The Peace

The celebrant introduces the Peace with a suitable sentence.

Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you. Look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and grant us the peace and unity of your kingdom where you live for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We share the peace with those immediately around us, a sign that expresses peace, communion, and love.

during which the celebrant takes the host and breaks it over the paten, placing a small piece in the chalice.

The celebrant recalls the Last Supper, and one of the following acclamations is used:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

Dying you destroyed our death, rising you restored our life.

Lord Jesus, come in glory.

(or)

Christ is the bread of life:
When we eat this bread
and drink this cup,

Lord, by your cross and resurrection, you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the World.

The Prayer continues and leads into the doxology, to which all respond boldly,
