

As we mark the passing of this second Elizabethan age, the Queen's example of dedication and loving Christian service gives us all cause to reflect on how best we should use our God-given time and talents. We pray that our new King may reign as wisely as his mother, and that the Queen's lasting legacy may be a people ever more committed to lives of peace, justice for all, and service to others.

## Grant application successful!

The Parish Council has recently been informed that our application for funding for improvements at Barton common and ponds has been successful. Many thanks: to the North Norfolk Sustainable Communities Fund for agreeing to provide the funding, to County Councillor Richard Price for agreeing to be the independent referee for our bid and to Norfolk Wildlife Trust for their support and expertise.

The improvements will consist of:

- digging out the ponds to remove excess reeds and leaf litter
- tree works to allow more light to reach the ponds
- construction of a pond dipping platform at one of the ponds
- construction of two rustic benches in the vicinity of the ponds
- enabling easier access around the ponds
- repainting/repairing the telephone box
- erection of panels containing information about the history of Barton Turf and the common/ponds (researched by NIBCHG) in the phone box.

We expect the digging out and tree works to be carried out this winter and the other improvements from spring 2023. The area will not look very pretty for a while after the digging out but will start to recover quickly in the spring.

### **Barton Turf Staithe**

As many of you will be aware we have taken back control of the old Broads Authority staithe mooring at Barton Turf. Whilst we have a waiting list, we can now offer additional mooring for small boats from Irstead and Neatishead. We have now extended the parish moorings by approximately 12 more spaces.

We will be keeping the front section, with the tap, open for those boaters that require water or pick up facilities giving an emergency access point for the relevant agencies. If you would like more information, please contact Martin Mills on 07501 622068.

# NIB Wildlife Friendly Villages

## Update on verge cutting in Neatishead

Neatishead verges were cut in mid-May this year which meant that many wild plants, including bluebells, did not get a chance to flower. Several residents expressed their disappointment about this at a subsequent parish council meeting. The parish council clerk, Laura, was asked to contact Norfolk County Council to find out why the verges had been cut so early. Below is a summary of what Laura found out:

Tarmac is contracted by Norfolk County Council to cut the rural highway verges. The first rural grass cut was scheduled to commence on 16/05/22 and Neatishead was programmed for week one.

A consultation took place last year relating to the NCC grass cutting policy and the following changes, which came into force this year, were agreed:

- A and B roadside verges will continue to be cut twice a year (first cut starting mid-May, second cut starting mid-August).
- C and U roadside verges will reduce from two cuts to one, with cutting scheduled to commence mid-May in conjunction with the A and B roadside verge cutting. For highway safety purposes, it may be necessary to cut visibility splays on C & U class roads.
- The NCC Service Standard for preventative rural grass cutting is a continuous 'single swathe' of one metre. This decision has been made in line with the charity PlantLife's guidance. Full verge cutting is not practical or cost efficient. In terms of C & U cuts, these will need to be undertaken in May for operational reasons. The possibility of undertaking this cut in August/September is not possible due to availability of contracted resources. NCC believe that they have achieved an equitable balance between maintaining the verges from a biodiversity perspective and from a road safety perspective, and that the changes introduced will enhance plant life on roadside verges.

It is not clear from the reply Laura received whether Neatishead will be scheduled for week one next year too. I have asked her to put this question to her contact in the Highways department.

### Bat walk at Barton Turf

At our recent bat walk five species of bat were detected in and around the village. These were

Common Pipistrelle, Soprano Pipistrelle, Brown Long Eared Bat, Noctule Bat and Daubenton's Bat. Many thanks to Lindsey of Norfolk and Norwich Bat Group, who led the walk and to everyone who took part.





#### Wildlife Notes

The final chapter of this year's Trimmingham Bee-

eaters saga took place at the end of August when the adult birds left the quarry in which they had raised their brood together with at least 4 fully fledged young. They will have flown south heading towards Africa where they will spend their winter. Sadly, it is unlikely that they will return to the same location next year but at least 15,000 visitors had the pleasure of seeing them in 2022.

The bird sighting which has pleased me most during September was on the 5<sup>th</sup> when I saw 3 Black Terns on Barton Broad. I have written before about the striking adult birds which pass through on migration in spring but these were young birds doing the reverse journey heading back to Africa. They are marsh terns so they feed on insects which they pick off the surface of the water rather than plunging into the water after small fish like the Common Terns do. The autumn birds are much less obvious as they lack the black chest and wing patterns of the spring birds but can be picked out due to their smaller size and the way they fly, constantly twisting and turning over the water's surface.

I have also enjoyed watching Hobby chasing dragonflies at both Alderfen and Barton boardwalk during September.

Coot are completely absent from Barton Broad at the moment but seem to have done well at Alderfen with at least 40 there on my recent visits. October is a month where we can look forward to the arrival of winter wildfowl with Wigeon arriving on Alderfen together with increasing numbers of Teal and Shoveler. The first Goldeneye usually turns up on Barton Broad in the last week of October as they escape colder weather further north. The winter Thrushes, Redwings and Fieldfares will be flying in from Scandinavia accompanied by numbers of Blackbirds and Song Thrushes. Falls of Goldcrests and Woodcock can occur along the coast whilst garden feeders may

host their first Brambling and Siskins. Of course, there are still a few late butterflies to look out for, usually Red Admirals,

well as Common Darter and Migrant Hawker

dragonflies. Ivy bees, a coloniser of this country since 2001, maybe found feeding on Ivy flowers together with other late insects. They are easily identifiable with thick ginger hairs on the thorax and black/lemon stripes on the abdomen.

# September rains finally begin to ease drought

August's monthly total rainfall was 24.8mm/0.98" which is only 38% of average and meant a continuation of the drought. Most of this fell on one day (25<sup>th</sup>) when the area was affected by remnants of severe storms further west.

Overall, temperatures were well above average throughout with the highest recorded on 24<sup>th</sup> at 31.3°C.

Although September started dry, we soon started to record daily rainfall after a large low pressure anchored itself to the south-west and then moved slowly east into the North Sea.

The total rainfall up to and including the 19<sup>th</sup> is 50.4mm/1.98" which is a healthy 84% of average and so slowly starting to make up the deficit of recent months. The highest daily total to date is 11.6mm/0.46" on the 16<sup>th</sup>.

Temperatures have been well above average for the first two weeks of the month but have significantly dropped in the third week due to an incursion of arctic air. The highest daytime temperature to date is 28.5°C on the 5<sup>th</sup> and lowest overnight temperature is 5°C on 18<sup>th</sup>/19<sup>th</sup>.


