IF YOU ARE ENGAGED AND WANT TO BE MARRIED, THEN CONGRATULATIONS!

Being married in church is special – in coming to church you are asking God to be involved in your marriage. You are warmly invited to contact us about your plans for a Wedding Service in our church.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Couples are eligible to be married in the Parish if one or both parties meet one of the following requirements:

- Bride or groom was baptised or confirmed in the Parish
- Bride, groom, or parent has at any time resided in the Parish for at least 6 months
- Bride, groom, or parent has at any time habitually attended public worship in the Parish for at least 6 months
- A parent or grandparent was married in the Parish
- If you are not eligible through one of the above, we still may
 be able to help you. You can, by attending church regularly,
 establish a qualifying connection. For more information,

DOCUMENTS YOU WILL NEED

- All couples will need to show the vicar their passport as proof of nationality. If you don't have a passport, there are other documents which would be acceptable.
- You may also be asked to provide evidence of your connection to the church, such as utility bills which show you live or have lived in the parish, or your parents' marriage certificate if they were married there, for example.

YOUR FIRST STEPS

Please complete the <u>Wedding Welcome Form</u> and return it to our vicar, Rev Petra Elsmore. Once we receive your enquiry form, we will contact you and arrange to meet in person. It will be necessary to meet several times in preparation for your wedding day and during those meetings, we will discuss the following:

- What it means to get married in church, the Christian significance of marriage, and the benefits of God's blessing on your special day.
- Planning your Wedding service, putting order of service together, talking about readings, hymns and music.
- Confirming any additional information concerning flower arrangements, photography and any other plans for your ceremony.

THE BANNS OF MARRIAGE

The Banns are a legal requirement enabling you to be married in church. They will be read in the church in which you are to marry. You are not required to be present when your Banns are read but most couples come at least once. If one, or both of you, currently lives outside the Parish you will also need to arrange for Banns to be read in your parish of residence and obtain a Banns certificate from the local vicar. Without this certificate your marriage cannot take place

MARRIAGE DOCUMENT

The Marriage Document is the preliminary document prepared by the clergy for couples to sign on the wedding day at the point in the service when they would have signed the Marriage Register. Since 4th May 2021 the Marriage Document replaces the signing of the Register. Clergy are required to ensure the Marriage Document goes to the local register office – usually this will be by post.

MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE

The couple needs to contact the local register office or the General Register Office directly to purchase a Marriage Certificate. The registration by the register office will be made by

the 7th day after the Marriage Document is received at the register office. A certificate will be available after this time, though local arrangements.
