Welcome to Poppleton Parish News!







A word from Simon

You may remember in June's magazine that I wrote a little about the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

I hope that you had a wonderful time celebrating.

The events which took place in Poppleton – including the fabulous Festival of Flowers at All Saints' Upper

Poppleton – were just brilliant and really added to the occasion. I know that the whole community is very grateful to all of those who worked so hard to make the four days so special and memorable.

Either side of the Jubilee celebrations, which fell during the school half-term holiday, I visited some of our local primary schools to reflect with the children on the Platinum Jubilee.

The question I posed to them to get them thinking was – What is the most valuable thing which the world affords?

Asking children such questions is always interesting. Children are very deep thinkers but they are also very honest. If I (the Vicar) was to ask a group of adults that question, they might feel obliged to say certain things but not so with children!

Their answers fell into a number of different categories.

- 1. Material possessions / things which can be bought and sold, including gold, jewels, skyscrapers and iPhones.
- 2. People, including ourselves, family and friends.
- 3. Ideas / qualities / abstract nouns, including friendship, joy, equality and peace.
- 4. Faith-based things, including God and Jesus.

The reason that I asked this question was because of some of the words which were spoken to our Queen at her coronation in 1953.

Part of the liturgy for the day went like this:

When the Queen is again seated, the Archbishop shall go to her Chair; and the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, receiving the Bible from the Dean of Westminster, shall bring it to the Queen and present it to her, the Archbishop saying these words:

Our gracious Queen:

to keep your Majesty ever mindful of the law and the Gospel of God as the Rule for the whole life and government of Christian Princes, we present you with this Book, the most valuable thing which the world affords.

And the Moderator shall continue:

Here is Wisdom;

This is the royal Law;

These are the lively Oracles of God.

Then shall the Queen deliver back the Bible to the Moderator, who shall bring it to the Dean of Westminster, to be reverently placed again upon the Altar. This done, the Archbishop shall return to the Altar.

So, according to the Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, the Bible is the most valuable thing which the world affords. I suggested to the children that one of the reasons why this may have been said is because the Bible tells the Queen how she should be Queen. As I wrote in last month's magazine – and you are forgiven if you can't remember what I put – we read these words of Jesus from Matthew 20:

"...but whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, ²⁷ and whoever wishes to be first among you must be your slave; ²⁸ just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

The Bible – the most valuable thing which the world affords.

Over a period of 8 weeks, a good number of us met together in person and online to look at an overview of the whole Bible as we completed *The Bible Course*. Those who did the course really enjoyed it and learned a lot.

Across the 8 sessions, we looked at the Old Testament for 5 weeks and the New Testament for 3 weeks, taking in key events, stories and characters and reflecting on what the overarching message of the whole book is.

We were a very mixed bunch of people – some who were very new to reading the Bible, others who had read and heard many bits of the Bible over the years, others who had studied the Bible in depth for many years. I think it's fair to say that everyone found the course a really valuable thing to do.


We agreed that we would get together at some point after the course to celebrate what we had been doing and we would like to invite everyone to come along to this celebration which will take place on Tuesday 19th July at 7.30pm at Holy Redeemer on Boroughbridge Road (opposite the Texaco petrol station).

At the celebration, we will sing and pray and there will also be an opportunity for those who were part of the course to share their reflections.

Whoever you are, whether you were part of the course or not, whatever your knowledge / experience of the Bible is, I would encourage you to come along. I look forward to seeing you there as we celebrate the most valuable thing which the world affords.





SEA SUNDAY

Wendy Prendergast shares her reflections on the relevance of Sea Sunday


What relevance is **Sea Sunday** to those of us living many miles from the coast? Why, on or about the second

Sunday in July, does the flower arrangement at All Saints have things like shells, rocks, fishing nets as part of the arrangement?



Do we have paddy fields growing rice in Britain, or can we grow the many tasty spices used in the curry to go with our rice? Where was your car made and how did the oil (or biomass for electric vehicles) get here? Your fridge/freezer? We have heard much recently about the difficulty of getting wheat from Ukraine

to Britain because of access to Ukrainian ports. Each one of us, in some way, is dependent on imported goods.





