The Priest pronounces absolution.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Old Testament Reading 2 Chronicles 24.20–24

A reading from the second book of Chronicles.

The spirit of God took possession of Zechariah son of the priest Jehoiada; he stood above the people and said to them, 'Thus says God: Why do you transgress the commandments of the Lord, so that you cannot prosper? Because you have forsaken the Lord, he has also forsaken you.'

But they conspired against him, and by command of the king they stoned him to death in the court of the house of the Lord. King Joash did not remember the kindness that Jehoiada, Zechariah's father, had shown him, but killed his son. As he was dying, he said, 'May the Lord see and avenge!' At the end of the year the army of Aram came up against Joash. They came to Judah and Jerusalem, and destroyed all the officials of the people from among them, and sent all the booty they took to the king of Damascus. Although the army of Aram had come with few men, the Lord delivered into their hand a very great army, because they had abandoned the Lord, the God of their ancestors. Thus they executed judgement on Joash.

Reader: This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

New Testament Reading Acts 7.51–60

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Stephen said to the high priest and the council: 'You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you are for ever opposing the Holy Spirit, just as your ancestors used to do. Which of the prophets did your ancestors not persecute? They killed those who foretold the coming of the Righteous One, and now you have become his betrayers and murderers. You are the ones that received the law as ordained by angels, and yet you have not kept it.'

When they heard these things, they became enraged and ground their teeth at Stephen. Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 'Look,' he said, 'I see the heavens opened

and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God!' But they covered their ears, and with a loud shout all rushed together against him. Then they dragged him out of the city and began to stone him; and the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul.

While they were stoning Stephen, he prayed, 'Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.'
Then he knelt down and cried out in a loud voice, 'Lord, do not hold this sin against them.' When he had said this, he died.

Brother will betray brother to death, and a father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put

to death; and you will be hated by all because of my name. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.'

SERMON

THE LITURGY OF BAPTISM

The candidate for baptism, his parents and godparents come to the front of the church.

The priest addresses the whole congregation:

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome Ethan and uphold him in his new life in Christ?

All: With the help of God, we will.

The priest addresses the parents and godparents:

Parents and godparents, the Church receives Ethan with joy. Today we are trusting God for his growth in faith.

Will you pray for him, draw him by your example into the community of faith and walk with him in the way of Christ?

Parents and Godparents: With the help of God, we will.

In baptism Ethan begins begin his journey in faith. You speak for him today. Will you care for him, and help him to take his place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

Parents and Godparents: With the help of God, we will.

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Priest: Do you turn to Christ?

Parents and Godparents: I turn to Christ.

Priest: Do you repent of your sins?

Parents and Godparents: I repent of my sins.

Priest: Do you renounce evil?

Parents and Godparents: I renounce evil.

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidate with the Oil of Catechumens.

Priest: Christ claims you for his own.

> Receive the sign of his cross. Do not be ashamed to confess the

faith of Christ crucified.

Fight valiantly as a disciple of All:

Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

Priest: May almighty God deliver you

from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and

obedience of Christ. Amen.

The priest, candidate, parents and godparents make their way to the font.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

Praise God who made heaven Priest:

and earth,

All: Who keeps his promise for ever.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord

our God.

All: It is right to give thanks

and praise.

The Priest blesses the water of the font

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

The Priest addresses the whole congregation

Priest: Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess with this candidate the faith

of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God

the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and

earth.

Priest: Do you believe and trust in his Son

Jesus Christ?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only

Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge

the living and the dead.

Priest: Do you believe and trust in the

Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the

holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life overlasting. Amon

life everlasting. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

The priest pours water three times over the head of the candidate, saying:

Jidenna Ethan, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. The priest anoints the newly baptised with the Oil of Chrism.

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. Amen.

COMMISSION

The baptism party return to the front of the Church. The priest says to the newly baptised:

Ethan, today God had touched you with his love and given you a place among his people. God promises to be with you in joy and in sorrow, to be your guide in life, and to bring you safely to heaven.

In baptism God invites you on a life- long journey. Together with all God's people you must explore the way of Jesus and grow in friendship with God, in love for his people, and in serving others.

With us you will listen to the word of God and receive the gifts of God.

WELCOME

Priest: There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism; by one Spirit we are all

baptised into one body.

All: We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; We are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

THE GIVING OF A LIGHTED CANDLE

The priest gives Ethan a candle lit from the Paschal Candle, as a sign of the light of Christ.

Priest:

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light. You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life.

All: Shine as a light in the world to

the glory of God the Father.

PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

These responses may be used:

Reader: Lord, in your mercy.

All: Hear our prayer.

(or)

Reader: Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, graciously hear us.

THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

THE PEACE

Priest: The peace of the Lord be

always with you.

All: And also with you.

Hymn (Complete Anglican Hymns 267)

Hark! the sound of holy voices, chanting at the crystal sea:
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, Lord, to thee:
multitude, which none can number, like the stars in glory stands, clothed in white apparel, holding palms of vict'ry in their hands.

Patriarch and holy prophet, who prepared the way of Christ, king, apostle, saint, confessor, martyr and evangelist, saintly maiden, godly matron, widows who have watched in prayer, joined in holy concert, singing to the Lord of all, are there.

They have come from tribulation, and have washed their robes in blood, washed them in the blood of Jesus; tried they were, and firm they stood; gladly, Lord, with thee they suffered; gladly, Lord, with thee they died, and by death to life immortal they were born and glorified.

all his holy Church.

Prayer over the Offerings

At the end:

All: Amen

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Priest: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Priest: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord

our God

All: It is right to give thanks and

praise.

The Priest praises God for his mighty acts and all respond:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Eucharistic prayer continues. Then:

Priest: Great is the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen,

Christ will come again.

The prayer continues. At the end: Priest: ... for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Priest: Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us.

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

THE BREAKING OF BREAD

Priest: We break the bread of life, and that

life is the light of the world.

All: God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us to light and life.

Agnus Dei

Invitation to Holy Communion

Priest: Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. (John 1:29)
Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb (Rev. 19:9)

All: Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word, and I shall be healed.

Communion Antiphon –

As they were stoning Stephen, he called out, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.

All baptised Christians who normally receive Holy Communion in their own church are welcome to do so here. Holy Communion is given in one kind (the consecrated Bread only).
