forth, when there were no springs
abounding with water.
- 25 Before the mountains had been shaped,
before the hills, I was brought forth—
- 26 when he had not yet made earth and fields,
or the world's first bits of soil.
- 27 When he established the heavens, I was
there, when he drew a circle on the face of
the deep,
- 28 when he made firm the skies above, when
he established the fountains of the deep,
- 29 when he assigned to the sea its limit,
so that the waters might not transgress
his command, when he marked out the
foundations of the earth,
- 30 then I was beside him, like a master worker;
and I was daily his delight,
rejoicing before him always,
- 31 rejoicing in his inhabited world
and delighting in the human race.