This is why the 'Mission to Seafarers' is so important to them. They, with their chaplains, can be found readily in port and can support contact with families at home and be a place to relax briefly. Of course their work is more prominent in ports around the coast, but wherever we live, from Felixstowe, across Britain, through Birmingham to Liverpool, Southampton to Newcastle, we rely on seafarers working around the world through China, India, USA and everywhere else.

This is why the Mission to Seafarers draws our attention to their work on the second Sunday in July (this year the 10th). We need the seafarers and they need that brief, caring respite in port.

To quote from their website – 'More that 90% of the world's goods and fuels are transported around the world thanks to seafarers. Without them the world economy would grind to a halt. Day and night, 365 days a year, the Mission is on call providing help for seafarers in over 200 ports around the world.'

When you look at the flower arrangement don't just see the pretty shells and lovely colours. See also the grey, rocky roughness and the ugliness of a harsh working environment.



This month Beverly Hetmanski tells us about her favourite hymn, 'Shine Jesus Shine (Lord, the light of your love is shining)' written by Graham Kendrick in 1987.

I have always thoroughly enjoyed the uplifting words of this hymn by one of the best religious song writers, Graham Kendrick.

Everyone always sings along enthusiastically when it is part of the church service and it is one of a few songs where people know just when to join in with the clapping.

It has been part of our Christian and personal lives throughout the years. The first time I heard it was in our previous church, St John's in Egham, Surrey. We were very involved in church life and our 3 children were all baptised there.

I had a very close Christian friend Suzanne who unfortunately lost her battle with cancer. When we were sitting together planning her funeral, she wanted Shine as the last hymn as she hoped that everyone would go out feeling uplifted and positive and they did.

I remember Jeremy (our previous vicar in Poppleton) doing a sermon on how even a little light can never be extinguished by the darkness and then we sung the hymn afterwards.

Our daughter had the song at her wedding and more recently at the baptism of our wonderful little grandson.

Jesus said in John chapter 8:


'I am the Light of the World, he who follows me will not walk in Darkness'

NEWS FROM MANOR CHURCH OF ENGLAND ACADEMY

As the academic year draws to a close, we're delighted once again to hear from Simon Barber, Principal of Manor C of E Academy



It is good to be able to write to you again towards the end of the academic year, I hope this message finds everyone safe and well.

We have had a good year. Fortunately we have not had any closures for Covid this year, the GCSE exams are taking place as normal and many of the events, trips and sporting fixtures have resumed. That isn't to say we haven't continued to be affected by the after effects of the pandemic however. Student absence from school is 3% down on where we usually are, this is replicated nationally. There is a nervousness in some families, caused by the lockdowns and the big national focus on health and mental wellbeing, that has led to some families keeping children off school more than they used to. We are seeing much higher numbers of children who are anxious and worried, particularly about exams and going into unusual situations, and our pastoral team is supporting more children than ever before. The illness phase of the pandemic has passed, but the after effects of this period will be long lasting and an ongoing focus for all schools moving forwards.

It was great to see so many people at our 210 anniversary service at the Minster. Many thanks to the Poppleton parishioners who came along. The Archbishop spoke very well about the importance of the contribution that church schools have made to education nationally and of course Manor has played a significant part in that for such a long time. His final words were, "Thank God for Manor school", Amen to that!

Sadly this year will be my last at Manor, I am leaving to become Executive Director of Education at Minerva Learning Trust in Sheffield. I have enjoyed the last 6 years here immensely and have worked alongside some amazingly talented colleagues and supported some amazing students during that time. I have got to know many in the Poppleton Parish and have really enjoyed making these occasional contributions to your magazine. I will miss my friends here immensely when I move on.

Many thanks to all those who know and support our school, we are blessed to serve a wonderful community, and thanks again for the personal kindness and support I have received from so many.

