Sparks have been flying at the Lambeth Conference this week - over sexual behaviour.

The Conference was originally going to be asked to commit to "the reaffirmation of Lambeth 1:10 that upholds marriage as between a man and a woman and requires deeper work to uphold the dignity and witness of LGBTQ Anglicans."

After a lot of pressure from the liberal part of the Church this became "It is the mind of the Anglican Communion as a whole that "all baptised, believing and faithful persons, regardless of sexual orientation are full members of the Body of Christ" and to be welcomed, cared for, and treated with respect."

Many provinces within the Anglican Church strongly reject that homosexual relationships can be holy at all, let alone homosexual marriage, and the church is very deeply divided on the issue.

So the conference committed itself to further discussion to try to find a compromise.

Broadly speaking the disagreement is between those who say that the Bible is clear on sexual matters and we should do what it tells us, and those who would dispute that or say that the Bible's teaching needs to be re-interpreted for the times in which we live.

Even in this country there are very clear opposing sides on the subject, with neither likely to give ground.

SNIPPETS KING AENGUS' BAPTISM

You'll have heard of St Patrick. He was born in Ireland (or it might have been Wales) around 389 and died in 461. Patrick became a Christian missionary to Ireland and indeed, is its patron saint.

Sometime in the fifth century Patrick baptised the Irish King Aengus on Cashel Rock. They went through the long liturgy and finally just before the baptism itself Patrick prayed, eyes tightly closed.

Unfortunately, in the middle of his prayer, he lifted his bishop's staff quite high and brought it down hard, sending its spike straight through the King's foot. He finished his prayer, entered the water and beckoned the king.

Naked, King Aengus limped into the water, his foot bleeding badly, where Patrick baptized him. The incident was never mentioned again, and it seems that the King must have thought that it was all part of the ritual.

CHRISTIANITY IN THE NEWS

NICKY GUMBEL RETIRES



Nicky Gumbel, Vicar of the 4000 strong Holy Trinity Brompton Church and pioneer of the Alpha Course, has retired, along with his wife Pippa.

His final message was

entitled "The Best is Yet to Come" and in his case that means a ten year strategy in which he hopes to make the gospel accessible to everyone in the world.

He's in partnership with Bible translators who are working on getting the New Testament into every language in the world by 2033 (the 2000th anniversary of the Resurrection, the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church) and the big plan is to try to make the Alpha Course available to everyone on the planet by 2033. That is going to involve the new film series, on which they have already been working for the last couple of years.

He has other projects on the go too.

HOLY COMMOTION!



A priest in Italy, went viral earlier this week for offering Mass on an inflatable mattress in the sea, and has been placed under investigation by the Church

Father Mattia Bernasconi, from the diocese of Milan, decided to do Sunday's service in the sea after failing to find shade among the trees by the beach in Crotone, where he had originally planned to hold the service.

The 36-year-old priest said a family offered the use of the inflatable mattress, which transformed into the altar, while they celebrated the Sunday service in swimsuits. He had been working in a summer camp for high school students with an anti-mafia organisation.

Videos online also showed teenagers in swimsuits kneeling, squatting, or sitting in front of Father Bernasconi as they participated in the service.

The Church has emphasised the need to maintain "the minimum decorum and care for the symbols necessitated by the very nature of liturgical celebrations".

PRAYER WORKS

A church in Tooting, South London, which lost almost £140,000 through a Covid scam has been paid all the money back by its bank.

Criminals posed as bank



employees and managed to scam two members of the Parochial Church Council at All Saints Church out of £138,000.

After an investigation was carried out by the bank, it has now been given all the money back.

Rev Mae Christie from the church said

"Prayer works... I really am grateful that the bank have done the right thing... I am so grateful for the people in my church who have worked so hard for it... We didn't have any indication that this was going to happen and it is a huge weight off of our shoulders."

THIRD APPEAL LOST

The Court of Appeal has ruled that doctors can lawfully turn off the life support of 12-year-old Archie Battersbee. And on Thursday, in further blow, the Supreme Court refused to get involved.



The family - who were all baptised shortly after his accident - were attempting to overturn the verdict of two High Court cases. Previously, both judges had ruled that Archie was legally dead, and that life support should be removed.

The 12-year-old has been described as being "obsessed" with the idea of getting christened. He was baptised on Easter Sunday, whilst in an induced coma. His mother, brother and sister followed suit the following day.

Since then, they have been forthright in their beliefs, saying only God has the right to give or take life.

In a late twist the UN has taken out an injunction forcing the authorities to hold fire from switching off his life support until it has had time to look at the case.

CONFESSION

This is several things.

You can confess your sins to a priest, i.e tell him about them, own up to them. That normally happens in the Roman Catholic Church but can also happen in the Church of England. The priest may absolve you (assure you of God's forgiveness) but will almost certainly make suggestions about how you can get back on the right path.

You can confess your sins to one another, which sort of implies that you will pray for one another and help one another not to keep in going wrong. That's implied in James 5:16

You can confess your sins in Church too. It's part of the liturgy. We basically say sorry for sins of thought, word, deed and neglect. The basic idea is that it is linked with repentance, a change of mind (which then leads to a change of direction). Confession isn't really confession, and it definitely isn't repentance, unless you really do go back over the previous few days, recognise where you have fallen short, and promise God that you will turn away from what you have done wrong. The priest will then assure you of God's forgivenss.

Confession is also witnessing to your faith in Christ. At its most basic we do that every time we say a creed in church, but it needs to be much more than that. Jesus told us not to be ashamed of him, and all *true* Christians will try to find ways of confessing their faith to loved ones, friends and others.
