Humby enjoyed Christmas celebrations with our annual carol service followed by a most enjoyable village social kindly hosted by Tess and Paddy Buckley. On Christmas Day a large congregation, including a number of visitors, marked Christ's birth in the traditional manner with the service led by Colin McGarrigle followed by festive mulled wine on the chapel green.

Sadly, this was Colin's final chapel service as he and Erica, having sold Corner House Farm, left the village in early February. Just before they left, nearly all the village gathered on the village green to say a surprise farewell to them both. They were presented with a framed photograph of Humby chapel on which was written the following, which sums up the wonderful contribution they made to both the chapel and our social life by hosting so many village gatherings:

"To Colin and Erica. As a token of our appreciation for your kindness, generosity and tremendous contribution to the life of our village since 2003. Presented by your friends and neighbours in Great and Little Humby. January 2022".

We know that Colin will be greatly missed across our villages as for many years he has led many services in all our churches.

We have also lost two long-time residents: Richard Pert who died last year and John Todd just a few days ago. They both, for many years, were a real part of village life: may they rest in peace.

However, life continues to evolve with, over recent months, a number of new residents moving into Humby. We warmly welcome them and hope they enjoy the tranquillity and sociability which has always been a feature of Humby life.

We are now planning ahead and looking to how we can maintain and enhance our village as well as our special little chapel. Hopefully we will also be marking our Queen's Platinum Jubilee in the village during the special holiday in June with suitable celebrations!

SAPPERTON

Despite only being February, Spring is already in the air at Sapperton with the fruits of our Autumn planting beginning to appear in the rear churchyard.

We recently installed a new gate which links this part of the churchyard with fields beyond allowing easier access to the public footpath that runs through our grounds and then onward towards Braceby and the Short Hollow track. This footpath is frequently used by ramblers as evidenced by our visitors' book.

The rear church grounds will be further enhanced by a lovely memorial bench in memory Janet Saunders which will be placed in position and dedicated on Easter Saturday at a benefice Evensong with the choir at 3pm. Please tell anyone you have contact with who knew Janet about this service as all will be welcome.

We do see St Nicholas as central to the life of our small village so we do try to focus on our mission to serve all the community. A recent example being a local family using the church for a quiz on Boxing Day. Additionally, we are carrying out feasibility work to have a broadband dish permanently installed on top of our tower, which will be mainly out of sight, to bring additional internet speed to the village and with the added benefit of Wi-Fi in the church.

The community of Sapperton is very fond of its church and grounds so we try to maintain the building and fabric as far as we can. Recently some gravestones have been made safe and one grave stone cross inadvertently broken (by none other than the Churchwarden!!) has been skilfully repaired.

We welcome everyone of all ages to our services and events irrespective of being a Sapperton resident or not. Rest assured you will be warmly received.