READING INTO JOHN part 55 To Jerusalem (Lk 7:36ff) part 2

John records a year in which Jesus' Galilean mission enjoys growing success – a year of grace (YG Lk 4:19), but at the end of which most of his followers desert him (6:66). To explain why, John retraces this year as one of growing hostility – a Year of Judgement (YJ, Chs 5, 7-12). Luke had portrayed this as a single visit to Jerusalem (Lk 19:41f). John portrays it as a series of 3 visits spread over the Judean religious year (Dt 16:1ff) – the Feasts of *Passover* (11:55), *Weeks* (5:1) and *Tabernacles* (7:2). Later John's editor deleted the title *Weeks* when he reversed chapters 5 and 6. With each visit John associates a healing sign of Jesus (5:9, 9:7, 11:44) which illustrate the theme of the visit.

John's text had once read 6:1-72, 5:1-47, 7:19-24, 7:53-8:11, 7:1-18, 7:25-52, 8:12-30 (The passages underlined each filled a single side of a codex. Deleting the Woman taken in Adultery left the editor with 6 verses, which he inserted into the next passage). Passover marked the Israelites escape from Egyptian bondage (Ex12:1). After 50 days wandering in the wilderness they arrived at Mount Sinai (Ex 19:1) where, by the hand of Moses, they received their Torah (Mosaic Law). Thus a major theme of worship at the Feast of Weeks (7 weeks after Passover) was thanksgiving for the Torah. The Judeans, who call the Torah their spiritual bread, refer to this after Jesus has fed them miraculously (6:12f, 31f). And the core of the Torah is the Decalogue (Dt 5:6-21). The first 4 clauses concern Jews' relationship to God, the remaining 6 clauses their relationships to each other. Jesus sees this as encapsulated in a 2 part command – Love God, Love your neighbour (Lk 10:27). Strikingly the Decalogue does not actually mention the word love.

The Original Christian Gospel (OG) told of a woman it called a sinner. Whilst Jesus was dining with a Pharisee, she intruded and proceeded to anoint Jesus' feet with an expensive ointment. His host was shocked, but Jesus shielded her from criticism, seeing her as having undergone a change of heart. Luke paints a telling picture of this scene (Lk 7:36-30). Mark locates the incident in Bethany (Mk 14:3-9), on the eve the Passion. Jesus' body would lay unanointed in the tomb. So, to cover it, she anoints his head. Mary Magdalene (Mk 16:1) intending to do so, found the tomb empty. John draws upon these themes. The man's 38 year affliction (5:5) recalls Israel's wandering after receiving her Torah (Dt 2:14). The Judeans seek to kill him for flouting the Decalogue (5:18). He notes their lack of love (5:42) to the Scribes (8:3), experts on the Torah. The woman is defenceless, her guilt clear. They judge her worthy of death – his future fate (Mk 14:64). His stooping down and standing up again (8:6) anticipate his death and resurrection. Writing with his finger, he is inscribing the new law (Dt 9:10) revealed in the cross (15:13). They look to the past, he to the future. The Shepherd calls his sheep by name (10:3, 20:16). Some followers deserted him as he proclaimed his new law - befriending sinners (Lk 7:34), refusing to condemn Mary Magdalene (8:11).

'Ruskin, Turner and Us' by Jonathan Brockbank

Turner's early landscapes followed the classical model: detailed figures in the foreground, a generalised treatment of the countryside, and a subdued, misty and atmospheric sky. He gradually took this model further, taking liberties with the topography, changing scale and lighting for dramatic effect and reducing the importance of figures and foreground details until they gave way to the drama of weather and the sky.

Ruskin's search for 'truth to nature' did not sit well with the work of the man who would be seen as a forerunner if Impressionism. He was drawn to the photographic realism of the pre-Raphaelites. In his eyes their works embodied both the truth to nature and the moral story-telling that art should deliver.

It became apparent as the talk progressed that the relationship between these two, half a century apart and following different paths, is worth studying as much for us today as it was for the Victorians.


AGM
