted lush vineyards, you will not drink their wine.

For I know how many are your offences and how great your sins.

There are those who oppress the innocent and take bribes and deprive the poor of justice in the courts.

Therefore the prudent keep quiet in such times, for the times are evil.

Seek good, not evil,

that you may live.

Then the Lord God Almighty will be with you, just as you say he is.

Hate evil, love good;

maintain justice in the courts.

Perhaps the Lord God will have mercy

We are sorry and ashamed, and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past; and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light. Amen.

The officiant says God's words of forgiveness

May the Father forgive us by the death of his Son and strengthen us to live in the power of the Spirit all our days.

Amen

In penitence and faith let us make our prayer to the Father and ask for his mercy and grace.

For your holy people, that they may triumph over evil and grow in grace, we pray to you, O Lord:

All Lord, have mercy.

For candidates for baptism and confirmation, that they may live by every word that proceeds from your mouth,

we pray to you, O Lord:

All Lord, have mercy.

For the leaders of the nations, that you will guide them in the ways of mercy and truth,

we pray to you, O Lord: *All* **Lord, have mercy.**

For the needy, that they may not be forgotten, nor the hope of the poor be taken away, we pray to you, O Lord: All Lord, have mercy.

For the sick in body, mind and spirit, that they may know your power to heal, we pray to you, O Lord:

All Lord, have mercy.

For the poor in spirit, that they may inherit the kingdom of heaven and see you face to face, we pray to you, O Lord:

All Lord, have mercy.

Let us commend the world, for which Christ suffered, to the mercy and protection of God,

God our Father,
the strength of all who put their trust in you,
mercifully accept our prayers;
and because, in our weakness,
we can do nothing good without you,
grant us the help of your grace,
that in keeping your commandments
we may please you, both in will and deed;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
