All are welcome. This year's service has been prepared by Christian women of England, Wales, and Northern Ireland and takes as it s theme Jeremiah 29:11 – *"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope."*

From your Parish Priest

Give yourself a medal! No really! Each of the churches in our Benefice has received a Bronze Award from the Eco Church initiative, run by the global Christian environmental charity *A Rocha*. This award recognises the many ways in which each of our churches seek to care for the environment and foster a healthier, gentler, and better-informed pattern of life in the world we honour as God's creation. The award also



points the way towards developing even better practices and undertaking new commitments: next in our sights is the 'Silver' award, which will require us to think hard about improving our environmental care, and placing sustainable living on our agenda in worship, teaching, the maintenance of our buildings, and our engagement with our local communities. Underpinning all of our efforts is our faith that God's creation is purposed for good through full and flourishing life. Central to the human vocation is the Christ-like stewardship and care by which all the world may indeed be 'filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord', as the Prophet Habakkuk proclaims. Seeing and perceiving the love of God in all creation is of course at the heart of the Church's observance of Lent, a time of penitence and reflection which prepares us to behold afresh the glory of God in the radiant dawn of Easter. 'Open my eyes, O Lord, that I may behold wondrous things of your law', says Psalm 119, encouraging us to adopt that posture of patient attention through which God's love may be encountered and adored in all things, especially in what we have learned to ignore, neglect, or take for granted. The sacraments of which we partake in Church equip us to recognise that 'grace is everywhere' (as said the Curé d'Ambricourt); through them we are awakened to what St Paul called 'the mystery of God' (1 Cor. 2.1), by which a new life is brought to birth within us. But what did St Paul really mean by this word, 'mystery'? And what does that suggest for Christian life today? That will be the subject of our Deanery Lent Course, *The Meaning of the Mystery*, which will take the form of four sessions, each repeated three times around the Deanery, along with a recorded version online. St Benet's Abbey is an iconic place in the local landscape, much loved by locals and tourists alike. Cared for by Norfolk Archaeological Trust, a small Norfolk heritage charity, the site is free to be enjoyed by all. The charity not only manages the precious ruins, but also maintains the site including pathways and interpretation to help people make the most of their visit. The charity is supported by a small but

All takings from the ticket sales will be donated to "*End Polio Now*"

as permission has been granted by the film's distributors for this screening.

"Breathe", a very moving, romantic and sympathetic story, stars Andrew Garfield, Claire Foy, Tom Hollander, Steve Mangan and Hugh Bonneville. It tells the true story of polio victim Robin Cavendish condemned to a life in a hospital bed with months to live who together with his wife Diana moves out of hospital and finds a way to live a near normal life against all the odds helped by Diana's twin brothers and their inventive friend Teddy.

Polio is a virus that sometimes causes paralysis and death. Rotary started this project in 1985 to eradicate polio worldwide and together with the WHO, UNESCO, many governments and latterly the Gates Foundation eliminated its presence from all but 2 countries – Pakistan and Afghanistan. Although close to total eradication, fundraising is still needed in the fight against this terrible disease. The Gates Foundation *trebles* everything that Rotary raises for Polio.

King Cnut (Canute) and St Benet's Abbey



Cnut, born in 994, was a Dane who started his life being trained in the art of combat as a Viking warrior and a Pagan with his father Sweyn Forkbeard who attacked East Anglia several times. In 1013/14 they attacked Norwich and Thetford before turning to Lincoln, taking hostages as they went. After defeating the Saxon King, Ethelred, Sweyn Forkbeard proclaimed himself king of England, though was never crowned as such. Within six weeks Sweyn Forkbeard died suddenly in Gainsborough. According to legend, he had made demands for unfair taxes on the people who lived on St Edmund's lands. St Edmund's shrine at Bedricsworth (now known as Bury St Edmunds) was very

significant and attracted a lot of pilgrims. The people prayed to St Edmund to release them from tax burden. These prayers appeared to be answered when, early one morning, after a feast at Gainsborough in Lincolnshire, Sweyn cried out in agony – "I am struck by St Edmund", immediately dying. His sudden death by "the saint's spear" when his tax demands were refused, brought increasing respect for St Edmunds's powers. St Edmund was England's first Patron Saint until the 14th Century, when he was replaced by St George.

The young Cnut, as an inexperienced military commander, returned to Denmark for a few years after his father's death, but returned to the UK in 1016 with a large army and proceeded to seize large parts of the country. Cnut, by now a Christian, fought in several conflicts against King Edmund a Saxon ending in a final battle at Ashington in Essex on Oct 18 1016. There was a great loss of life on both sides and a truce was declared with an agreement to divide the country into two parts until one of them died. Edmund dies only a few weeks later, on 30th November 1016 and Cnut became King of all England, reigning from 1016 to his death in November 1035.

Records show that King Cnut founded St Benet's Abbey around 1019 by providing the holy men, living at Cowholme (the site of St Benet's Abbey), with the parishes of Horning, Neatishead and Ludham. This, along with other endowments from the King's wealthy friends &relatives, enabled the abbey to be established &flourish. There is a story, passed down through history, that King Cnut was visiting his royal estate near Horning, when he was told of the holy man, Wolfric, and his friends at Cowholm, and that they had been speaking slander against the King. Cnut travelled to meet them in disguise, dressed as a peasant, to see and hear for himself. Wolfric recognised who he was and welcomed him as his King, and with great respect.

Cnut saw this as a sign from God and realised that Wolfric had been wronged. He decided that the site should become a Benedictine Abbey with Wolfric as the first abbot. One year after founding St Benet's Abbey, Cnut ordered that 12 monks from St Benet's Abbey, as well as several from Ely, and half the moveable furniture, books and other items be taken to Bedricsworth to found a Benedictine Abbey at the shrine of St Edmund. It is said that he did this to atone for his father's sin against St Edmund. It is interesting to note that St Benet's Abbey's history is linked so closely to that of Bury St Edmunds yet one went on to thrive as a busy market town and the other is now a few stones by the River Bure.

To help me understand, a meeting was suggested as both Adam (Editor) and I are both relatively new to our roles, also at the meeting were Barbara (previous Editor) and Christine (previous treasurer and now Church Warden), then at subsequent meetings David (Rector) and Trish who manages the distribution. Between us all, it was most refreshing and encouraging to see enthusiasm to improve the HR for our community.
