NOTICE IS GIVEN that we are applying to the Consistory Court of the diocese for permission to carry out the following:

We wish to install security lighting and security cameras on the exterior of the church building.

The proposal is to have a camera and a light on each of the four main walls. These will cover the main entrance, the side entrance, the east wall and the churchyard. The work will also involve installing a monitor on a wall in the vestry inside the building.

Holes will need to be drilled at certain points and cables laid. The cables will be of a dark colour and will be laid in such a way as to be almost invisible to the naked eye. Cables will be laid inside the church building along where heating pipes are currently situated, and on the exterior walls following the line of the guttering where possible.

so that your letter reaches the registrar not later than 17/07/2021. A letter of objection must include your name and address and state whether you live in the parish and/or your name is entered on the church electoral roll of the parish or any other basis on which you have an interest in the matter.

Directions to petitioner

You must display this public notice (or a copy of it) for a continuous period of not less than 28 days, not counting the day on which it was put up or the day on which it is taken down, (or for such other period as the Court may direct and subject to any special directions of the registrar) in each of the following places:

1. on a notice board or in some other prominent position inside the church; and
2. on a notice board outside the church or in some other prominent position (whether on the outside of the church door or elsewhere) so that it can be read by the public.
