FROM THE VICAR HOPE AND A FUTURE

Forty two years ago today it was when I boarded a train in my home town of Southport, on the Lancashire coast, and headed off on a journey across the country to start university at Hull. University had never been on my agenda, but my very close friend Vic had gone off to uni; I had visited and after that simply had to try. At 25 I was a mature student, but that didn't matter. I was the first person in my family to do a degree. My parents hadn't, and neither had my grandparents, or my uncles and aunts, or my cousins.

After the initial excitement and fear, it settled into being a pretty ordinary time. I joined the karate club and eventually got my 1st kyu—the last belt before a black belt, and I played squash three or four times a week. I didn't do a lot of drinking because I had no desire to and little money. I did join the Christian Union and a local Methodist church and preached in the Methodist circuit. And I studied - not too hard!

When I graduated after three years my widowed mum came to watch the ceremony, and as far as I was concerned it was all for her. I had been a horrid child and teenager, completely beyond her control, expelled from two schools, and I wanted her somehow to see that her efforts and tears on behalf of her wayward son hadn't been wasted. It was a great day and I was so proud. I went back to do a teaching qualification.

I have been a committed Christian from the age of twenty, and one of the Bible verses which struck me from very early on was from Jeremiah 29:11

For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

The promise there is to a nation, but in my own experience it's true for an individual too, that faith brings hope for the future, and I have been pretty constantly aware of God's loving, guiding hand for nearly the whole of my adult life. He has taken me into study, marriage, parenthood, ministry, missionary work, school chaplaincy and parish ministry and has blessed me richly despite my own weaknesses and

failures My eternity is in his hands. My truly blessed life is not because I am good, but because God is, in creation and in Christ. In the words of the hymn:

The King of love my Shepherd is, whose goodness faileth never.

I nothing lack if I am his and he is mine for ever.

Looking back now on 47 years as a committed Christian and 42 years since I went to university, I see the abundant sense in those familiar words from Proverbs 3 in the Old Testament

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

Be not wise in your own eyes; fear the Lord, and turn away from evil. It will be healing to your flesh and refreshment to your bones.

MILLIONS MORE IN POVERTY



The head of the national debt help charity
Christians Against
Poverty (CAP) has strongly criticised the government's economic policy, saying it will push

millions more people into poverty.

CAP commissioned YouGov to carry out a poll of across the UK in August and following that CAP's CEO Paula Stringer said: "We found that costs have risen and one in three low-income households are really struggling. That's compared to one in ten of those who are on higher incomes.

"Almost half the population are currently struggling financially in some way or another. Twenty percent of adults are in financial trouble overall, and then about 35 percent are just about coping and are at risk as costs go up this winter.

BROTHER ANDREW R.I.P



The man known to Christians around the world as 'Brother Andrew' has died at the age of 94.

Brother Andrew was Dutch, born in 1928.

He founded the ministry of Open Doors in 1955 setting off for his God-inspired mission to smuggle millions of Bibles into countries where Christians were persecuted. Travelling in his Volkswagen Beetle car stuffed with illicit Bibles, he ventured into Soviet Bloc Communist countries including East Germany, Poland, Yugoslavia, Czechoslovakia.

After an account of his adventures was published in 1967, he became known as God's Smuggler and inspired Christian missionaries across the world. The book was translated into 35 languages and sold more than 10 million copies.

When East/West relations thawed, Brother Andrew turned his attention to the leaders of the

The pastors at the Southwest Baptist church in Fort Myers were determined to hold a service of prayer for the damaged city.

Despite the wreckage that continues to lie around them, including overturned cars, a toppled steeple and soaked bibles, seniors gathered on the porch of the church.

During the Sunday service, those gathered were encouraged to lean on their faith.

"It's a thanksgiving that we're here," Jane Compton, 77, told the news outlet. "We're so fortunate."

underground church in China. In one expedition in 1981, missionaries from Open Doors floated a barge into China under the cover of darkness. They were able to deliver a million Bibles to a silent group of waiting Chinese Christians, who spirited them into the country.

Brother Andrew also turned his attention to the Middle East and North Africa and was one of the few Western public figures to regularly meet with Islamic leaders as an ambassador for Christ. After Osama bin Laden was killed by US forces in 2011, he expressed sadness:

"I believe everyone is reachable. People are never the enemy—only the devil. Bin Laden was on my prayer list. I wanted to meet him. I wanted to tell him who is the real boss in the world."

When asked a few years ago whether he had any regrets, his response was,

"Yes, I should like to have been a lot more radical!"
