From Your Parish Priest:

Most of you will know by now that Angela and I have decided that it is time for us to retire, and we will be moving to Shropshire to be rather closer to many of our family. Our final service will be in the New Year on Epiphany Sunday.

Just after we arrived in the benefice, in the summer of 2016, I wrote in my first contribution to these pages:

"As well as day-to-day activities, we've had two village fetes, and we've had the annual service at St Benet's Abbey, with Bishop Graham, excellently organised by the Brothers of St Benet's, and so well supported by the wherries and their crews. Revd Rob Hume's retirement service was an opportunity to celebrate his ministry in the benefice. . . . We were also privileged to be at the Cathedral to see two of our churches acknowledged in the diocese's Most Welcoming Church competition. And all of that in just the first fortnight! . . . I have been assured that we will get back to 'normal' – whatever that is – after all these celebrations, and that there will be some 'ordinary' Sundays. On the other hand, celebration is what the church should be about. . . .Whenever we come together in worship, it should include a celebration of, and thanksgiving for, all that we receive from God's wonderful and bountiful creation. Perhaps on reflection, we simply need to find ways of making 'celebration' the new 'normal'?"

We have indeed been privileged to celebrate so many different occasions across our churches and communities. Even during COVID lockdowns, we found ways of using our collective talents to continue celebrating, with perhaps a little help from modern technology, because the celebration of God's love for us all must ever be at the heart of our faith and of our worship, whatever the challenges. As the hymn writer says:

"Through all the changing scenes of life, in trouble and in joy, the praises of my God shall still my heart and tongue employ."

Even the more subdued traditional events in November - our period of remembering those who have gone before us — are still celebrations and thanksgivings for those who have given us life and hope, and those who have given their own lives in the service of others. And as the church's year draws to its close, we shall once again celebrate the feast of Christ the King, the one whose death and resurrection gives us the hope and joy which is at the centre

of all our celebrations, as we then prepare embark again on our journey from Advent to Pentecost celebrating always the life of our Saviour.

Condolences for HM The Queen – The Parish Council would like to thank Alex and Fiona at the Staithe 'N' Willow for their help and support in holding the condolence book so that parishioners and visitors can record and share their thoughts about HM The Queen. Thank you also to Parish Councillor Betty Woodcock who managed the condolence book on the Council's behalf.

Speeding – Parishioners regularly speak to Parish Councillors regarding their fears and concerns about people driving too quickly in the village. Please please try to watch your speed and be careful to adhere to the speed limits.

Bird 'Flu – Avian influenza (bird flu) mainly affects birds. It can also affect humans and other mammals. It is a notifiable animal disease. If you suspect any type of avian 'flu in poultry or captive birds you must report it immediately by calling the Defra Rural Services Helpline on 03000200301 You should also call Defra if you find one or more dead bird of prey or owl, 3 or more dead gulls or wild waterfowl, 5 or more dead birds of any species

Do not touch or pick up any dead or visibly sick birds that you find

All bird keepers (whether you have pet birds, commercial flocks or just a few birds in a backyard flock) must keep a close watch on them for signs of disease and maintain good biosecurity at all times. If you have any concerns about the health of your birds, seek prompt advice from your vet.

You should register your poultry even if only kept as pets, so we can contact you during an outbreak. This is a legal requirement if you have 50 or more birds. Poultry includes chickens, ducks, turkeys, geese, pigeon (bred for meat), partridge, quail, guinea fowl and pheasants.

These crows will be used to decorate a scarecrow, dressed in Horning Primary School uniform, which is being made by the school to enter into the Wroxham Barns Scarecrow competition.

Deputy Executive Head Teacher David Hopkins was pleased with the support for the event, saying:

"Many children in school had at least one adult join them at the Story Café, and it was good to see children and parents working collaboratively making the crows.

"A wide variety of delicious cakes were donated by parents and staff, and the event raised £52 for Macmillan Cancer Support. It was great that the school could be a part of the 'world's biggest coffee morning', and the Story Café created a lovely atmosphere."

Transport to Medical Appointments.



Our Majestic Swans



What is ailing them?

It's hard to know what to do when you find a dead bird the size of a swan. We all have an allotted span and not all dead birds fell to bird flu, but we can all play our part by being careful. The disease is spread from bird to bird by direct contact with body fluids and faeces. It can also be spread by the feet of dogs, vermin, dirty vehicles and on clothing and footwear. We are advised not to touch dead or visibly sick birds.

Avian influenza (AI), or bird flu as we know it, is primarily a disease of birds and all birds can get bird flu. Some are more susceptible than others. Waterfowl do get poorly and many die. Being large and white, the swans are of course the most visible, so we notice them. Respiratory distress, general lethargy, loss of co-ordination, tremors and twisting of the head and neck have been seen in affected swans on the Bure.

With a very significant proportion of our UK poultry production here in East Anglia, the authorities are stretched to breaking point. Vets, like dentists and hospital beds are in very short supply. Every day new outbreaks are being reported on commercial units, both of housed birds and those that were formerly fee-range. There have been many small home flocks affected too. Since 12th October, we've had a local 'flockdown' in Norfolk, Suffolk and parts of Essex. The measures apply to poultry and captive birds, regardless of flock type or size. Landowners are responsible to safely arrange disposal of carcasses and for any costs associated with removal and disposal of dead wild birds. If bodies are on public land, it is the local authority's responsibility to arrange disposal if need be.

Bird flu is in no way connected to the COVID-19 pandemic, which is caused by the SARS-CoV-2 virus and is not carried in poultry or captive birds. The Food Standards Agency has said that on the basis of the current scientific evidence, Al poses a very low food safety risk for UK consumers. Properly cooked poultry and poultry products, including eggs, are safe to eat.

Bird flu is still classed as an exotic disease, but we wonder how long it will be before it is considered endemic. Vaccination against it has not been allowed in the UK except in special circumstances, and the current vaccines are not particularly effective. Work is ongoing worldwide and hopes of industry and individuals are that a vaccine will become available.

Bird flu is a notifiable disease, this means if you suspect any type of Al in poultry or captive birds you must report it immediately by calling Defra Rural Services Helpline on 03000 200 301. Failure to do so is an offence. Keepers of any poultry species, be they chickens, ducks, turkeys, geese, pigeon (bred for meat), partridge, quail, guinea fowl or pheasants <u>must</u> register if 50 or more birds are kept. Even if they are just pets, this is also a legal requirement.

Historically, exhibitions for domestic poultry have been popular, but for the last year, and still in place, is a gatherings ban for these birds. There is a real risk that some of our heritage breeds may be lost as showing cannot take place. Some of these breeds are rarer than Siberian tigers.

If you have a particular interest in waterfowl, the British Waterfowl Association (BWA) is a charity dedicated to education, conservation, and raising the standards of keeping and breeding ducks, geese and swans in a maintained environment. If you have been, or fear you might be affected, the BWA has a considerable support network.
